1946 Tax Payments Set New IIS Record
WASHINGTON, Feb. 14. (AP)—American taxpayers last year deposited in Uncle Sam's till the largest peacetime tax payment in history — \$38,640,057,860 — and the third highest on record.
The 1946 collections, the Bureau of Internal Revenue reported today, were exceeded only during the war years of 1945 and 1944. In 1945, the bureau said, payments totaled \$43,352,715,821 and in 1944, collections amounted to \$42,125,986,550. All figures were for calendar years.
As usual, heavily populated New York led all states and the territory of Hawaii by paying in \$7,730,385,969 during the 1946 calendar year. The empire state was followed among the leaders by Illinois, California and Pennsylvania in that order.

Funds Foster Fight Forest Fires
AUSTIN, Feb. 14. (AP)—Gov. Beauford H. Jester today requested emergency appropriation of \$30,588 to help the Texas forest service fight forest fires in East Texas.
"My investigation reveals that 55,000 acres of timber land have been destroyed since January 1 and there is apparently no prospect of these fires being brought under control in the near future," the governor said.
Jester said the fire hazard was greatly increased by the severe ice storm which covered 12 East Texas counties the first of January. "Broken tops, limbs, and fallen trees have blocked approximately 600 miles of fire roads."

Red Cross Helped In Nine Disasters
AUSTIN, Feb. 14. (AP)—The American Red Cross helped 8,834 families who were made homeless in need by nine disasters in 26 Texas counties during 1946, Gov. Beauford H. Jester reported.
Commenting on the annual report of the Texas Red Cross, Jester said that the San Antonio river flood last September, affecting 5,847 families, was the worst Texas disaster of the year.
Tornadoes last May in nine counties affected 2,438 families and the East Texas tornado in January, 574 families.

Japanese Premier Opens New Diet
TOKYO, Feb. 14. (AP)—Premier Shigeru Yoshida, in an address opening the 92nd session of the Diet, called upon the Japanese today to unite in solving urgent problems of reconstruction and inflation. He expressed hope that the peace treaty would be signed on a "day not far off."
The premier asserted that Japan would receive more favorable treatment from the Allies if, in the interim, the Japanese achieved unity and displayed courage in meeting their problems.

Crying Babies Help Cause Plane Mishaps
WASHINGTON, Feb. 14. (AP)—Family fights, crying babies, and tailors' bills were cited before the House Commerce committee as contributing factors to plane disasters.
Jerome Lederer, assistant manager for the Aero Insurance Underwriters of New York City, said they cause fatigue and emotional disturbances among pilots, with resulting carelessness or recklessness.

Red Cross Fund Drive To Start

Looking for a rapid-fire campaign in two phases, Red Cross roll call officials, under Henry D. Norris, are making medicine for the opening thrust for a \$9,950 quota next week.
Schedule calls for launching the special gifts part of the annual fund effort on Feb. 20, followed by the general roll call on March 1.
Roy Reeder, heading up the special gifts department, has selected team captains and they in turn are organizing into five-worker units. It is set up on such a basis that contacts will be limited to five for any one worker, said Reeder.
Response thus far has been so encouraging that leaders anticipate that quick work on the special gifts will assure the success of the campaign without delay.
Special attention will be called to the Howard-Glasscock chapter emphasis on and record in home service not only during recent years, but particularly the past year. This means more stress upon working directly with problems which are the charge of the local chapter.

American Marine Is Shot In China
PEIPING, Feb. 14. (AP)—An American Marine was shot and killed by an unidentified Chinese last night soon after he emerged from a downtown theater. He was an enlisted man, from Hq. Second Battalion, 5th Marine Regt.
Reports received by the Marine Corps, which is investigating the incident, said the Marine, in company with two friends, was walking along a street when the Chinese approached, drew a gun and shot. The Marine died 20 minutes later. The killer escaped down a side street.

To Protect Filipinos
MANILA, Feb. 14. (AP)—President Roxas marked for urgent action today a bill now before the Philippine congress which would protect citizenship rights of Filipinos who join US armed forces.

Hess To Serve Life In Prison Cell 13

BERLIN, Feb. 14. (AP)—Rudolf Hess, it was learned today, is destined to serve out the remainder of his life sentence in Spandau Prison's Cell No. 13.
The brooding former No. 2 deputy fuhrer and the six-other major Nazi war criminals sentenced to prison are expected to be flown here from Nuernberg within the next three weeks, or as soon as the prison's outer alarm system is completed.
There they will go into virtually solitary confinement and become their allied keepers hope-forgotten men.

