

Jaycees Urge Flag Respect

Muleshoe Jaycee President Johnny St. Clair has issued a reminder to all local businessmen who are flying a flag daily in remembrance of the 50 hostages currently being held by militants in Iran.

Although the Jaycee's

flag chairman and his crew initially put out the flags to be flown daily, they have asked that the businesses with the flags remove the

flags each evening and put them out again in the mornings.

It was explained again, that federal law does not allow flags to be out at night, or in wet and stormy weather.

The Jaycee president has asked that all persons who are leaving their flags out overnight, please remove them from the flag-holder and put them inside at night.

There is also another danger in leaving the flags outside overnight. In at least one instance, a flag was removed from a holder and taken from the city.

A surprised Texas Tech student found he had been traced to his home in Midland, after a private citizen reported seeing a

flag taken by a young man driving a car with the same license as the vehicle registered to the student.

He did agree to return the flag to Muleshoe right away after he received the telephone call from City Police Lt. Jerry Hicks.

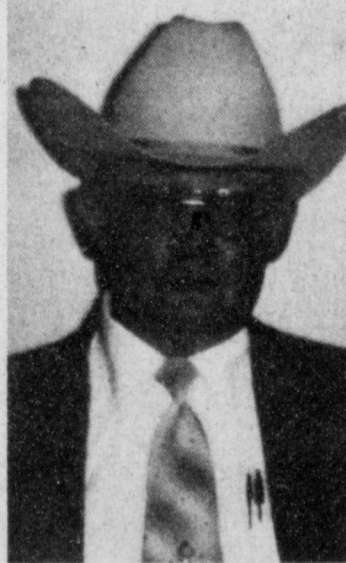
He was born at Leveland and moved to Bailey County with his parents while still an infant.

Car Crashes During Chase In Muleshoe

As a brief, high wind ushered a new cold front through the area early Friday night, Muleshoe City Police also found a brief flurry of activity that stretched through most of the night on Friday.

As City Police Lt. Jerry Hicks and Officer Hal Bynum were just thinking about going home from their second shift duties, the duo found themselves in a police chase on city streets.

Although the officers originally planned to stop a vehicle for a routine traffic violation, they found themselves winding through the streets in a zig-zag fashion from West American Blvd. to Main Street.

When the pursued vehicle reached the south end of Main Street, the young driver failed to negotiate the curve and went into a skid on the street still damp from an earlier shower.

The driver of the vehicle was jailed on multi-traffic violations.

Later, while on routine patrol, City Officer Mike Shewmake stopped a car for another violation, and parents of five young persons were called to the Bailey County Law Enforcement Center to take their children home.

Back on the streets on patrol again, Officer Shewmake found a broken window in a local business, and the owner was summoned to the business to allow the officer to check for a possible burglary.

accident just southwest of the Muleshoe City Limits on a dead end road. The driver of the vehicle received slight injuries in the accident.

Mrs. Denison is the former Davy Jean Anderson, daughter of the late David S. Anderson, and the granddaughter of the late George Allen Anderson.

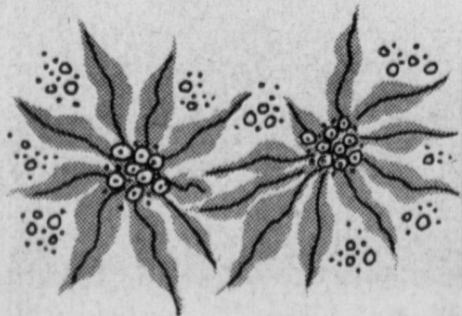
An early pioneer family of Bailey County, the Andersons purchased and operated what was known as the Anderson Ranch, southwest of Muleshoe.

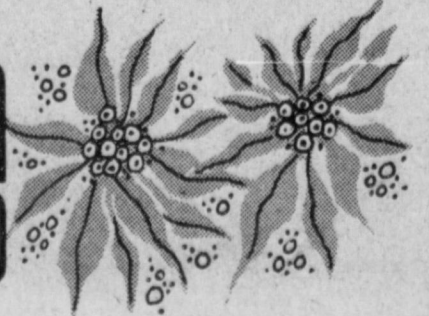

AUSTIN—As of January 1 crime victims and citizens

who suffer personal injury or death in the prevention of crime or the apprehension of criminals may be reimbursed for pain and loss of income as a result of action taken by the 66th Legislature.

