

Celanese Potential Tied Monday Disorder Is Quelled By Officials

WASHINGTON (UPI) - Slum areas of the nation's capital, where crowds of Negroes were dispersed by police and national guardsmen with tear gas late Monday, were quiet today and authorities began reducing the security force.

Mindful of the lessons of last April's widespread rioting and arson, officials moved swiftly when disorder broke out Monday evening.

A curfew was clamped on the city at 9 p.m. EDT and 1,500 police and 1,400 national guards-men were deployed in the area of principal tension.



Presumably, in the end, the autos would belong to these individuals although actually paid for with government funds.

Training and Instruction are influenced by example than they are by coercion or reason.

Training and instruction perand the familiarity with a certain amount of information. Reading and writing and arithmetic, typing and driving a car are examples of skills that can be had through training.

However not even instruction and training can be free-that is, at no cost. Of course parents can give children clothes their children's training and inpay the full cost, somebody else

But even parents cannot give their children an education. They can try to stimulate their children to want to learn to think or they can encourage them to learn a trade so that they can be useful to their fellow man. But the child must do the work himself to acquire either an education or training.

In Albert Jay Nock's "Theory of Education in the United States" he wrote, "So in gradually building up an expression of our idea of education, we find the distinction drawn by M. Renan especially useful. Perhaps we are not fully aware of the extent to which instruction and education are accepted as being esentially the same thing. I think you would find, if you looked into it, for instance, that all the formal qualifications for a teacher's position rest on this understanding. A candidate is certificated is he not? merely as having been exposed satisfactorily to a certain kind of instruction for a certain length of time, and therefore he is assumed eligible to a position which we will agree that only an educated person should fill. Yet he may not be at all an educated person, but only an instruct-




