



#### Wall Street Chatter

NEW YORK (UPI)-Moody's Investors Service said that while stock prices should move higher the market may face. increased pressure and greater irregularity in the coming weeks. The analyst, however, says that on the near term internal divergences are likely to be more important than the general market trend.

E.F. Hutton & Co. says the bulk of trading interest remains on the buy side andt he weak issues seem to be so more from a lack of buying than selling pressure. The company says that if the market's recent action is any indication, it is beginning to look as if the bears may be on the verge of forfeiting another opportunity,"

The Dines Letter says the stock market is now 'in a binge" quite comparable to early 1961 and late 1965, and says that a "severe shakeout" will follow. The adviser says the broad outlook for computer, electronic, optics and nuclear energy stocks is "astronomically higher" and suggests that investors regard the next shakeout as "another splendid opportunity to accumulate selected glamor shares."

uses apple brandy. From all this research came a new cookbook "The Complete Book of Mexican. Cooking' (Evans), which contains recipes for both mild and peppery dishes.

Mrs. Ortiz said that today's Mexican cookery uses preColombian cooking methods from the Aztec and Inca empires with many ingredients of Spanish and Arabic origin introduced during the conquest. Among those ingredients are nuts used instead of flour to thicken sauces; spices such as clove, and cinnamon; beef, lamb, pork, milk, and other dairy products raisins, olive oil, sugar and



The riders are convicts, mostly lifers or long-timers, and they challenge the bulls and the brones for many reasons during the four annual performances of The Texas prison rodeo.

A lot of people take advantage of October's normally bright blue weather to pack the 28,000 seat arena at the prison. each Sunday during the month. The cheers and applause are abundant and may be the convicts' primary motives for participating, according to Richard Jones, who is in charge of the

"They think they are helping the 12,000 convicts have a better go by earning some money," said Jones. "I think the applause they get is the chief thing they do it for."

Jones said the rodeo earns about \$180,000 a year for the prison and the convict-riders help zealously to bring it in. The money goes for such things as athletic equipment, an educadon program, med icalatte tion and other benefits for the
