

A sketch of early pioneer days in Pampa will be featured in this year's souvenir program for the musical drama "Texas." The pen and ink drawing is titled, " 'Bones' Hookes rides a bad one during a train stop at Pampa, Texas in 1911."

The sketch is one of thirty drawn by Paul Laune of Phoenix, Arizona, the 1971 program artist.

Laune grew up in Woodward, Okla., where his father, fresh out of law school, made the "run" into the Cherokee Strip. A few years later the young attorney made visits to the Texas Panhandle where he courted and married Seigniora (Nonie) Russell, who in her teens had gone with her family to settle in Collingsworth County.

The artist's interest from boyhood days were horses and pictures, Long before it was time for him to go to university and art schools he had become an experienced - hand with horses and cattle.

Hooks rides a bad one during a train stop at Pampa, Texas in 1911" states: Matthew "Bones" Hooks, a Negro broncrider and horse-trainer, and later a civic leader in Amarillo, worked for Joe Williams, when Joe was ramrod on the old RO range. Joe tole of an incident that took place when "Bones" was a pullman-porter on the Santa Fe's crack train that crossed the Panhandle.

"Bones" overheard some men on the train talking about a horse that "couldn't be rode." Finally, "Bones" broke in to say he'd like to try his luck with such a hoss. The upshot was that a purse of \$50 was put up, and several days later, when the train stopped at Pampa, the bad horse was waiting there, when "Bones," booted and spurred, and sans white porter's jacket, piled off the train.

As "Bones" later told Joe Williams, "Icombed that brone from his ears to his tail, rode him to a standstill, collected my money, and was back on the train when it pulled out seven minutes later."

Laune studied at the American Academy of Art and the Art Institute in Chicago, the Art Student's League and night courses in New York, followed by study and travel in Ejrope. In Rame he studied etching in the studio of Carlo Petrucci.
