with their subject and with their style. In a literal sense. they would be performers trying to please a reritica
atutience., instad of opilitial on otables explaining ariew
point to grateful admirers enjoying a special privilege. Formerly, it was a privilege to hear an important poli-
tician make a speech. Today, thanks to amplifying appa-
ratus and rado, millins listen where only hundreds for-
merly were abo, merly were able to hear. Consequently, more is expected
of speaker. Furthermore, many listenera are so familiar
with various points of view that mere repetition does not with various points of view that mere repetition does not
suffice to hold their attention,
It is questionable whether orators ever can recapture
 kinds of speeches on all kinds of subjects. Public speaking
no longer is exclusie; it is as common as the jazz band
which precedes it, the radio playlet which follows it and the comedian who competes with it.
Throughout the conventions of the major parties there
was an undercurrent of criticism and resentment runing wasant the poutritent oratory which was the main business
