CAPE KENNEDY (UPI) - A Titan 3C rocket packing the Air Force's mightest space kick was launched today carrying eight radio relay satellites to close the gaps in the Pentagon's direct link with Vietnam.

miniature bottle provision. Rep. Bill Clayton of Springlake, a member of the subcommittee which combined the governor's bill and Cory's liquor reform measure and the leader of the drys, said he never saw the subcommittee substitute bill until it was presented to the full committee.

Met Only Once "We met with them one time and were told what was in the bill the subcommittee was going to report out," Clayton said. While the governor's liquor proposal faced a close fight in committee hearings Wednesday, his \$127.2 million tax bill also ran into problems in its first committee hearing.

Farm Bureau Requests Equal Time On Show

Bureau official says that the National Broadcasting Company was unjust to the American farmer during the May 17 "Today" television show, and asked that equal time be given to a spokesman for farmers.

The show "left the American public with the idea that farm workers in the Lower Rio Grande Valley are starved by unmerciful, inhumane employers," Sidney Dean, president of the Farm Bureau, said in a letter to the Federal Communications Commission in Washington.

Dean said that Cesar Chavez, director of the United Farm Workers Organizing Committee, appeared on the television program and left the impression that workers in the Valley "are paid starvation wages, as low s 40 cents an hour.

He said fruit and vegetable growers pay the \$1.15 per hour federal minimum wage. A telegram was sent May 17 to the "Today" Show, requesting equal time for farmers, but


