

Job Growth Trend Is to The Trades

NEA Washington Correspondent WASHINGTON — With job skills escalating rapidly and automation advancing apace, it has seemed there could hardly be a worse time to try to find work for hundreds of thousands of untrained Negroes.

A few years ago, a science magazine editor named Gerard Piel accurately calculated that, out of a then total work force just above 70 million, barely 12 million Americans were directly engaged in the production of manufactured goods.

Furthermore, Piel predicted that by the year 2.000 factory workers in the United States may be as scarce as farmers. At the time of writing the number of U.S. farmers was down to six million.
