FT. BENNING, Ga. (UPI)-Lt. William L. Calley Jr., who says he never wantonly killed a human being in his entire 27 years, may learn today whether the jury that convicted him in the My Lai massacre demands his death to balance the scales of military justice.

The six veterans of battle in Vietnam, Korea, and World War II who found Calley guilty of premeditated murder of 22 Vietnamese on Monday took up the new burden of deciding his fate late Tuesday. They deliberated an hour and 37 minutes before recessing until today.

imprisonment was the lightest sentence they could bring and death the maximum, the judge, Col. Reid W. Kennedy, told the jury of officers:

"You alone are responsible for determining an appropriate sentence. You should select a sentence that is appropriate to the offenses of which you have convicted Lt. Calley, his needs, the welfare of society, and good order and discipline within the military service."

The jury has given evidence it is acutely aware of the responsibility it carries. It took 13 days to convict the stubby deliberately forming a design to slaughter shrieking women, children, and old men in the hamlet three years ago.

In an emotional two minutes and 12 seconds Tuesday, the 5foot-3 Miamian spoke his last words to the men who will punish him: "Yesterday, you stripped me of all my honor. Please, by your actions that you take here today, don't strip future ... (his voice broke in a sob). . .future soldiers of their honor, I beg of you."

"The facts, gentlemen," replied the driving young prosecutor, Capt. Aubrey M. Daniel. did not create the facts. What he did made the facts.

"You did not strip him of his honor. What he did stripped him of his honor.

"Your courage will continue to be tested. The government says to you: Take those facts, gentlemen. You must arrive at a sentence commensurate with your findings (verdict), which must show the principle involved: It is not honor and it never has been conisdered honor to kill unarmed men, women, and children."

Prior to his words, his 70year-old, soft-spoken attorney, George W. Latimer, pleaded for Calley's life: "There is a place for Lt. Calley to go on and make something of his life, but he can't do it from a graveyard ... I go away with a heavy heart, for I see a life ruined." Latimer was misty-eyed when

The jurymen are instructor in the Army Infantry School whose sword-shield motto is "Follow Me."

Before Calley made, his statement to the jury, Lotte told them that "because of makeup of the boy" Calley had inisisted the defense put on no witnesses for him but had requested "to stand on defense on his own two feet and make

such statements as he has to. "I hope the young boy will be able to do it without caving in." Latimer continued. "For 18 long months he has been under the horrors of prosecution."



Although there is far more concern about alcoholism in business now than there was 25 years ago, a 1968 study by the Conference Board, an industryupported research organization, showed that the number of companies with alcoholism programs for their employes was about 300 - the same as it was in 1958.

Those companies that do have programs have reported 67 per cent recovery rates for employes involved and some sources contend that industry saves from \$5 to \$10 each dollar it spends on an alcoholism program.







Most Tire Repairs Temporary

Careful drivers have their tire pressure checked regularly, as the National Safety Council advises. However, in the event of a flat tire, do you know how to have it repaired properly? Many of the tires supposedly receiving manent repair" do not meet safety tests.

The Council warns that external repairs on tubeless tires are good only for up to 100 miles of travel at speeds not exceeding 50 miles per hour. It is recommended that these temporary repairs be used only in emergencies.

For safe and permanent repair, a tire must be sealed from the inside. The use of an outside plug is only a temporary repair. Unless the tire is removed from the wheel, it is impossible to know if the inner layer is intact and not broken, damage which is critical to the

Cars Are Better Than Drivers

Since the first self-propelled vehicle moved over a road, there have been thousands of improvements made in the car. In that time, there have been no basic improvements in the operator: man.

Based on this premise, the Arospace Education Foundation, with an assist from the United States Air Force, has published The Safe Driving Handbook, which, it is hoped, is a step in the right direction to help improve the driver.

The foundation makes reference to the difference between the flyer and the automobile driver. They conclude that driving on a city street is more complicated than flying. Their reasoning is that conditions on the ground are more challenging than in the

The Safe Driving Handbook covers the whole spectrum of driving situations, including considerable emphasis on driver personality and attitude, important factors in the overall safety of the operator. It also states that boredom, a main reason for driver inattention, is involved in nearly every form of unsafe driving.

