In the Senate, Sen, Walter F. Mondale, D-Minn., introduced implementation of scheduled increases in personal exemptions and standard deduction rates in personal income tax reports.

The personal exemption per person in filing federal taxes rose, effective with 1970 reports, rom \$600 to \$625, and is scheduled to rise gradually to \$750 after three years.

The standard income deduction for persons who do not itemize also is scheduled to rise gradually during the same period to 15 per cent, Mondale proposed that this also be made effective for 1971 income, in filings due April 15, 1972.

Mondale, saying changes were needed immediately to stimulate the economy, also called for reinstitution of a 7 per cent tax credit for the first \$25,000 of investment in new facilities or equipment.

Another proposal by Mondale would extend from 26 weeks to 39 weeks the maximum period of eligibility for unemployment compensation.



The chamber, in a statement presented by attorney Irving Scher, told the Commerce subcommittee that "consumer class actions will not provide an expeditious ormeaningful remedy for consumers against unfair and deceptive trade practices."
