Prince Turns 18: To Get British Keys LONDON (UPI) -Prince

Charles, oldest son of Queen Elizabeth II and the Duke of Edinburgh, is 18 today and in effect receives the keys of the British kingdom. From today on he could

arsume the throne and rule without his father acting as regent in the event of the death or abdication of his mother. Throughout the country flags

were flown on public buildings but Charles spent his birthday quietly at Gordonstoune School in Scotland in what officials said would be a normal day. Nor was there any sign the Queen had chosen his birthday to officially proclaim him

Prince of Wales. There were to delay the honor until 1968. But in his new constituional status Prince Charles becomes. among other things, a counselor of state with powers to act along with other counselors during the absence of the queen. Other members of the royal family have to wait until they are 21 to qualify.

And financially, the prince's 18th birthday marks an important milestone. His annual income doubles from about \$42,000 to about \$84,000 with the money coming from revenues of the Duchy of Cornwall.

In his talks with Kremlin chiefs he will ask the Russians to agree to reconvening the Geneva Conference, or failing that, at last to get cease fire moves under way. He hopes the Russians may be able to tell him whether Hanoi is

now prepared with an active response to a new American pause in the bombing of North Viet Nam.


