

LONDON (UPI)-A bare 14 months have elapsed since the Arab-Israeli six day war. Yet Middle East peace still hangs precariously by a thread.

Just how precarious is that peace is spotlighted by the continuous outbreaks of fighting along the Israeli-Jordan border. Onre again, Israeli Planes have bombed what Israel says was an Arab guerrilla camp.

Once again, Israeli troops have pursued a guerrilla band into Jordanain artillery positions. The incidents were ominously

reminiscent of the Israeli raid against Alquilya in Jordan in October, 1956, just before the Sinai Campaign; the attack on Samu in Jordan in November, 1966, that paved the way for the six day war and the major daylong battle between Israeli and Jordanian forces in February , in which Israeli Jets were called into action to blast Jordanian artillery positions.

Equally dangerous incidents repeatedly have ruptured the uneasy cease-fire across the Suez Canal between Israel and the United Arab Republic.

Yet, totally different reasons are behind the cease-fire breachs on the Jordan and Suez Canal fronts.

Jordan is the weakest of Israel's Arab neighbors. It is on Jordanian territory that the socalled Palestine Liberation Army (PLA) has established bases for guerrilla raids into Israel and the Israeli-occupied

west bank of the Jordan River. The guerrilla army's members are mostly Palestinian Arabs and Syrians, nor Jordamians. All indications are that they have set up bases on Jordanian territory in defiance of King Hussein, who is said to have little or no control over

From these bases they have carried out repeated raids into Isral and the west bank. Israli reprisals have become increasingly violent.