Under the new Crime Victims Compensation Act, any Texas resident damaged by a crime in Texas after January 1 may be eligible for compensation if he or she files a claim with the Industrial Accident Board within 180 days of the crime. The claimant must also have reported the crime to authorities within 72 hours to be eligible for compensation.

ceive up to a maximum of \$50,000. This maximum sum is broken down as a maximum of \$150 per week, plus \$30 a week for each child, not to exceed \$75. Medical and funeral expenses are also included. Victims of family crimes, such as battered spouses and abused children, and victims of automobile accidents are excluded from the act.

The program is not funded from taxpayer dollars, but rather from fines imposed on the offenders themselves. Starting September 1, persons convicted of a felony have been required to pay a \$15 surcharge, and persons convicted of a misdemeanor involving \$200 or more have been required to pay a \$10 surcharge. These charges are expected to raise approximately \$2.2 million for the fiscal year 1980.

This new law will place the responsibility of crime's consequences where it rightfully belongs — on the criminal. But more importantly, it will help alleviate some of the financial hardships placed on the innocent victims of crime. Victims of crime have been neglected for too long. Perhaps this is one way the State can repay victims for some measures of the suffering they have no choice but to endure.

Henry Albert Ellis, 88, died Tuesday in the hospital at Brownfield where he had been hospitalized for one week. Ellis was a former resident of Bailey County.

He was born at Decatur on January 31, 1891. He was united in marriage to Clara Neutzler Muller on December 7, 1935 at Muleshoe. At the time of his death, he was living in Tatum, N.M. where he had been a resident since 1957.

Ellis was a veteran of World War I, having served in the U. S. Army. He was also a member of the First Baptist Church in Tatum and a member of the Lovington Barracks.

Services were conducted on Thursday at 2 p.m. in the First Baptist Church at Tatum. Officiating were Gene North, pastor of the church and Wayne Perry. Burial was in the Baileyboro cemetery.

He is survived by his wife, Clara; a son, A. J. Ellis, Tombean, Tex., two step-daughters, Mrs. Lenora Richardson, McDonald, N.M. and Mrs. Evelyn Slater, Lubbock; one sister, Mrs. Arvie Hinson, Rush Springs, Okla.; 11 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.

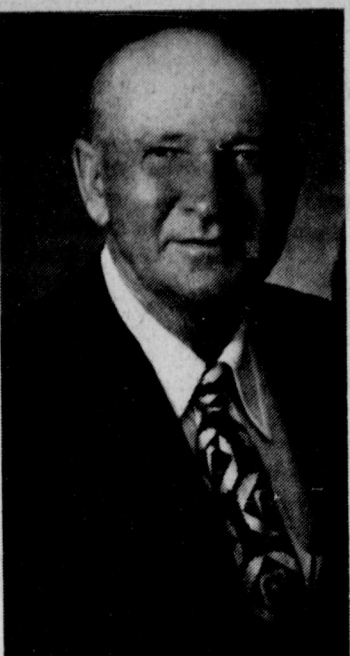
Ralph Ethridge Funeral Held Here Friday

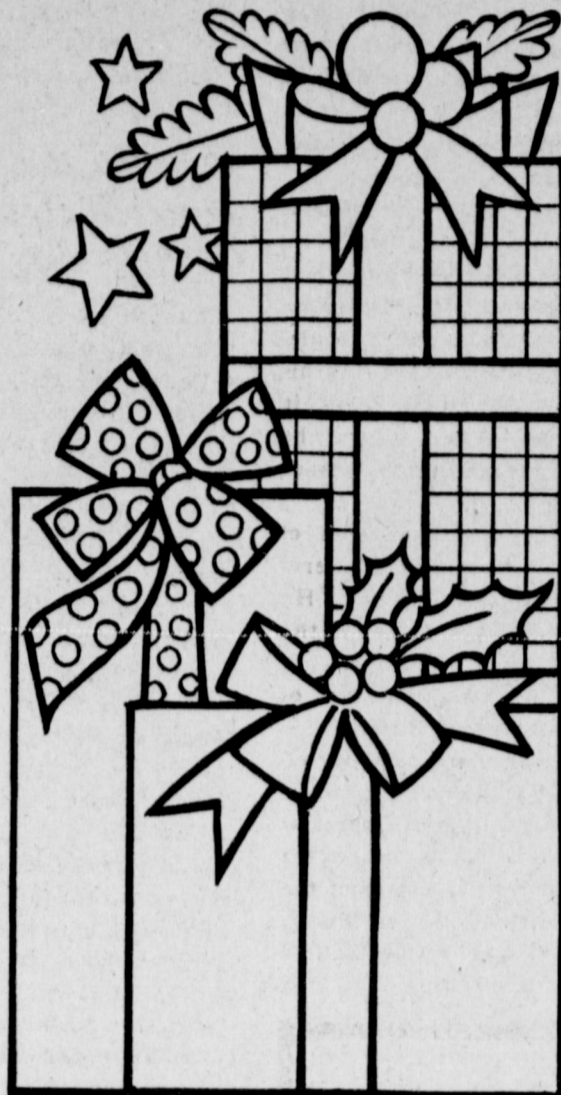
"In that case, let's all go down to the Workshop and help out Jingle-Jo and all her Elves! What we need now is more Elf-power!"

Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh . . . Gifts For a King

"They (the wise men) saw the young child with Mary his mother, and . . . presented unto him gifts; gold, frankincense, and myrrh."

Matthew 2:11 St. Matthew tells us that the Wise Men selected these exotic treasures, above all others, as their special offerings to the baby Jesus. They were the first Christmas gifts of all.

The gifts brought by the Three Kings all had magical associations: gold for the sun mystery, frankincense as the smoke-maker, and myrrh, the healer. The Wise Men were also believed to have had occult powers.

The Magi, kneeling in tribute, express the love and awe Christ evokes in all who believe in Him. The Bible names the gifts . . . gold, frankincense and myrrh. Each has its obvious worth; there are rich, symbolic meanings as well.

Church scholars consider the gold to mean love or Christ as King of the World; the frankincense, prayer or Christ as the King of Heaven; the myrrh, suffering or a symbol of Christ's approaching sacrifice.

The Bible does not mention containers for the gifts, artists over the centuries have created them. A casket

holds the gold coins, a vessel for the frankincense, an urn for the myrrh.

Today we easily recognize the value of the gold, but we are not as familiar with the value of frankincense and myrrh. These two aromatic resins, used in making incense, were very costly at the time of the Birth

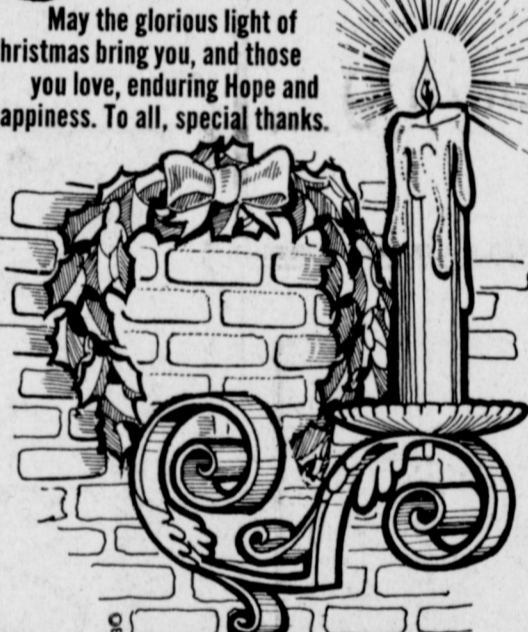
of Christ. To this day they are used at many Christian altars.

An old poem which expressed the ancient belief

that "incense owns a deity neighbor" is further evidence that frankincense and myrrh were worthy gifts for the Prince of Peace.

