## **Once-Forgotten** Humphrey Leads Democratic Race

By STEVEN BERSTE CHICAGO (UPI)-For the first time in his long political career, Hubert Horatio Humphrey is the anointed one of the Democratic' party establish-

The role of underdog and maverick which he once played is now all-but-forgotten history. After all these years and all those campaigns the vice president finds himself at last The choice of his party's lower establishment which used to fight him has provided him this time with the organization, the money, and most important, the delegate committments to win the big prize of U.S. politics.

Humphrey, now 57, first broke upon the national political scene in 1948. He divided his party and won the long-lasting hate of the South at the 1948 Democratic National Convention by leading a fight for a stronger civil rights plank. When it was adopted, southern delegates walked out of the convention and set up the States Rights

**Brash Reputation** 

Humphrey's reputation for brashness grew when he entered the Senate in 1949 and, in an early speech, dared to criticize Sen, Harry F ,Byrd, D-Va., an old ane respected member of the Senate "club."

On that occasion, other senators showed their disdain for the freshman's bravado by leaving him without an aud-

But the longer Humphrey stayed in the Senate, the more aceptance he won. After several years, with the help of Yyndon Johnson, he was finally taken into the inntr circle. As more years passed, he earned a reputation for hard work and inteligence and an apparently insatiable appetite for speech-

In 1956, Humphrey conducted his first flirtation with national ofice by seeking the vice presidential nomination, but it went to Sen. Estes Kefauver of

Four years later, Humphrey went after first place on the ticket. He challenged Sen. John F. Kennedy of Massachusetts in the Wisconsin and West Virginia primaries-and lost.

Back in the Senate, he was elected Democratic whip and in 1964 reached what he called the climax of his career-passage of the strongest civil rights bill since Reconstruction.

Picked Humphrey In the summer of that yearafter months of suspense-President Johnson chose Humphrey as his running-mate and

they crushed Republican conten-

der Barry Goldwater. Humphrey appeared destined to spend eight years in the obscurity of the vice-presidency until Johnson startled the nation last March 31 with his announcement that he would not run again. The vice president waited a decent interval, then threw his hat in the ring. He quickly won the endorsement of most labor leaders, the backing of well-heeled business tycoons, even the support of his old enemies in the South. He lost, however, the support of the liberal Americans for Democratic Action (ADA), of which he was a founder. Other liberals who once regarded him as a hero also turned their backs on his candidacy because of his identification with the adminis-

Humphrey was an active vice president, heading up civil rights, space, youth opportunity, travel, equal employment and other programs. He also traveled extensively to the Far East, Europe and Africa.



Other extremists take as their model a young Colombian priest, Camilo Torres, who was killed while leading leftist guerrillas in the country playing host to the Pope.

#### Formal Petition

Less extreme liberal churchmen already have drawn up a formal petition requesting the Pope to take a stand against imperialism in the continent.

For the conservtives, tens of thousands of Brazilians, Argentines, Chilenas and Uruguayans have si gned petitions to the Pope asking him to take measures to halt alleged leftist subversion of the church.

The working paper for the Episcopal Conference already has come under conservative fire. It describes a Latin America dominated economically by foreign capital and pelitically by small, selfish oligarchies where the only choice is between peaceful or violent change.

The document says there is a "temptation to violence" in Latin America and to remain passive in face of the problems of social and economic development would be a "great sin."
