Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles. At the peak of the storm, O. C. Kirby, driver for the Loeffler-Green Supply Co., Oklahoma City, and Elliott, driver for the Moran Drilling Co., were driving their trucks along U. S. 64 near Hooker, Both trucks stalled in drifts about 21/2 miles east of Hooker. The drivers saw an automobile nearby, also stalled in the drifts. They forced their way through the blinding storm and opened the car door, hoping to find shelter.

Inside they found Mr. and Mrs. John Allen, prominent wheat farmers of Guymon. Apparently the exhaust pipe of their car as clogged by the drifts and carbon monoxide fumes were filling the car.

Kirby and Elliott dragged the couple from the car, reports said, and washed their faces with snow, hoping to revive them When that failed, they forced their way through the storm and drifts nearly a mile to a farm house. They saddled up two horses and went back and brought the Allens in to warmth and shelter. Sick for several hours after their experience, the couple was

On another filibuster front, Vandenberg proposed that the Senate change its rules to permit 90 percent of its members to force a vole any time on a national emergency measure. This wouldn't affect the civil

rights controversy, because at least 20 senators, more than 20 percent of its members, always oppose such proposals.

These homes contain two bedrooms and an average of 750 square feet of living space.

Although most homes now under construction are small, they are of high quality, containing brass and copper plumbing, min-eral wool insulation to reduce heating costs, large picture win-dows, efficient heating plants, and built-in cabinet space. Most of these houses considerably exceed minimum quality requirements demanded by the FHA when insuring loans. Builders point out that these

small homes provide adequate space for young families, compris-ing the bulk of the buying market today, and that the expansion attics are large enough to be finished later into two good-sized rooms. Anticipating this, most builders are constructing perma-nent stairways to the attic. Some