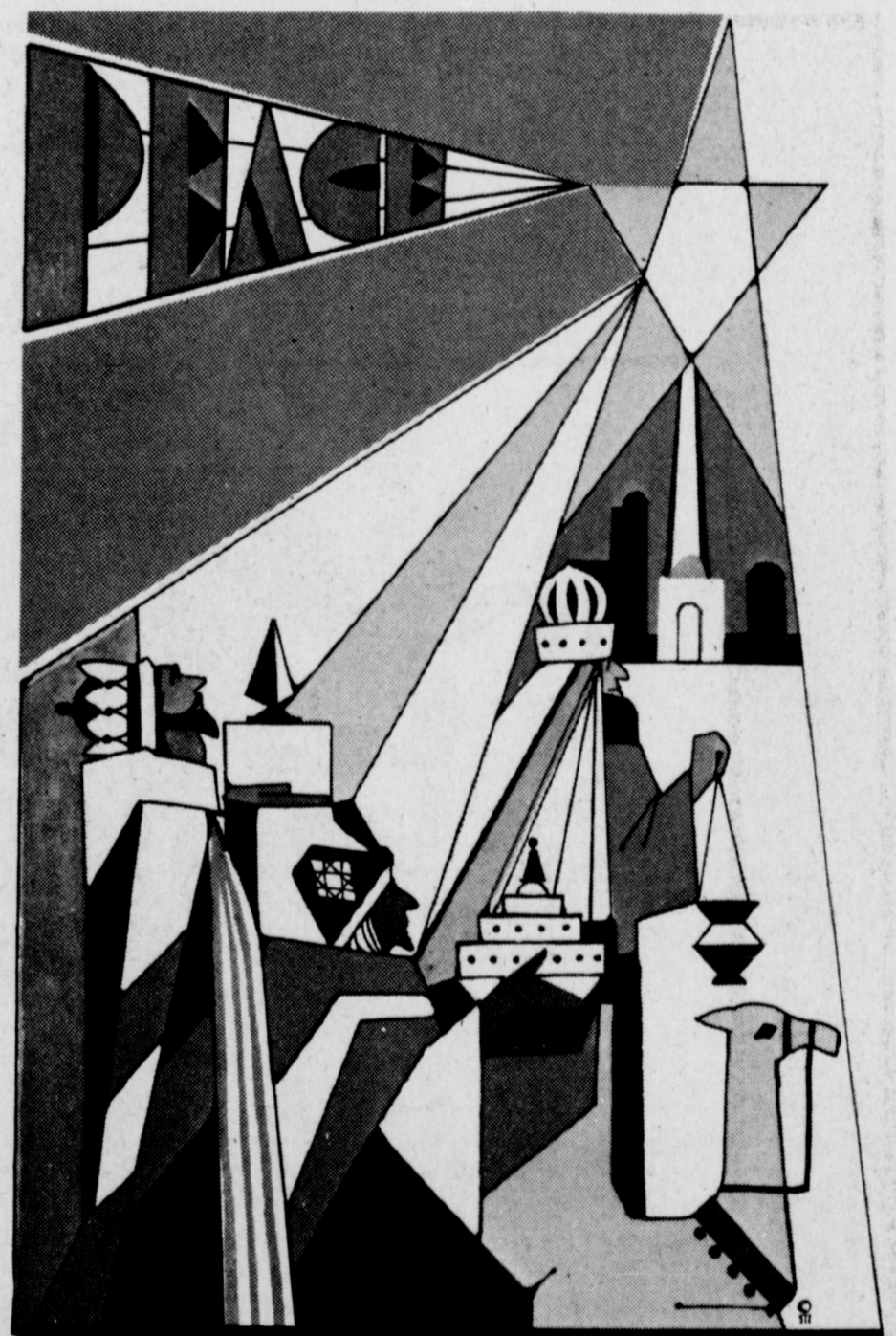

Making Old Fashioned, Spicy Gingerbread Men Cookies...

One of the special and most delicious customs at Christmas is snappy, spicy gingerbread men cookies. Since the whole family loves them, why not have the whole family join together in a happy baking spree? Here's our quick 'n' easy recipe:

Gingerbread Cookies:
 1 cup packed brown sugar
 3 eggs
 1 cup margarine or butter, softened
 1 1/4 cups molasses
 1 teaspoon salt
 1 tablespoon baking soda
 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
 1 teaspoon ground allspice
 1 teaspoon ground cloves
 1 teaspoon ground ginger
 3 cups all-purpose flour plus 5-6 cups (to be used later)
 8" gingerbread man cookie cutter

Early in day; In a large bowl with mixer at low

speed, beat first 11 ingredients, until just mixed, constantly scraping bowl with rubber spatula. Increasing speed to medium, beat 2 more minutes, scraping occasionally. Using a wooden spoon, stir additional 5 to 6 cups of flour into dough, to make it stiff. Divide dough in half and wrap in plastic wrap. Dough can be used immediately or refrigerated for up to two days.

Preheat oven to 350° F. On a lightly floured surface roll half the dough with a lightly floured rolling pin, until 1/8" thick. With gingerbread man cookie cutter, cut as many cookies as possible. Using a pancake turner, arrange cookies on lightly greased cookie sheet, handling carefully. Bake 12 minutes until cookie edges are firm; loosen cookies



from sheet and remove to wire rack to cool.

Reroll scraps and using remaining dough, repeat.

