Rep. Powell May Be First Seated On Strength of a Record Album

NEW YORK (UPI)—Adam Clayton Powell may become the first man to be seated in Congress on the strength of his record—a long-playing album called "Keep The Faith, Baby!"

At least one million copies of the recording, a collection of Powell's sermons, speeches and harangues, will go on sale this week.

Indications were that Powell hopes to use the royalties to pay \$164,733 in back taxes, thereby helping to purge himself of contempt of court and paving the way for his return to New York without fear of arrest.

Powell's troubles with the New York courts were a major factor in the decision by Congress to deny him his seat. This week a select House committee opens an investigation into the case. By purging himself of contempt Powell would go a long way toward regaining his seat.

At a news conference called by his attorney Sunday, Powell, was portrayed as contrite and interested in clearing his name before the courts.

"Powell will obey the law," said the attorney, Seymour Barash. "Whatever the courts tell him to do, he will do it."

Barash said Powell had already authorized Jubilee records to hold his earnings in "Keep The Faith, Baby!" and pay off the alimony judgment he owes Mrs. Esther James, the Harlem widow whom Powell defamed on a 1960 television program by calling her a "bag woman," slang for graft collector.

Barash said he would meet with Mrs. James' lawyer today to seek a settlement in the tangled seven-year dispute.

In 1941, the "Lone Eagle" Charles Lindbergh, testified before the House Foreign Affairs Committee in opposition to the proposed Lend-Lease Bill.

Fulbright Says Premier Ky Should Be Dumped

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Sen. J. William Fulbright, D-Ark., says the U.S. should dump South Vietnamese Premier Nguyen Cai Ky if he refuses to seek peace negotiations with the Viet Cong.

"If the present government (of South Vietnam) won't do what we tell them to do, we could get a new government," Fulbright said Sunday.

"He's there only because we put him in," Fulbright said. "He couldn't last two weeks, I don't think, without our support. I don't think he has any choice but to follow U.S. wishes."

Fulbright, the chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, is a leading critic of American policy in Vietnam.

He made the suggestion in a television interview (Meet the Press—NBC).

Fulbright offered his own plan to end the war, including a proposal that the U.S. bring pressure on South Vietnam to seek negotiations with the Viet Cong.

In "The Arrogance of Power," a new book marketed Sunday by Random House, Fulbright proposed an eight-point plan for "Peace Short of Victory" in Vietnam which included:

- A conference of the four belligerents (the U.S., South Vietnam, North Vietnam, and the NLF) to be held in an effort to secure a case-fair.
- An immediate halt in U.S. bombing of North Vietnam and a U.S. pledge to eventually remove all its forces from Vietnam.

Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey said he disagreed with Fulbright but was "not unhappy" the senator had presented alternate proposals for negotiating a solution to the war.

Disbanded Beatles Cut New Record

LONDON (UPI)—The Beatles, reported ready to disband, have a new record which will be released in Britain and the United States next month, it was announced Monday.

A Beatles spokesman said the disc, with the songs "Penny Lane" and "Strawberry Fields Forever," will be released here Feb. 17 and as near to that date as possible in the United States.

The Beatles are now working on another 12 numbers for their next album, to be released sometime in the spring, along with a one-hour television spectacular of their own centered on the recording, the spokesman said.

The news came a day after Paul McCartney, 24, was quoted in the Sunday Times as saying: "Now we're ready to go our own ways. We'll work together if we miss each other. Then it'll be hobby work. It's good for us to go it alone."

His words came as no surprise to the other Beatles—John Lennon, 26, George Harrison, 23 and Ringo Starr, 28—because they have broken up as a group while they were at their height of their mob adulation by fans.

They are doing no more tours together and are branching out into individual interests while continuing to do occasional records together and going ahead with plans to make a third film.

Senior Nominated By Optimists for Young Texan Role

Gary Lynn McCarrell, a Pampa High School senior, has been nominated by the Optimist Club of Pampa for the Young Texan Award for January.

McCarrell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Cecil McCarrell, 2200 N. Christy, was introduced to club members at a meeting held last night in Jim's Steak House.

McCarrell's qualifications which led to the award, are based on outstanding scholastic, athletic, extra-curricular, and church activities as well as hobbies, and employment.

McCarrell has a grade average of 85.4 and was an honor student while in junior high school.

He played Pee Wee basketball in the fifth and sixth grades and started running track in the sixth grade and continued in this sport the remainder of his school career. He will represent Pampa High School this spring, his senior year. He

At the seventh grade Invitational meet he placed first in the 75 yard dash and ran one leg in both the 440 yard relay and the 220 relay.

As an eighth grader, McCarrell took a 26 mile hike for the National Physical Fitness Program. He placed third in the 100 and third in the 220 yard dash at the Dumas meet. However this was a ninth grade meet.

