

Looking ahead to the second half, the outlook is less promising. Indeed, business prospects are a bit on the murky side. For example, a big question mark lodges with the steel industry's labor negotiations. If a prolonged strike should ensue, industrial activity in the fourth quarter could be hurt badly. Making it more difficult to assess the business picture is the degree to which the surtax will restrain retail trade. In addition, international conditions contain many imponder-

But assuming a prolonged steel labor tie-up can be averted, it is likely that business can hold in a high range. However. it will not display the vitality which marked the first half year. Stockpiling of steel will no longer provide an uplift to industrial activity, and even if a serious steel strike is averted, there must be a peroid of inventory liquidation.