Using white frosting, prepared or your own home made favorite, and raisins, decorate gingerbread men.

Recipe makes about 2 dozen cookies.

Fortunately, we have music to enhance the holidays, and it's been present since that very first Christmas, when the heavenly host performed their extraordinary "Christmas Concert" for some awestruck shepherds in the hills near Bethlehem.

Since that night, there have been countless carols written, cantatas composed, and popular songs written about Christmas.

Everyone has a holiday preference and chances are, you'll be hearing your own particular musical favorite sometime this season, whether it's piped into your local department store or performed by the church choir.

Some Christmas carols have famous composers such as Adolphe Adam (*O Holy Night*) and Felix Mendelssohn (*Hark! The Herald Angels Sing*).

SEASON'S GREETINGS

Today's Christmas Tree, And How It Came to Be!

Why do we have Christmas trees? The custom can be traced to the early pagan days of Northern Europe. Natives used holly, evergreen, and mistletoe to decorate their homes at mid-winter. The greens were thought to encourage the cohabitation of friendly spirits during the winter solstice.

European Christians enjoyed the color and fragrance of the greens and continued the practice long after the pagan significance was forgotten.

Pageant plays as we know them today developed from the miracle plays of the Middle Ages. These programs depicted religious stories and moral themes. Because they were performed in churches, scenery

was kept to a minimum. The entire garden of Eden was represented by a fir tree with apples tied upon it. Soon, it became known as the Paradise Tree. Ironically, this present-day symbol of the Nativity originated as a representation of the Fall of Man. In 1450, when secular plays were banned, the symbolic tree was brought into the home as an object lesson. The evergreen symbolized morality, and the apples, sin. Later, cookies and sweets were hung as a reminder of the "sweetness"

of the Savior's Redemption. Decorative treats were expanded to include candy canes and popcorn chains. Later, the moralistic character of the tree gradually faded as glittering ornaments and figures took the place of apples and wafers.

Legend attributes the first lighted tree to Martin Luther's 16th century attempt to recreate the beautiful, snowy evergreens of Germany. Candles were originally used on such trees and were later replaced by electric facsimiles. Through the years, lighting designs have been revised to today's present varieties.

The tradition of decorating Christmas trees in the United States began in 1776 during the American Revolution, when Hessian soldiers brought the custom from their native Germany. A short while later, in 1804, a Christmas tree was mentioned as part of a holiday celebration at Fort Dearborn, Illinois. With little objection, the traditional tree became an integral part of a 19th century Christmas and the practice of decorating holiday trees has continued ever since. Today, more than two-thirds of American homes have a beautiful tree as part of their holiday decorations.

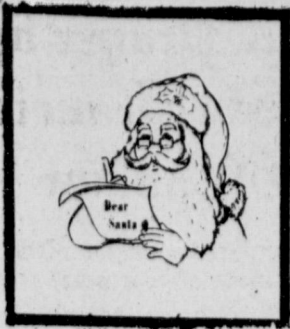

Letters To The Editor

In 1961 state government turned to the sales tax as a means of getting out of the property tax business.

The tax has proven to be a strong backbone for state government's financial operations. It can continue to be our strong suit -- so long as we don't abandon the state's right and ability to turn to it when needed.

But we will abandon that right and that ability if we let the cities, the schools and the counties saddle the sales tax with every increase and every new sales tax proposal they are making.

As Mike Kingston said in the Dallas Morning News, we would be facing the highest sales tax in the nation. I am enclosing a copy of Mr. Kingston's article.

Even if you ignore the schools and counties, a city

sales tax of three percent as proposed by the Texas Municipal League (along with the state's four and the transit authorities' one) would put us at eight percent - a number matched only by that financial genius New York City.

At that rate we lose forever the ability of the state to turn again to the sales tax, and we lose the ability of Texas business to compete with our neighboring states, the rest of the Sunbelt and all other major industrial states -- all of whom have lower sales taxes.

Should that come about, there is no doubt that we would ultimately be looking at a state income tax. It has already happened in 45 other states.

Our neighbor Louisiana is a good example. Louisiana's local governments depend on their three percent sales tax for 42 percent of their local tax income. By comparison, Texas cities get 8.8 percent of their local tax income from the sales tax. Hand-in-hand, the state of Louisiana has an income tax and leans on it for 19 percent of the state's tax income.

