

Council Urges U.S. To Adopt Tough Trade Plan

WASHINGTON (AP) - A presidential commission has urged the United States maintain a tough-Yankee-trader stance in an effort to tear down barriers to its exports and move the world toward complete free trade within 25 years.

In addition, the 27-member Commission on International Trade and Investment Policy told President Nixon Monday in a three-volume report, the nation must embark on a vigorous export drive during the next decade with the use of government incentives.

The commission called for international negotiations "at the highest political level" aimed at moving the world toward free trade, tearing down trade barriers, achieving monetary reform and working for a "more equitable sharing" of defense costs by other nations.
