

Why not be Whole Hog or None, lest we wrest the scripture to our own soul's damnation. If a scripture belongs to the New Testament Church era then use it as such by obedience to it. If the Bible speaks of a promise, which it does, be Whole Hog or None. Believe in it, trust God for it and it will come to pass.

Maybe the reason God doesn't give some people the Whole Hog is because all they ask for is the rind.
