





Moreover, the closing of the canal indefinitely means that the day for repayment of Egypt's wast debt to Moscow has once again had to be postponed to a distant future.

Altogether the conclusion might be that while the Russians strengthened their overall political position in the Middle East since the Arab-Israel war, this achievement was bought at an ominously high cost in purely economic terms.

For the present then, Russia seems to be anxious for a breathing spell in the Middle East What a fair peace settlement should involve will be argued for many months. As in the case of Vietnam, the diplomatic bargaining will be long and difficult.

But should peace finally come to the Middle East it will be a clear victory for President Johnson's patient diplomacy and his persistent efforts to ease the points of conflict between United States and Rus-