POLICE OFFICERS TRAP THEMSELVES
LOS ANGELES, Feb. 14. (AP)—Six police officers, answering a radio call of a burglar in a market, followed his trail inside—through a high window and over three milk crates.
They found their man, his arms loaded with liquor, but discovered they couldn't retreat the way they came because another policeman, left outside, had driven the combination patrol car and stepladder out of shouting range. And all the doors were padlocked from the outside.
They telephoned the owner, who gratefully came down and opened the door.

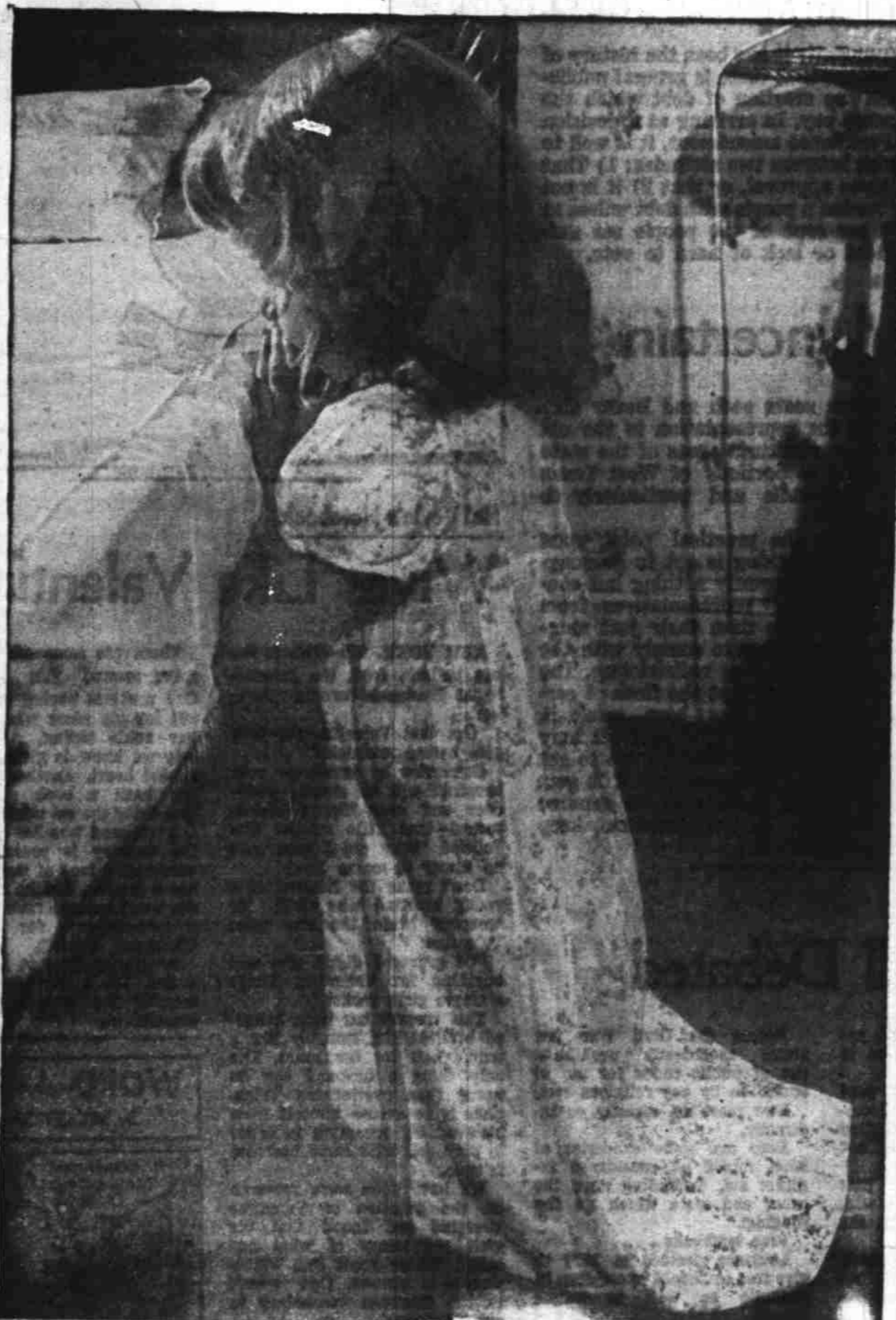
PRAYER releases spiritual power. It may not always remove the burden or sorrow, but it gives power to bear and overcome.
