AUSTIN, Tex. (UPI) - Legislators got down to the hairpulling, back-stabbing, battle royal over reapportionment today with votes scheduled in the House and Senate on redistrict-

House Speaker Gus Mutscher said he planned to push for a vote in the House on a controversial legislative redistricting bill to wipe out almost half his strongest critics.

"We may have a little more work to do," Mutscher said. But the speaker said he expects to have the votes to pass his redistricting bill out of the House.

Opponents of the bill, however, predicted they would get enough votes to scuttle Mutscher's redistricting plan or at least block action on the measure

Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes scheduled a vote in the Senate on congressional redistricting. House members passed their congressional plan a week ago, but the Senate version redraws most of the boundaries.

YORK (UPI)—The shrinking volume that accompanied the easing prices lends "credence to the supposition that the correction is a temporary adjustment within a basically bullish longer term framework," Spear & Staff, Inc. believes. 38 Americans Killed In Viet Last Week

SAIGON (UPI)-Communist troops last week killed 38 American servicemen and wounded 92 others, the lowest casualty toll suffered by U.S. forces since the second week of the year, military spokesmen said today.

Officers said, however, that not all the names of 30 Americans killed and 50 wounded in a pair of Communist rocket attacks last Friday were included in the weekly casualty report issued by the U.S. command today.

Servicemen are not listed until their families have been notified, spokesmen said, and names of many of the 80 casualties suffered last Friday will be held until next week's report.
