Highlights

AUSTIN - Far-flung operations of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department have been placed under new administrative leadership.

Commissioners have named J. R. (Bob) Singleton as executive director. He replaces J. Weldo Watson who resigned last June. Singleton had been serving as director of Region IV with headquarters in La Porte.

He picked Robert G. Mauermann, Region V director at Rockport, as his chief deputy. In his first press conference. Singleton said he is considering recommending a change in the Commission's controversial policy on shell dredging.

He did not disclose exactly what he has in mind but said any such proposal would be "in the field of broad policy." His own close observation of dredging operations, he added, have convinced him that the Commission's 1963 and 1964 orders permitting shell dredging up to 300 feet of live reefs under result in "extremely insignificant" oyster kill.

This issue has been heatedly debated between dredgers on one hand and fishermen and conservationists on the other since the old 1;500-foot - minimum-distance - from - reef policy was abolished.

A statewide tour of department facilities, particularly the parks - is planned by Singleton in order to familiarize himself first-hand with problems and

Singleton declined to express his views on "closed door" meetings of the three-member P-W Commission. However, he did say "The commission sets policy. . . . My duty is to implement and carry out that

AG RULES - Not only may a county cut its tax rate when the reason for the tax disappears, but, according to Attorney General Waggoner Carr, it must. He pointed to the law which prohibits the use of tax funds for any purpose other than for which it was levied.

Carr also held that, while a city may prohibit the sale of alcoholic beverages at any time, it may not prescribe a lesser penalty for such an offense than is provided by state law.

A district court has exclusive furisdiction over all suits on behalf of the state and county for the collection of penalties on delinquent personal property taxes, although the county court may have the power to share jurisdiction in a suit against property for the actual taxes, Carr ruled.

The Salvaties Army spensors CHE WILLIAM grame for young people. Red Shield Youth Clubs or community crenters provide supervised recreation and athletic programs which keep youngsters ecomied and off the streets.

Camp Bublitzelle, incated between Wanshactie and Midlothint, is a summer paradise for deserving youngsters. Located on 380 acres of rolling. wreded countryside, the camp features a paddock swimming pool, a lake for boating, water skiling and fishing, riding horses, a gymnasium, playground equipment, and other attractions to delight young people of

Nearly 2,400 youngsters from cities throughout the state, arfive at the camp each summer to learn fair play and good sportsmanship through activities designed to aid in their physical and spiritual development.

In the area of welfare, children and young adults are helped through a statewide program. This may include eye examinations and glasses; shoes and clothing for school-age children: dental care; hospitalization for unwed mothers-to - be: toys at Christmas time, and lunches for school children.

Hundreds of needy youngsters have been given shoes by the Salvation Army in Texas cities and towns this year. School absenteeism dropped sharply in this group. In another town, free lunches are provided for several hundred school children by the local Salvation Army Service Unit Committee.







Q. What is the name of this cut of meat? A. Veal sirloin roast.

Q. Where does it come from? How is it identified? A. It comes from the loin-leg

section of the calf, which corresponds to the sirloin section of beef. This cut weighs from four to six pounds and contains portions of the hip and backbone. The lean is light pink in color and there is no marbling. Texture of the lean is very fine and fairly firm, almost velvety in appearance. The bones are porous and soft, some with a reddish tinge.

Q. How is it prepared? A. By roasting. Veal has very little tat, and it should be covered with bacon strips if the fat covering is at a minimum. To roast, place on a rack, with fat or bacon-covered side on top, in a shallow, open roasting pan. Do not add water. Do not cover. Roast in a slow oven (325 degrees F.) until roast meat thermometer registers 170 degrees F. Allow 30 to 35 minutes per pound for cooking time.



Medicare Questions And Answers

Q. How much of my medical bills will the supplementary medical insurance plan cover? A You pay the first \$50 of your total bills for the year for doctors' visits, surgeons' fees,

and other services covered in the supplemental plan. After that, the plan pays 80 percent and you pay the reamining 20

Q. What types of doctors' bills are covered?

A. Bilis for home and office visits and visits paid to you in a hospital or other instituton, also surgeons' and consultation fees are covered.

A. My doctor says that I will have to pay his bill first, before I collect from medicare. It this true?

A Medicare provides two methods for the payment of doctor bills. It is up to the doctor and the patient to agree as to which method of payment will be used. Under one method, the doctor can bill you and have you send in the claim with his receipted bill; or he can agree to send in the claim, get reimbursed for the part covered by medicare, and bill you for the remainder. Under either methmod, medicare will pay 80 percent of the reasonable charges -to the patient, if the patient has sent in the claim and the receipted itemized doctor billto the doctor, if the doctor has sent in the claim. The only difference in the two methods is that if the doctor sends in the full charge to the patient will claim, he must agree that his full charge to the patient will not be higher than what is determined to be the reasonable charge for the services. He will then collect from that patient the remaining 20 percent of the reasonable charge and any amount of the \$50 deductible still owing him.

