

We live in a day when the Christian faith is under . fire. Never before in history has the the attack been quite so fierce or is the truth of revelation the enemy's devices so subtle and devastating, for not only is the truth of revelation assailed from without the churches, but it is assailed even more tragically from within. There are those who profess the Name of Christ who nevertheless undermine the structure of belief and would if they could, demolish the entire edifice. The faith once delivered to the saints is being tested to the foundations.

Not unnaturally there are those who, like Eli of old, tremble for the ark of God. They wonder whether the Church can survive the mortal storm.
