Smith Asks President To Declare 87 More Counties Disaster Area

AUSTIN (UPI)-Gov. Preston Smith says Texas is in the middle of its worst drought in 15 years and has asked the federal government to add 87 more counties to the list he wants de-

clared a federal disaster area. The governor said he hoped his request did not get him involved in another game of political "one-upmanship" with Sen. John G. Tower, R-Tex.

President Nixon, meanwhile, has ordered surplus hay and grain sent to the driest areas of West and South Texas in an attempt to prevent an economic disaster threatening the farmers and ranchers because of the dry

"This is the worst drought Texas has experienced since the mid 1950s," Gov. Smith said Wednesday, "Our farmers and ranchers are suffering great losses because they have not been able to plant many crops and other crops are dying for lack of adequate water. Feed supplies have been inadequate

for cattle and much of Texas livestock has had to be sold.

"In addition, we are most concerned about the agricultural laborers who have been laid off or not hired this year as a result of the drought. All segments of our agricultural industry in these counties are in dire need of financial and other forms of assistance, which can only be provided by the federal government under a disaster declara-Smith asked the federal govTexas counties a federal disaster area because of the drought. This declaration would permit persons to obtain low - interest loans Smith asked the government to add 87 counties to that

list Wednesday. The President's order sending hay and grain to Texas is the government's first move to help those hit by the drought. The action was announced through Tower's office Wednesday and Smith called this announcement

"One - upmanship is an old Washington game, but there is absolutely no place for partisan politics or petty 'I got the news out first' maneuvers where human tragedy enters the picture" the governor said. "As far as we're concerned here in the governor's office, it matters not who gets the credit because we are not seeking credit. We are seeking assistance for the people of our state who are in dire

made possible by the passage last year of the Disaster Assistance Act. The law gives the President new powers to assist areas where disasters strike or appear imminent.

"The President has authorized the Office of Emergency Preparedness (OEP) to coordinate the actions of the federal government to meet the needs to drought stricken areas in Texas" as spokesman for Tower said, "Essentially this means the OEP will bring hay and

grain in to assist cattle in the stricken area. This is not an actual Presidential disaster declaration. But the law authorizes the President, if a disaster is likely, to use the means of the federal government to avert such a disaster."

"I don't care whether the senator or the President or anyone else gets the credit," Gov. Smith said, "My only concern is that the greatest possible assistance be afforded to the people who have been hit by this
