

The Uneducated Jobless Unable To Fill Needs

By KENNETH R. CLARK EDINBURG, Tex. (UPI) -In the Lower Rio Grande Valley, between 6,000 and 7,000 persons are listed as out of work, yet in more than a dozen fields, employers are clamoring for

Fred Garcia, of the Texas Education Agency's migrant division in Edinburg, said Monday the difference is education. He also said that unless more money to foot that education bill turns up in federal channels, the people and the jobs are not soon likely to get together.

Virtually all of the Valley's unemployed are among the ranks of agricultural workers. Those who migrate-following crops around the nation-come off the unemployment lists periodically, but many remain at home taking their chances on whatever crops will give them a brief livelihood, between welfare doles and unemployment checks.

None of them can take advantage of the many positions open to stenographers, welders, cashiers, medical technicians, auto mechanics, and a dozen others for whom demand now

Garcia said some big strides have been taken in the field of migrant education in South Texas, but that the Valley itself has been caught in a financial bottleneck which threatens the migrant worker's faith in the system.

He said the procedure is to enroll Mexican-American adults in a basic education program geared to raise their education at least to a sixth grade equivalent, and to make them literate in English.

After that, several specialized training programs are available-ranging from James Connally Tech at Harlingen, to the Ling - Temco - Vought program which already has moved some 400 families north to Fort Worth to work on the company's assembly line.

Clifford Sees New Possibility Of War in Korea

WASHINGTON (UPI) -Defense Secretary Clark M. Clifford has warned that continued acts of aggression by North Korea could lead to a resumption of the Korean War.

Clifford, in a joint statement with South Korean Defense Minister Choi Young-hi, said "recent acts of provocation by North Korea constitute serious threat to the peace and security of this area.'

"Such acts, if persisted in, can lead to renewed hostilities,' the two defense leaders said.

The South Korean and American defense officials "noted serious concern" the increased military threat to South Korea from the North.

ABC-TV is the smallest of the three major commercial television networks, and has never been able to compete successfully in the ratings with CBS TV's Walter Cronkite ir NBC TV's Huntley-Brinkley Report. It therefore seems a very

wise decision for ABC-7V to go its own way rather than continuing to knock heads with its larger competitors on their own terms.

This doesn't mean tiat ABC TV is discarding all of the standard evening niws approach. News is still that the evening report is all alout-and it's not at all a matter of one guest columnist after mother.

Variety of Commenators There will probable be a collection of 20 or 25 of them for ABC-TV to call on but the chances are that mot of the individuals will be ued only occasionally, depending on how the news goes.

In brief, it is simply pleasit to note that television growing up-and more powers all the networks as they finar shake off the absurd shacks that have retarded them long.


