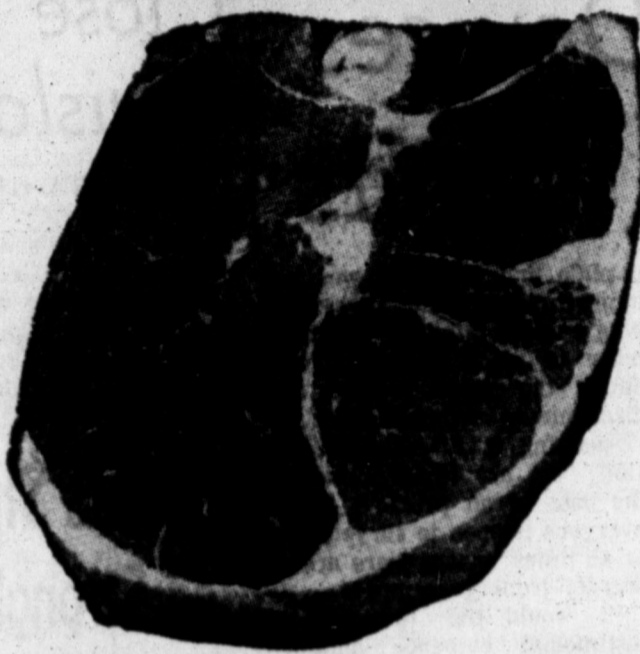

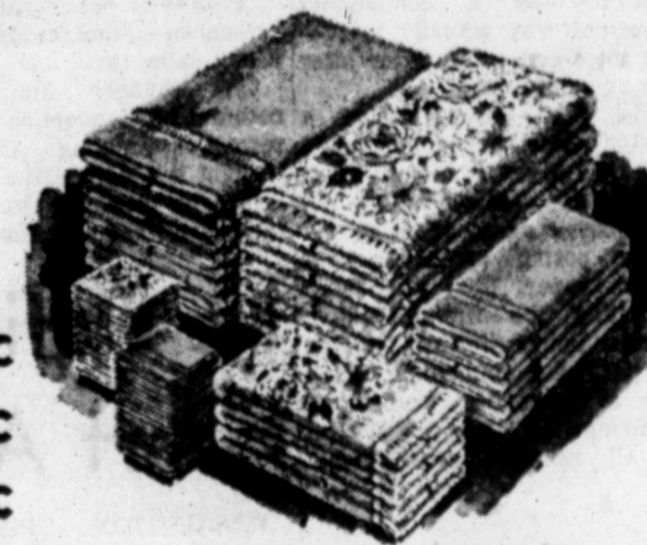

### Good Time For Testing of Soil

December is a good month for collecting and submitting soil samples for testing, reminds Gray County Agent Foster Whaley.

At the present time, samples are processed as soon as they arrive at the laboratory and test reports are mailed within ten days. This schedule should benefit since prompt service in an important requirement for an effective soil-testing service, Whaley points out.

"Sampling well in advance of planting offers the advantage of allowing time to obtain the fertilizers needed. In many instances, wet soil may be encountered during the winter and cause a delay in sampling, therefore, sampling now is advisable."

Shipping weights can be reduced by allowing the sample to dry a day or two at air temperature. Samples should not be heated since high temperatures cause potassium to be fixed in some soils in such a way that it cannot be removed by chemical procedures, Whaley advises.

"If reliable information is to be obtained from a soil test, it is necessary for the sample to be as nearly representative of the field on which information is desired as possible. To obtain a representative sample, a composite is made by obtaining a core or slice of soil from 10-15 spots in fields from 20 to 40 acres in size.

Pint boxes, mailing cartons, history sheets, and instructions are available from the county agent's office. Instructions for sampling should be studied and followed as closely as possible. It is a good idea to go over these instructions with the county agent, especially if this is a first experience in collecting samples.

The service is also available to urban residents for garden and lawns. A nominal fee is charged for the testing.

