King Hassan Says Officers Involved In Coup Must Die By MICHAEL GOLDSMITH

Associated Press Writer

RABAT, Morocco (AP) -The ringleaders in the attempt to overthrow King Hassan II were executed by a firing squad early today, official sources reported.

They said the names of the officers executed after a summary court-martial would be announced later.

The executions are continuing, they added, and it was not immediately clear whether all the six leading conspirators reported under arrest had been

King Hassan told a news conference Sunday that the officers who led the attempted coup Saturday would all be dead by sundown tonight. He named eight principal plotters including four generals and three colonels.

The attempt by four army generals to overthrow King

crises in his 10-year-old reign. There have been a border war with Algeria, angry disputes with more radical Arab regimes and domestic conflicts that forced the King in 1965 to dissolve the National Assembly.



Only Two Dallas Viet Veterans **Under Treatment**

DALLAS (AP) - Heroin ad diction problems of Vietnam veterans returning to Dallas are "rather insignificant," say Veterans Administration spokesmen, at least on the surface. Only two of about 28,000 Dallas Vietnam veterans are undergoing treatment for addiction at the Dallas VA Hospital.

Hospital officials say they re ceive about two calls a day from families of veterans regarding narcotics problems. Most of these are referred to special agencies.

The VA GI Drug Abuse Treatment Center in Houston is one of the special agencies, but it has only 20 beds and is impractical for outpatient care for veterans who live outside Houston, said Dr. Alex D. Polorny. head of the Houston center.

"It's rather insignificant" in Dallas in the light of what you read, said Dr. Thomas McDowell, chief of staff at the Dallas Veterans Hospital.

The Dallas hospital is not equipped to hande drug treatment, said Dr. McDowell, and those reated generally are addicts found in neuro-psychiatric

"As far as I know, none have come in asking to be cured of narcotic addiction," said Dr. McDowell.

Half Million GM Corvairs On Road Cited As Unstable

WASHINGTON (AP) - Consumer advocate Ralph Nader produced Saturday what he said are more General Motors tests showing a half million Corvairs still on the road are unstable. Nader renewed his charges that the firm has misled the courts and Congress by covering up the tests.

Nader said the latest documents, which he forwarded to a Senate subcommittee headed by Sen. Abraham Ribicoff, D-Conn., showed General Motors tried to make the Corvair more stable and did make some changes, even though it had denied making any changes on the suspension systems of the early models.

GM said in a statement that it has cooperated fully with inquiries by Ribicoff and the Department of Transportation.

"From a preliminary study of Ralph Nader's latest letter to Sen. Ribicoff, it appears that much of the information accompanying the letter has heretofore been furnished to the subcommittee staff by General Motors," a firm spokesman








though the condition of your own checkbook might suggest that figures do lie, most people still need a little additional reminder from time to time that PLEASE COME BACK faith in numbers is often mis-

The most recent illustration concerns the jobless figures. In June, the government said, the unemployment rate plunged to 5.6 per cent from 6.2 per cent of the civilian labor force. Significant? No. While the figures did change,

the condition might not have changed a bit. That, in fact, is BLONDIE the view of a growing number economists. Next month, they say, watch for a return to 6 per cent or more,

The sharp change in percentages has been described as nothing but an error. Not only that, but the error was entered into knowingly, a case of the formula being more sacred than the purpose.

As Argus Research Corp. explains it, the monthly survey of jobless is taken every month the week containing the 12th. The 12th fell on a Saturday in June.

This is significant. Don't try to understand it without a calendar, but the fact that the 12th fell on a Saturday meant that the survey was taken at its very earliest. Had it fallen on a Monday it would have meant a late survey.

It meant also that the youngsters were still in school and consequently not an active part of the labor force. They'll be counted in July though. And what seemed like encouaging news could be discouraging in-

While this is a glaring example of distortion by the numbers, there are dozens of other examples in constant use. Quite often individuals who know better participate in the delu-

In the Commerce Department lobby there is a "clock" that ticks off the growth in Gross National Product. Officials know that, absurdly, it counts inflation as output, but they choose to ignore it.

Late last year the clock reached \$1 trillion, which called for an official ceremony in which the strength of the economy was extolled. An impression was permitted to persist that the GNP had doubled from \$447 billion in 1958.

An impression only. Not only might there be little truth in numbers, there may be an absence of strength too.

In constant dollars, not counting inflation, that \$1 trillion shrinks to \$750 billion. Try selling a ham that way, all puffed up with injected water, and the government inspectors might try to send you to jail.










