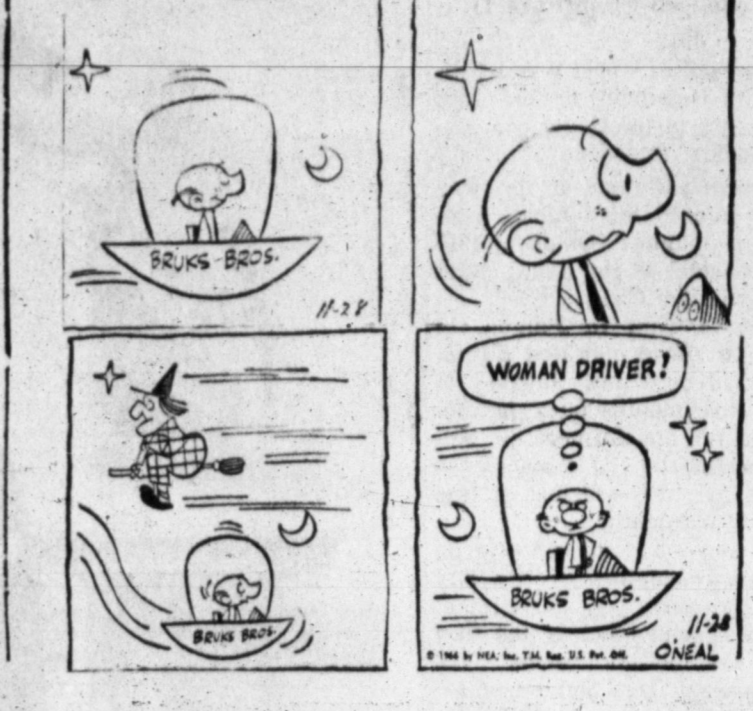

CHICO 'Champ' RAMERIZ Ramirez Tops News Staff Selections

Chico Ramirez copped his second consecutive News staff pick "championship" yesterday with a come-from-behind triumph as he picked 21 of the 25 game slate correctly for a 209-70 season total. Ramirez' predictions were only marred by four upsets: those of Georgia, Oklahoma, Memphis State and Baltimore.

News Business Manager Bill Power, who went into the last round of picks leading Ramirez by one game, had a bad week and fell all the way to third place, with a 15-10 total and a season record of 195-75.

Mike Gerald, City Editor, took second place honors with a 18-7 week and a 196-75 season.

The rest of the staff ranked as follows: Gary Meyers, 183-81, fourth; Ron Cross (Sports Editor?), 178-94, fifth; Mike Veiasquez, 173-91, sixth; Kay Smith, 172-92, seventh; Tex DeWeese, 173-97, eighth, and ending up in the "Staff Czar" was photographer Ken Leach, 163-107.

Miss Tommie Nichols, who didn't join the rest of the guessers until several weeks after the season started, recorded a 106-49 total, the percentage of which would place her somewhere about the middle of the staff pickers. Miss Nichols paced the staff last week and tied for second this week. Watch out next year!

Bucks to Play Sonora Saturday

The Bucks, now 11-0 started practice today on pass defense, something that threw them Friday in their first round clash with Spur.

Sonora is 11-0 and last week toppled Seagraves from the unbeaten list, 38-6 showing a balanced running and passing attack.

UCLA Gets Cage Nod from UPI

NEW YORK (UPI) — UCLA, which dropped down and clear out of the United Press International Board of Coaches ratings last season, will rise to the top of the college basketball world once again on the shoulders of 7-foot-1 sophomore Lew Alcindor.

That's the pre-season consensus of the 35-man UPI board, which rates the young Bruins almost a cinch to win the national title they last held in 1964.

Boostered by perhaps the strongest group of sophomores ever to land on a varsity team and fortified by the return of its two leading scorers, UCLA received 30 first-place votes and 339 points for a huge lead over runner-up Texas Western, defending NCAA titlist.

Texas Western, which amassed 268 points, was awarded three first-place nominations while the other No. 1 nods went to Duke and Louisville.

Four Newcomers — In addition to Alcindor, the Brubabes, as the UCLA freshman are called, graduated two other starters to the varsity—6-2 guard Lucius Allen and 6-4 sharpshooter Lynn Shackles Jr. Another starry soph, 6-3 Kenny Heitz, joins the Bruins, who labored through an 18-8 season a year ago while the Brubabes were 21-0.

Kentucky, the defending national champion, was rated third with 250 points despite the return of its two all-Americans, Lou Dampier and Pat Riley. Duke, also a veteran outfit, was fourth in the balloting with 220 points.

There was a sharp drop to fifth where Michigan State, the early line Big Ten favorite, received only 97 points. The

Green Bay Looking for No. 5

New York Giants Lose To Washington 72-41

By United Press International Allie Sherman has talked about "establishing" his New York Giants all year and they finally did it Sunday at Washington. The Giants established themselves as one of the worst defensive units in National Football League history as Washington crushed the New Yorkers 72-41 to set three

league records and tie three others. In other NFL action, Chicago downed Atlanta 23-6 Green Bay beat Minnesota 28-16, Los Angeles upset Baltimore 23-7 and St. Louis edged Pittsburgh 6-3.

