# Rest of World Holds Varied Views on Negro Riots in U.S.

By United Press International America's friends would not cast the first stone. Her foes called it justice. And men in the street shook their heads in confusion.

World reaction to the racial riots that spread across the face of America ranged from sympathetic sadness to "I told

Obeying diplomacy's unwritten law, no government in the world expressed official reaction. But many governmentcontrolled newspapers offered

explanations and leveled accusations. And individuals talked. A Tokyo taxi driver, perplexed and bewildered by the news he had been reading, expressed how many citizens around the world felt. "I don't understand you Americans," he said. "Over there the white people and black people fight and over here you drink

The Times of London said, "Almost every American city now is riot prone because of unsanitary conditions, social rather than physical, which exist in most American cities."

In Holland the newspaper Nieuwe Rotterdamse Courant echoed some American charges that politics had played into the riots. "It's regrettable that race rioting has become subject to party-political struggles."

The Austrian Socialist newspaper Arbeiter Zeitung hit on the same theme. It said President Johnson's commission to investigate the riots and his plea for prayer "demonstrate

the same, strange mixture of political slyness, unlimited naivete, the cold cynicism which marks the Johnson era."

The East German Communist Party Newspaper Neues Deutschland further attacked Johnson and tied the riots in with the Vietnam war. "According to the same practice followed in Vietnam, Johnson's paratroopers, national guardsmen and police in Detroit have murdered indiscriminately."

served, "A hundred years after the abolition of slavery, American Negroes are still compelled to fight for the most elementary civil rights in a country which likes to refer to democratic freedoms "

In segregated South Africa, the pro-government newspaper Transvaler said, "Until America finds a solution to her problems, it behooves her to be silent about South Africa's (racial) policies."

In racially divided Rhodesia,

a Salisbury shopkeeper perhaps summed up most white Rhodesians' views when he said, "Let them have a taste of what they've been trying to foist on us and South Africa."

Rhodesian Premier Ian Smith jabbed indirectly at the riots in a parliamentary debate Wednesday. Answering an opposition motion of concern over a government segregated residetial zoning bill, Smith said it seemed to him the United States could learn from Rhodesia's experiences in race

At the United Nations, diplomat from Senegal said privately, "The Negroes have waited too long. The Negro position is that he has a knife at his throat and must fight back."

A Guinean diplomat at the United Nations said black power militants like Stokely Carmichael and H. Rap Brown are taking the right road. "The radicals fight for a Negro personality-different from the





Moore, who also is chairman of the Water Pollution Control Board which will be succeeded on Sept. 1 by the new water quality board, said a recent tour of the state's pollution problems areas emphasized the need for a speed-up in controlling them.

"For the first time, we have been provided with a staff at financing by the state where we can really get after these problems," Moore said.

Moore predicted that the accelerated anti pollution pace by the state beginning next month probably would result in some court cases against long -time polluters.

#### State Using Caution

The state has moved cautiously during the past six years since it first entered the antipollution field in a serious and widescale basis. Much of this time has been spent in preliminary organizing and setting quality standards.

Now Moore feels with the new board coming into being and a full staif to work on the problems, things will pick up.

Moore said he believed one of the things to come out of the recent inspection trip by federal and state officials was a conviction by industry in the state that they should back Texas in the field of pollution control rather than let the federal government move in.
