Court Decision Favors Gas Firm At 'Turkey Creek

AMARILLO -Pioneer Nat ural Gas Company has been notified that the United States Court of Appeals, Fifth Circuit, in a decision dated July 3 of 1968, upheld the Company's position that employees at Pioneer's Turkey Creek Plant, between Borger and Amarilo did not constitute an appropriate unit for the purpose of Union bargaining. In handing down the decision, the Court negated an unfair labor practice allega-tion filed by the Regional Director of the National Labor Re-

lations Board. On April 1, 1965, the International Union of Operating Engineers petitioned Natural Gas Company to bargain for its Turkey Creek Plant and asked for an election of employees at the plants. The hearing on the Union's petition

was held on August 18 of 1965. Pioneer contended that the unit the Union had asked to represent was not appropriate, holding to its original contention that only a systemwide unit could be considered appropriate in the case of Pioneer's

employees. . At the hearing the Regional Director held that the unit was appropriate and ordered Pioneer to bargain with the Operating Engineers. In order to get the case before the United States Court of Civil Appeals for determination, Pioneer maintained its position that the unit was not appropriate and refused to bargain with the Union. Following this stand by the Company, the NLRB filed an unfair labor practice against Pioneer on November 29, 1965.

On June 1, 1967, the National Labor Relations Board filed a petition for enforcement of its order with the United States Court of appeals, Fifth Circuit, The case was argued before the Court on May 2, 1968, in Fort