In the ninth grade the high school senior placed second in the 220 at Amarillo, being only .05 seconds behind first place. He set a district record for the 100 yd. dash at Borger and this record 10.15 still stands. He also won first place in the 100 and 220 yard dashes at the Perryton Invitational meet.

This same year he took first place in the 220 yard dash at Borger, fourth in the 100 at the Amarillo meet and first in the 220 and 440 yard dashes in the 1965 Jaycees Track Meet. He was also co-captain of the ninth grade football team, and high scorer that year.

In the 10th grade McCarrell took third place in the 440 yard dash at the Amarillo district meet, the Perryton meet and the Plainview meet.

In the 11th grade, he placed third in the 440 yard dash at the district meet in Lubbock. His time of 49.2 was a new Pampa record. He also won first place in the 440 yard dash at the Snyder Relays that year. He started playing football in the seventh grade and continued through the 12th. He lettered two years in high school and made Harvester of the Week in his junior year. McCarrell is a charter member of the Junior Optimist Club, a cub scout for three years and a Boy Scout for one year. He is a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes and a coaches' aid this year. He was den chief, while in the Cub Scouts and is a past member of the Pampa Archery Club.

He is a member of the Church of the Nazarene and served as Sunday School class president in 1965. He is active in youth work and presently is an usher in the church. He attended Camp Arrowhead at Glen Rose one summer.

For the past two summers, McCarrell has been employed for the Texas Highway Department. In addition to sports activities, Pampa's nominee for the Young Texan Award lists archery, hunting, trout fishing to his interests in surfing, skiing and swimming.

Georg Massie, chairman of the Optimist program, remarked, "This club highly recommends Gary as our Young Texan of the month. He is a hard worker and at all times shows respect and courtesy to all with whom he is associated. He is popular among his classmates, a good student and top citizen."

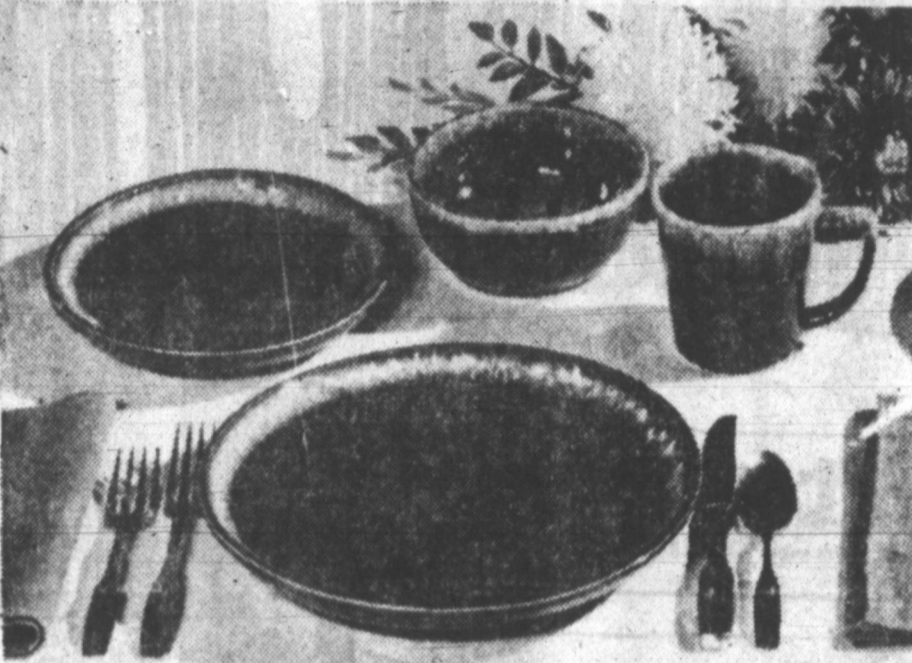

His wife, Glenda, is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Everitt R. Butler of Rt. 1, White Deer.

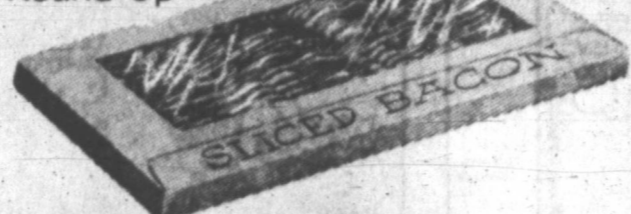
Dallas Area Navy Re-Ups Very High

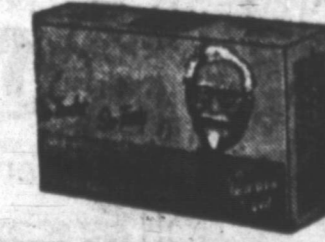
