## Foreign News Commentary

By ARNOLD DIBBLE TAIPEI (UPI)-Nothing, they

say, succeeds like success. Yet, like many aspects of the Orient, the western maxim does not always hold true. And perhaps no one would agree with this more than the president of Nationalist China, Generalissimo Chiang Kai-shek, who today celebrates his 80th, birthday.

For the generalissimo, his dreams of a conquering return to the Mainland whence he was driven 18 years ago has faded in the minds, and hearts of his countrymen in direct proportion to the prosperity wrought on this island of 14-million persons.

For the first six months of this year, industrial growth showed a gain of nearly 20 per cent. This is almost double that of Japan. Agricultural growth on an island where only oneforth of the land can be cultivated showed a healthy 10 per cent gain.

The gross national product (GNP) probably will top \$4 billion this year.

As new nightclubs, hotels, golf courses, bowling alleys, and would you believe ice skating rinks in the sub-tropics, open and fourish there is less and less talk about a return to the Mainland. "Why leave anything so good?" seems to be a prevalent feeling.

Americans, or many of them, are critical of "giving away billions" in foreign aid. Taiwan is one area in Asia where U.S. money has really worked. It has worked so well that the U.S. Agency for International Deveopment (AID) closed down two years ago after investing approximately \$1.5-billion in economic aid since 1951.

A few specifics:

Taiwan has surpassed Hawaii as the world's largest exporter

of canned pineapple. -It is the world's largest suppliers of mushrooms. -In 1952, it produced 1.4-billion kilolatt-hours of electrical power supply. In 1966, this