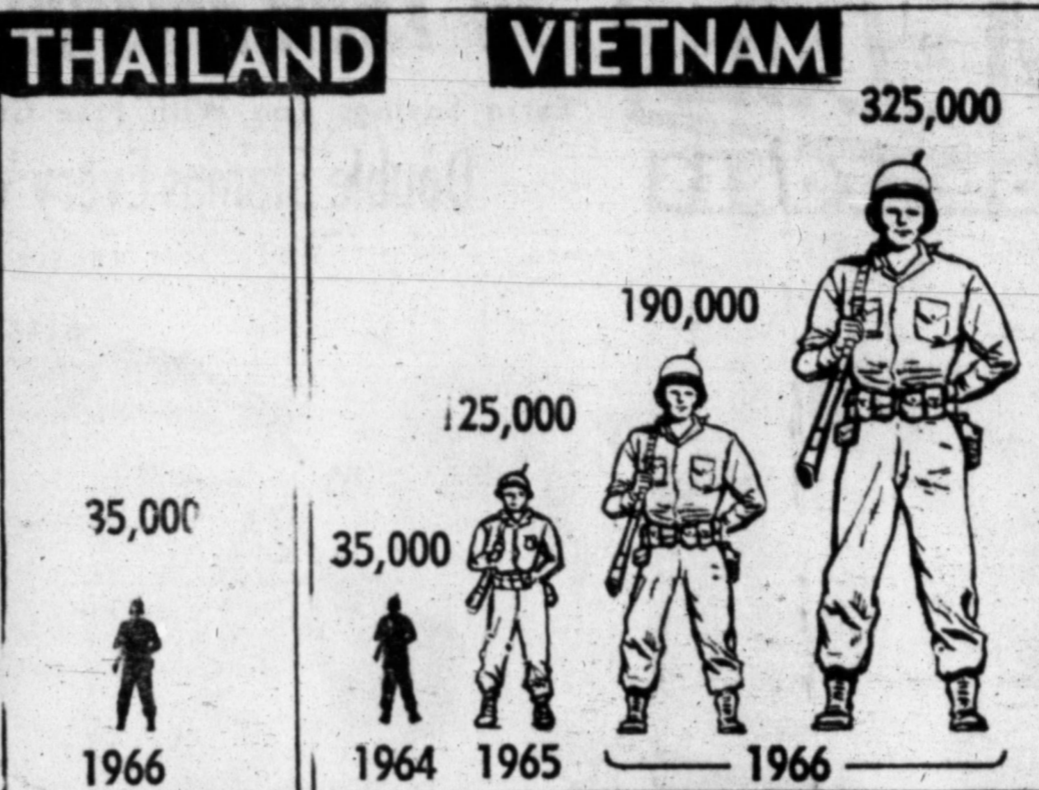

### Castro Claims Missile Crisis 'Secret Deal'

CHICAGO (UPI)—The United States made a secret deal with Cuba and the Soviet Union during the 1962 Cuban missile crisis, according to Cuban Premier Fidel Castro.

Castro told author Lee Lockwood in a copyrighted interview published today in Playboy magazine that the United States pledged it would not invade Cuba and made other agreements still secret.

"I can say to you that even more agreements exist besides, about which not a word has ever been said...one day, perhaps, it will be known that the United States made some other concessions in relation to the October crisis besides those that were made public."

Castro said the United States had made "de facto" recognition of its pledge against invading Cuba, despite Cuba's refusal to allow international inspection to confirm removal of Soviet missiles on the island. The secret agreement "was not an agreement in accord with protocol," Castro told the interviewer, but were made by letter through diplomatic channels.

Castro said he considered former Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev acted high handedly in failing to consult Cuba during the crisis, dealing instead directly with President Ken-

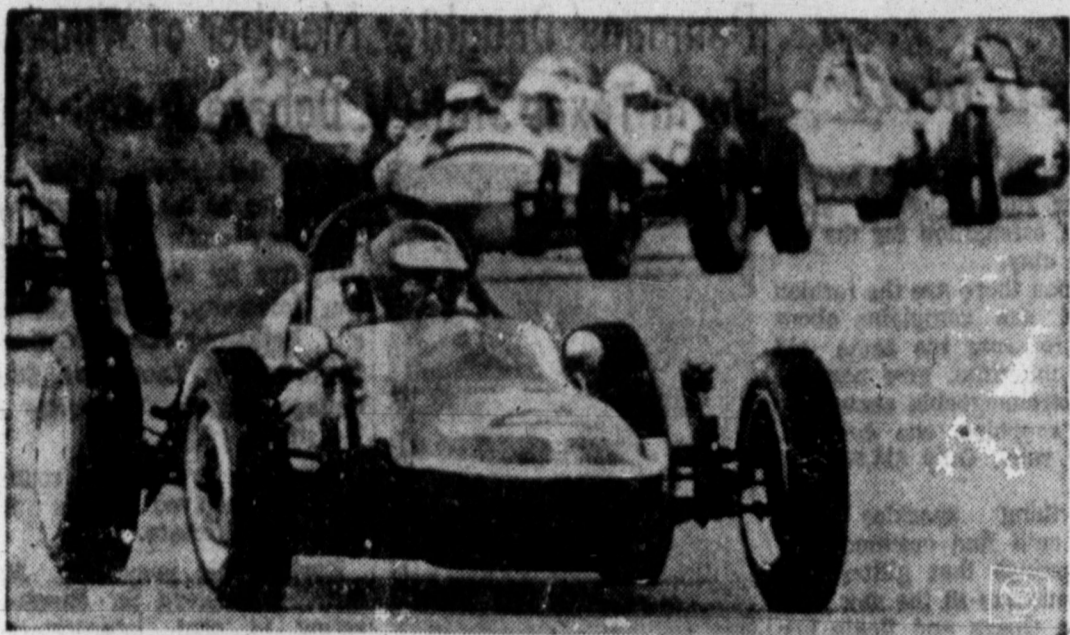

## Nassau Speed Week In Trouble Although One of Best Events

NASSAU, Bahamas (NEA) — Taped to the steering wheel hub of a Lola Ford driven by Mario Andretti was a message from his pit crew: "Think charge!"

