The 22nd aunual session of the United Nations General Assembly opened today with a warning from Secretary Generat Thant that another Middle East war is all but unavoidable unless the world body finds a solution to the crisis.

In his annual report to the assembly. Thant said that except for scattered debates "there has been no enduring. persistent effort in any U.N organ" to solve the Middle East

"A determined effort is needed now to find solutions to the issues which have thrice in the past led, and no doubt will again in the future lead to war between the Arabs and Israelis," the report said.

"That's important, of course. At the time of its original listing. a company has to demonstrate that it has been able to earn at least \$1,200,000 a year after taxes, normally for three years."

"That's just a guideline. Every company is considered on its own merits. The Exchange wants to be satisfied that the company has a good position in its industry and prospects for maintaining that position."

To an investor, isn't a company's profit the whole story?

Gallop Poll Says Rockefeller Is **Out In Front**

PRINCETON, N.J. (UPI)-The Gallup Poll said Saturday that a survey shows New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller would defeat President Johnson by a 2 per cent margin if the presidential election were held

The American Institute of Public opinion said in copyrighted report that a "test heat" between the two produced these results: Rockefeller, 48 per cent Johnson, 46 per cent; undecided, 6 per cent.

The poll-followed on the heels of Michigan Gov. George Romney's troubles over his 1965 visit to Vietnam. The Detroit News advocated editorially that Romney withdraw from contention for the 1968 Republican presidential nomination and throw his support to Rockefell-

The results of the Gallup survey showed that Johnson led Rockefeller in the east, 50 to 44 per cent, and in the south, 48 to 43 per cent, but the New York governor was ahead in the midwest. 54 to 40, and in the west, 52 to 44.

The survey reported that Rockefeller showed strength among independent voters and Democrats who are against Johnson. In addition, eight of 10 Republicans say they would vote for him over the President.

The pollsters asked supporters of Romney to indicate their choice if the Michigan governor was not in the race. The result listed 40 per cent of them switching to former Vice President Richard M. Nixon; 20 per cent to Rockefeller, 15 per cent to California Gov. Ronald Reagan, 12 per cent to Illinois Sen, Charles Percy, 4 per cent to New York Mayor John Lindsay and 2 per cent to Oregon Sen. Mark Hatfield.

Detroit Settles Teacher Strike; **New York Fails**

By United Press International Detroit negotiators reached agreement Monday on a contract to end the city's 13-day teachers strike but in New York. allnight bargaining failed to break a deadlock in a week-old walkout of teachers.

The Detroit Federation of Teachers (DFT) called an immediate meeting of its 11,500 members. Mary Ellen Riordan, DFT president, said she would recommend approval and a return to the classroom.

Terms of the agreement reached in night-long bargaining were not disclosed.

A settlement also was reported in the Detroit suburb of Dearborn, leaving schools in nine other communities still closed by teacher strikes. In Detroit alone 300,000 children were kept out of school by the

"There has been some narrowing of disagreements." New York Mayor John V. Lindsay said after the 7 a.m. conclusion of the negotiating session he convened at his official residence Sunday night.

Albert Shanker, president of the 50,000-member United Federation of Teachers (UFT), said wearily "We're bargaining" when asked about progress in the marathon talks. "I'm neither optimistic nor pessimis-tic . . . I'm bushed," he said.





At the same time, a new Gallup poll showed that if the election were held now, Rockefeller would defeat Johnson 48 per cent to 46 per cent.

The expressions of support, according to Rockefeller's associate, gave the governor a "feeling of warmth" but do not stir ambitions to make a third bid for the presidential nomina-

Rockefeller does not subscribe political forecasts that Romney has been left at the starting line by his "brainwashing" charge. The New York governor is not concerned by what he considers the "hypothetical" question that GOP moderates may have to swing to Nixon if Romney fades. He says Romney has not announced yet. He is confident the Michigan governor will pick up