Defensive back Brig Owens ran for two scores and set up two others with interceptions as the Redskins established records for most points by a team in regular-season play. The Sins' 72-point barrage eclipsed the old mark of 70 set by Los Angeles against the Baltimore Colts in 1950.

Defense Scores Three A. D. Whitfield scored three touchdowns and Sonny Jurgensen threw three touchdown passes while the Washington defense accounted for three of the Redskins' 10 touchdowns, which tied the league record for most touchdowns in a game.

New York's 41 points helped establish a new league mark for most points by two teams in one game—113—breaking the old standard of 98 set by the Chicago Cardinals against the Giants in 1948, and the Giant's six touchdowns helped break the mark for most touchdowns in a game by both teams—16—also breaking the record set in 1948 by the Cardinals and Giants.

Charley Gogolak's nine extra points also tied a league record, while both team's PATS (14) tied the Cardinal-Giants mark of 1948.

Green Bay all but clinched its fifth Western Division title in seven years as Bart Starr threw for two touchdowns and Elijah Pitts and Jim Grabowski ran for two others to lead the Packers over Minnesota. Bruce Gossett booted three field goals while John Unitas and Gary Cuozzo as the Rams stunned Baltimore title hopes and dropped the Colts two full games behind the division.

St. Louis moved back into a first-place Eastern Division tie with Dallas as Jim Bakken's 15 and 76-yard field goals led the Cardinals over Pittsburgh. Roger Leclerc kicked three field goals and Gale Sayers romped for 172 yards in 19 carries as Chicago racked up its first victory in the last five games with a triumph over Atlanta.

Culprit Captures Cajun Classic

LAFAYETTE, La. (UPI) —Jacky Cupit, a former PGA rookie of the year who had not won a tournament since the 1964 Tucson Open, went home to Longview, Tex., today with \$4,850 in top prize money from the Cajun Classic Golf Tournament.

Cupit, one of seven golfing brothers, downed Juan "Chi Chi" Rodriguez on the second hole of a sudden death playoff Sunday to win the title.

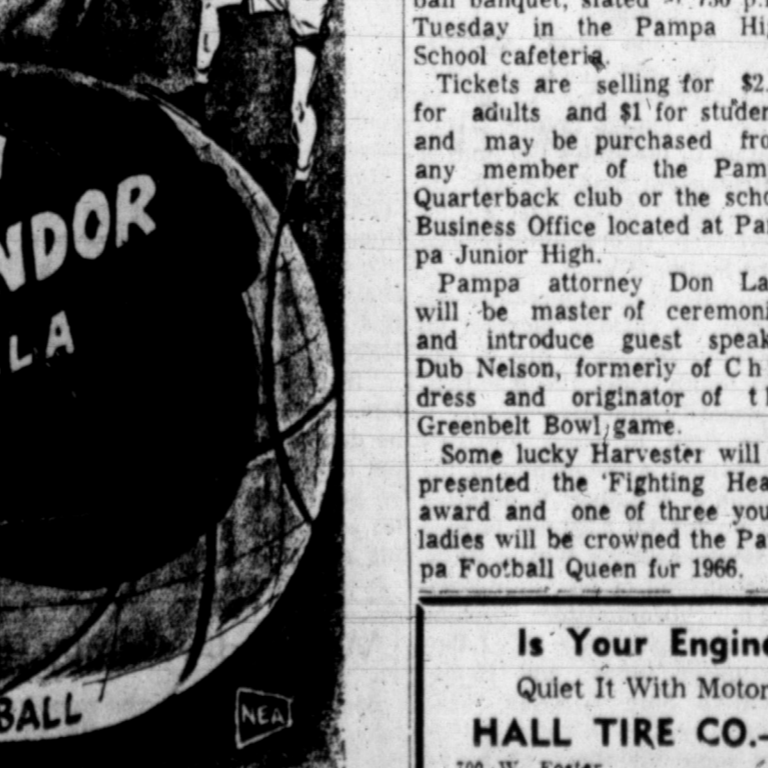
Cupit was on the green of the par-four second hole in two shots and sank his ball with two putts. Rodriguez shot into a sand trap on his second shot and finished the hole with a bogey five.

They were tied with record-setting 17-under-par 271s at the end of the regulation 72 holes. Dan Sikes finished third with a 273, followed by Dave Hill with a 274 and Wright Garrett and Dave Stocktos with 275s.

Rodriguez, the clown of the professional circuit, trailed Cupit by three strokes going into the final round. The 31-year-old golfer from Bayamon, P.R., shot a three-under-par 69 on the last 18 to work his way into the playoff. Cupit had a par 72 in the final round.

The \$34,200 tournament, the last on the circuit this season, was played on the 6,700-yard Oakbourne Country Club course.
