SAIGON (UPI) - Victorius U.S. Marines caught up today with remants of a battered North Vietnamese regular battalion retreating from bloodsoaked Hill 881 and attacked them once more in the northwwestern corner of South Viet-

A military spokesman said the Marines made "signnificant contact," Army jargon for the heavy fighting raging just below the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ) and a few miles east of the border of Laos where jungled hills covered with head-high elephant grass rise 2,500 feet.
