C. P. Buckler Is Taken by Death


C. P. Buckler, 82, one of the few remaining early day bioneers of the Pampa area, died at 5:30 a.m. today in High-

Romney Ends Three Day Stay in Viet

Romney of Michigan today ended his three-day Christmas visit to Vietnam expressing doubts about the significance of conventional U.S. military victsries. He said the Communists were winning significant victories on nonconventional battle-

Romney spent his last day in Vietnam on a helicopter hop to the Mekong Delta to see close up the pacification program. He also got an unexpected bird's eye view of the war, watching U.S. jets strafe a suspected enemy position. Then he returned to Saigon and flew by commercial airline to Jakarta, the next stop on his 13-nation, round-the world trip.
