Hitchhiking Can Be More Than Just Risky

NEW YORK Charleyce Whalen, 17, used to hitchhike America's highways with the same liberated and reckless seff-conficence that millions of other young people do in these times. But then, one day, setting out from Sacramento to San Francisco, Calif., she became a victim of the new rule of thumb.

She was found on a dirt road in a resort community. Police say she mad been picked up by two motorists, given marijuana, made to sniff cocaine, forced into sexual activity - then shot dead, twice in the body and twice in the skull.

The incident shocked some state citizens. But for the most part, Californians decided to treat the incident as the rest of America treats such incidents, that is: Forget it.

There is general agreement In the United States that the phenomenal rise in hitchhikers, especially young female hitchhikers, is a risky social development. Yet there seems to be no overt effort made toward doing anything about it.

Few states have solid laws against the practice (merely vague measures prohibiting "roadway solicitation"). Fewer still really enforce the regulations they do have. In New York, as example, a state trooper out of Westchester County says: "I'm out here to protect motorist safety. If I see a kid thumbing on the pavement I'll chase him off. Otherwise, hell, how can I bother with him? I remember when I was that age, why, I thumbed rides myself, all over the country."

End China Isolation Nixon Aim

By RAY CROMLEY Washington Correspondent WASHINGTON (NEA)-President Nixon has a deep and abiding personal interest in China. He grew up at a time and went to college at a place where China was a subject of

In the years before he became president, Mr. Nixon became convinced that as Western Europe had been the top priority after World War II, so Asia must be the top priority of the 1970s.

Mr. Nixon had been greatly impressed by the Marshall Plan for Europe. It was dominated by Europeans, not Americans. It built internal strength but did not threaten Russia or Eastern Europe. The President believes that it was the rapid restoration of the European economies and the cementing of the Atlantic alliance that forced Moscow to look to the wisdom of reaching some measure of accommodation with the West. He believes Moscow changed when it found that change was necessary.

After talking with White House advisers and reading over the President's past statements on the subject, it is vinced the same formula will work with Red China.