It is a message that would serve the people who run the annual Nassau Speed Week well. Speed Week is said to be in trouble. If this is true, it is a shame because Speed Week could (perhaps should) be one of the three of our four great racing events of the year.

One part of the trouble is that no one seems to know where the trouble is — not the people who run it and not the people who take part. "Something's wrong somewhere, let's say," said a Speed Week official, who asked not to be named. He summed it up for everybody.

In the first place, any problem with such an event as Speed Week has to be a mysterious one because where is there a better place to stage auto races than a charming, fun-filled island in the sun? What's more, the Oakes Field track, a converted airstrip, potentially is one of the most challenging tracks in the world.

"I think it's fantastic," said Jochen Rindt, the young Austrian who made it big on the Grand Prix circuit this past year.

"This track has some interesting turns, great turns, in fact. But some of the facilities probably need to be improved. Definitely, the track should be resurfaced."

Rindt won his race, the

"Grand Prix" for the Formula Vees, but it was hardly a test of his skill. He said he wished he had the chance to run the powerhouses around the 45 mile circuit.

Some say the drivers and car owners are the ones who are making the life of Speed Week precarious. Supposedly, they do not take the race (the big 252-mile Nassau Trophy race at week's end) seriously and therefore are reluctant to make the trip.

"You've got to be realistic," said A. J. Foyt. "First prize here is \$5,000, which isn't so hot. And after that the prize list is pretty small. And when did you ever see a good driver not take any race seriously?"

"Hell," said Andretti, taking his seat in the casino, "it's a

great place to come. Do you see anybody around having a bad time?"

So where is the problem? The best answer seems to be that the week lacks direction. It draws a few professionals, a few rank amateurs and a lot of the middle. It is not the most attractive of fields, but a big-gar pot would quickly fix that.

Of course, the week and the big race could take the other direction. Make it strictly for the amateurs and cut back expenses! But feeling is that the track isn't for amateurs.

Also, when Speed Week was in its prime (this was the 13th year), there were few sports car races of note in the United States. Now there are dozens including the three-week-long

Canadian-American Series with its fat purses. Basically, Speed Week is a promotion for Nassau tourism and now if is not paying for itself. The concern here is that the sponsors are thinking of cutting back when it would seem that race fans from all over the United States — especially fun-in-the-sun youth — would love to attend if Speed Week people began to think like the sign on Andretti's steering wheel.

SPINOFFS: Speaking of "think charge," there's a British bird named Anita Taylor who knows the meaning of the term. In the Nassau Trophy Race, she handled a Mustang 350 GT well enough to embarrass many a male in the pits. "Most of the drivers think it's a giggle," she said, "until they see me pass them a time or two." As a Christmas gift for auto racing buffs, we recommend a fine new book, "The Golden Age of the American Racing Car" by Griffith Borgeson (W. W. Norton, \$12.50).

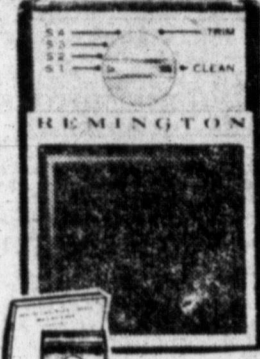






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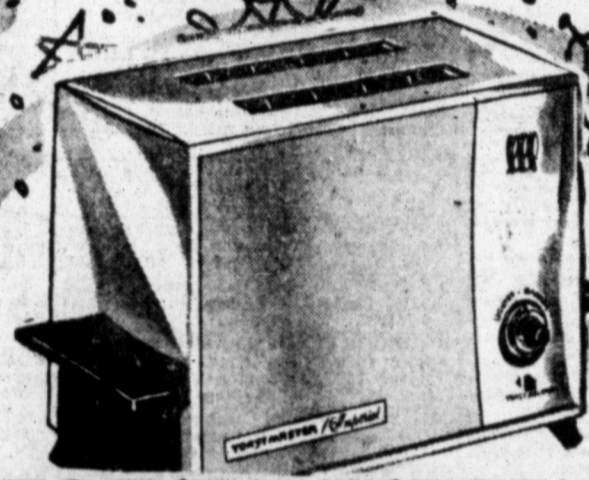
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
