Dirksen explained the situation in response to a newsman's question about prospects in the 90th Congress for open housing legislation or repeal of Taft-Hartley's Section 14B. Section 14B permits individual states to outlaw compulsory unionism -the close shop-if the state's citizens want it that way.

This grant of mere permissive authority to citizens of each state outraged the leaders of organized labor. They have demanded of the politicians, whose careers they largely subsidize, that Section 14B be repealed.

President Johnson was a faint-hearted champion of repeal before this month's election. The pulse of his determination to oust Section 14B may now-be weaker although he is, in fact in labor's debt. LBJ also is committed to try again (next year) for repeal. He can't win on that. Any repealer would be beaten in the new House.

Dirksen was compelled to support a filibuster in the 89th Congress to kill a repealer which the House had approved Channel 16 by a margin of half a dozen or so votes. In this new session, Dirksen can attend to other problems.

So it is also with open housing which squeaked through the House in the 89th Congress. Open housing will not speak or otherwise get through the house. A Dirksen-aided filibaster was required to kill open housing in the Senate.