Q. Who decides what are reasonable charges for physicians' services under medicare?

A Intermediaries - Blue Shield organizations and private insurance carriers serve under contracts with the Federal Government to receive and pay medicare bills, determine what are "reasonable charges." They apply two criteria set out in the law:

1. The customary charges for similar services generally made by the physician, and 2. The prevailing charges in the locality for similar servic-

The reasonable charge by a specialist will naturally be higher than the charge for the same service by a doctor who is not a specialist Also, the reasonable charge may be higher than the customary and prevailing rate if there are special circumstances.

Q. How often do I have to pay the \$50 deductible under the doctor bill insurance part of

medicare? A Just once a calendar year. But if your medical exepnses are less than \$50 in some year. or if they do not go over \$50 until the last three months of a year, the expenses in those last three months can count toward the next year's \$50 deductible.

Foreign News Commentary

By STANLEY R. PARKER United Press International STUT GAR,T Germany (UPI) - The specter of an army which refuses to fight unless its wage or other demands are met is cuasing uneasy stirrings in West

German military circles. The problem, albeit a theoretical one, has risen with the news that the Public Services, Transport and Traffic Union (OTV) has received government permission to recruit members among West Germany's professional soldiers, sailors and airmen.

The highest Bundeswehr (armed forces) officer, Gen. Heinrich Trettner, was so incensed at the Defense Ministry's move in allowing the union to campaign among the military that he gave it as a reason for resigning. Members of the Bundeswehr

are forbidden to strike. But just supposing, say the worriers, that a leader of he union arose who was nervy enough to defy the government and call for a strike overcertain grievances.

The most significant development in college football over the past decade or so is the remarkable improvement in the passing game. It seems to me that it must be about 90 per cent more effective than it was 10 years

On offense, the name of the game hasn't changed. Ball control is still the key to victory. But the technique of accomplishing it has changed dramatically.

Ten years ago, the secret to ball control was the abilityto gain three to four yards on a running play - on any down, in any situation, anywhere on the field. That was

Today, if you can't complete a good percentage of pass plays on any down, in any situation, anywhere on the field, you can't expect to win against a good team. In my judgment, it's just about that simple. You have to be able to complete passes to win. Gone is the day when an incomplete pass frightened and loosened the defense.

This development of passing, of course, has had an equally significant effect on defensive play. Tremendous pressure now is placed on the defensive backs.

If they can't cover well, particularly the "detached" men - the flanked backs and split ends - you can't beat the good teams. That's because the effective teams today can - and will - pass.

Again, this wasn't true 10 years ago. The defensive backs didn't have to be as quick and perceptive as today, and didn't have to be in such ner-perfect position on every play. The passing wasn't that precise.

If the receiver was open, the odds were one to five that the passer wouldn't hit him. If the passer did hit him, the receiver would drop one out of eight.

It's foolish to even hope for that kind of gift on defense today. Unless the defensive backs really do a superior job, the receivers are open. And, unless the defensive line puts great pressure on the passer, he will hit the receiver almost every time.

It is not too difficult to understand why passing has progressed so tremendously. Throwing and catching the ball, along with kicking, are the only truly enjoyable, fun phases of football practice. The passers and receivers honestly do enjoy their practice. Therefore they improve

Additionally, they can practice the year 'round without coaches present. Passers can improve their accuracy and receivers can improve their ability to run their patterns and catch the ball. Together, they can perfect their timing. It may look like a game of catch, but it is more than half the offense of a great college team today.

I am not suggesting that the running game has lost importance. Good teams always have had strong running games and always will have, but today the fine teams must be capable of handling both forms of attack.

In the nationally televised NCAA game of the week last Saturday, Southern California used well-blended running and passing to control the ball 39 of the 60 minutes and win; Texas stayed in the game all the way because. its defense prevented a Southern California breakaway "home-run" touchdown.

But the Longhorn defense couldn't consistently putpressure on the passer and the defensive backs couldn't quite cover the Trojans' flanked backs and split ends. The Southern California receivers were open most of the time, and when they were, quarterback Troy Winslow

I can remember well my early years of football when. on third down and two yards to go. a call for a pass would have been termed lunacy. Today, I'm not surprised when it's called in that situation on the ten-yard line - either

There always will be a degree of uncertainty and danger surrounding a forward pass but these obviously are days when the risk has been reduced by the technical ability of the throwers and receivers. As a result the game is more fun to play and more interesting to see.






