

Canada Tightens Security Around Kremlin Leader

mier Alexei N. Kosygin embarked today on another round of diplomatic tourism, the prospect was that heckling and harassment would follow him across Canada and would rub much of the sheen from whatever Soviet policy had hoped to

achieve from his trip. Nobody was injured and nobody was more than momentarily upset by the attack Monday on the Soviet premier's person by an angry young Hungarian and by the demonstrations by minority groups which feel oppressed by the Russians.

However, the attack on Kosnstead on Soviet domination of him by demonstrating Ukrainians and Jews managed to swing the spotlight away from Kosygin's phrases about peace in the world and concentrate it instead on Soviet domination of ethnic minorities in the Soviet Union and Eastern Eruope. More demonstrations are promised on Kosygin's route across

Kosygin's obvious mission is to spread the word that the Sothe world and is seeking to achieve this through such devices as a European security conference and mutual American and Soviet reduction of forces in foreign countries.

Kosygin's trip just as obviously is part of a larger pattern of Soviet diplomacy. It has



The Detroit Pistons' star was in a light mood Monday considering that Friday an operation was needed to repair a detached retina, an injury suffered Oct. 5 in an exhibition

f "It may be months before know what Mr. Bing's residual vision will be in the eye," said Dr. Morton S. Cox, University of Michigan eye surgeon "Even though the reattachment was successful, some irreversible tissue damage occurs on injury.

But doctors said the reattached retina is "intact and stabilized."


