Legislature, Smith Trying To Reach **Agreement On Bill**

By ROLAND LINDSEY AUSTIN (UPI) - Gov. Preston Smith' refusal to sign a pending multi-million dollar tax package apparently will save Texas taxpayers \$280 million if a compromise now being worked on is acceptable to the governor.

Speaker Gus Mutscher and Lt. Gov. Ben Barnes have agreed to delete a controversial two cent per gallon increase in the gasoline tax from the tax package in hopes Smith will sign it without forcing the legislature to reopen its tax deliberations.

Both Barnes and Mutscher are apparently concerned any reopening of tax debate will lead to a fight, led by Senate liberals, to tack a corporate income tax onto the tax package,

But it is uncertain whether Mutscher and Barnes are also willing to give Smith the broad authority he seeks to transfer funds from one agency to anoth-