The handbook reduces safe driving techniques to basic fundamentals: where and how to sit in the driver's seat so you become less fatigued and therefore more alert; techniques in braking, speeding, passing and stopping; formation on recovering from a skid; importance of conscientious automobile maintenance; estimating following distance for safe braking; right of way at intersections, and hundreds of other well-explained and illustrated tips.

The book also describes in detail how a driver can judge his own driving ability. This factor is important when you consider that even the worse drivers feel they are among the best, according of the authors. This observation was made when scientists interviewed drivers who were in bad collisions and it was learned that 80 per cent of these drivers were convinced that the other driver was to blame.

When asked if they thought a refresher course in operating the automobile would help them avoid accidents in the future, only one in 20 thought it could teach them anything. Only two percent of these drivers thought that courtesy was important in any way when driving.

Thus the driver lost control accounted for 18 per cent. causing the fatal accident.

These are obvious signs that your car is polluting.

However, there are times when an oversupply of unburned hydrocarbons, carbon monoxide and nitrogen oxides cannot be seen. If this is the case, how can you tell when your car is poHuting?

Look for these warning signs: A. Increased oil consumption

B. Loss of acceleration C. A noticeable drop in fuel economy

D. Hard starting

E. Stalling Rough running idling

These conditions mainly stem from faulty ignition, compression or emission control devices.

Take he case of a misfiring Take the case of a midfiring spark plug. A five percent rate of misfire can increase unburned hydrocarbon emissions by 300 per cent.

Consider a clogged PCV valve or dirty air cleaner. These can, almost double the polluntants

CAR PICTURES

If a photo is to be taken from a car, it is always best to shoot from a stopped vehicle. If impossible to stop, it is best to shoot through the front window. If you shoot out of the side window, the foreground of the scene will be blurry. Hold the camera as steady possible (a rule in situations) without bracing it against the car, as the vibrations will blur the picture.

WINTER WEATHER WAN

After the winter's weather has gone, strong chemicals, used for melting snow and ice on roads, may still be on your car. A thorough paint cleaning and polishing helps prevent auto

BANG!

The backfiring car alsmost seems a relic of bygone days. However, the modern car can backfire, too - especially when the fuel mixture is too lean and the engine cold. Other possible causes are sticky or leaky valves or ignition leakage. If your car backfires; take it to your favorite service outlet.

Never "bleed" a tire, even if pressure builds up an extra six or more pounds after the rire is heated from prolonged use.

ANTENNA UP

On a long trip, radio reception can sometimes become weak or full of static. Putting up the antenna will usually improve the quality of reception.

Average Driver **Needs To Make** Camera Check

Before leaving on a motor trip ,the average driver is likely to have his car inspected to make sure it is running properly and smoothly.

In the same vein, the camera depended upon for the vacation record should also receive the same careful inspection. There s nothing as aggravating or lisappointing as discovering hose fabulous pictures you hought you took are all a blur or nothing at all.

The easiest way to check the camera, especially if it has not been used for a while, is to shoot a test roll of film. If the pictures are satisfactory, you an be reasonably sure your camera is working properly. If not, take it to a dealer and have him check it.

.Photo Inventory A profitable "hefore-leaving" photograph is one picturing the things you are taking with you. While a photo-inventory will not prevent you from something, it is one good way not to leave things behind. Each time you move on, check the photo and see if you have everything. The same photo record could also be handy when filing an insurance claim for lost or stolen property.

Instead of "packing" your camera for the trip, keep it out of suitcases and handy for any scene that presents itself during the trip. Seeing a photographic scene is worthless if no camera is available.

.Facts on Film

A word of advice - film is perishable. Heat and humidity are particularly harmful and have the greatest effect on color film. 'In summer, don't place your camera or film in the trunk, glove compartment or on the rear deck. The best place for the camera is on the seat beside you. Extra film can be carried in a cooling chest.

Simple Steps Can Help Prevent Theft Of Car

While waiting for a special theft protection device to be installed on your new car or "old faithful," there are several things that can be done to prevent having your car stolen.

Keep your oar doors locked at all times.

Never keep valuables inside your car. Keep only necessary items in

your trunk. Another simple way to deter car theft is to keep your car parked under a light at night, if possible.