But, most of all, I can't believe the taxpayers of Texas are willing to take on such a drastic increase in the sales tax. Business pays some 58 percent of all sales tax and I don't believe the business com-

munity wants such a tremendous increase.

And I certainly don't believe that 350,000 people who collect the sales tax from their customers want any more responsibility in this area for the meager one percent handling fee they get.

The state can be a helpmate to the cities, but it can't be everyone's Sugar Daddy with the sales tax. There are other options open to the cities, hard though the decisions may be.

The sales tax may look like an easy way out, but it is a shortsighted solution. We would be trading a short-term benefit for a long-term damage in a state throttled with an income tax and unable to compete in the national marketplace.

DPS Predicts

The Department of Public Safety late last week estimated that 123 persons would be killed in motor vehicle mishaps during the forthcoming Christmas and New Year holiday periods.

DPS Director Wilson E. Speir estimated that 67 persons would be killed

during the Christmas holiday weekend and another 56 persons would be killed during the New Year holiday weekend. The DPS director said that counts are 102 hours long.

Speir added that the Christmas count started at 6 p.m. December 21 and continues until midnight December 25, while the New Year count starts at 6 p.m. December 28 and continues until midnight January 1.

Speir said that statewide traffic deaths are presently running about six percent ahead of the record pace of a year ago. Last year, there were 3,980 persons killed statewide in motor vehicle crashes.

At the end of preliminary holiday counts last year, 57 deaths were reported during the Christmas period and 39 during the New Year holidays.

Speir said all available DPS troopers would be on duty. State troopers and local officers will be working together to keep traffic moving safely. "I have asked our officers to place special emphasis on removing drunks and reckless drivers from Texas streets and highways," he added.

"We will continue to work with the news media to keep motorists posted on unusual traffic conditions and to advise them where and why serious holiday wrecks are occurring," Speir said.

Making Old Fashioned, Spicy Gingerbread Men Cookies.

One of the special and most delicious customs at Christmas is snappy, spicy gingerbread men cookies. Since the whole family loves them, why not have the

whole family join together in a happy baking spree? Here's our quick 'n' easy recipe:
Gingerbread Cookies:
1 cup packed brown sugar
3 eggs
1 cup margarine or butter, softened
1 1/4 cups molasses
1 teaspoon salt
1 tablespoon baking soda
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground allspice
1 teaspoon ground cloves
1 teaspoon ground ginger
3 cups all-purpose flour plus 5-6 cups (to be used later)
8" gingerbread man cookie cutter

Early in day: In a large bowl with mixer at low speed, beat first 11 ingredients, until just mixed, constantly scraping bowl with rubber spatula. Increasing speed to medium, beat 2 more minutes, scraping occasionally. Using a wooden spoon, stir additional 5 to 6 cups of flour into dough, to make it stiff. Divide dough in half and wrap in plastic wrap. Dough can be used immediately or refrigerated for up to two days.

Preheat oven to 350° F. On a lightly floured surface

roll half the dough with a lightly floured rolling pin, until 1/8" thick. With gingerbread man cookie cutter, cut as many cookies as possible. Using a pancake turner, arrange cookies on lightly greased cookie sheet, handling carefully. Bake 12 minutes until cookie edges are firm; loosen cookies from sheet and remove to wire rack to cool.

Re-roll scraps and using remaining dough, repeat.

Using white frosting, prepared or your own home made favorite, and raisins, decorate gingerbread men. Recipe makes about 2 dozen cookies.

The hanging of mistletoe is a practice derived from the British custom of the "Kissing Ball." This special ornament was made from evergreen branches and was hung in a passageway. A berry was removed each time a kiss was exchanged. Once all berries were removed, kissing ceased.

Decorative wreaths for doors and windows are traditions thought to have been inspired by the great Della Robbia family of Florence, Italy. This popular wreath pattern of fruit and foliage was originally made to resemble small, circular garlands, surrounding tiny figurines. Gradually, the round greens grew in size until ready to stand as art in themselves.

The practice of hanging Christmas stockings began in Southern Europe. Legend states that an old man was in despair because he had no money for his daughters' dowries. Saint Nicholas, hearing of the man's plight, dropped a bag of gold down the oldest's chimney. The gift traveled quickly and landed in a stocking, hung upon the mantle to dry.

The next year, friends and neighbors hung out their prettiest stockings in anticipation of the coming of the generous Saint. Today, the practice of hanging these picturesque socks remains one of the happiest of Christmas traditions.
