eumstances that broken bones in adults．Thiss is
because the bones in children esemble a sapes ing children

sose of an old man resemble a dried twig．In man resemble there is of fracture，seen only in
en，called grenstick frac
an incomplete break in Which the surface on the out－
ward side of a bone when it is
bent splits but the inward side
does at does not．
A deformity following a fra
tured limb in a child often cor－ rects itself as the child grows．
This is the reason that much
more conservative methods of
mereatment can be used than in
an adult an adult with a similar break．
An exception is a type of frac－
ture in which thers is a separa－
tion of the bone at the epiphysis
or growh center．（These cen－
ters disappear when the growth
of the bone is complete．）Epip． of the bone is complete．）Ep
hyseal separations are oft
hard to treat．
