Feat Accomplished Fully Automatically

MOSCOW (UPI) - Two unmanned Soviet spaceships accomplished history's second fully automatic link-up in orbit today, according to the Soviet news agency Tass.

The agency said the link-up, a vital operation in the preparation of future Soviet manned voyages to the moon, was accomplished by Cosmo satellites Number 212, launched Sunday, and 213, launched today.






