On another filibuster front, Vandenberg proposed that the Senate change its rules to permit 90 percent of its members to force a vote any time on a national emergency measure.

This wouldn't affect the civil rights controversy, because at least 20 senators, more than 20 percent of its members, always oppose such proposals.

Ranchers Say Killing Stray Cattle Causes Hardships

WASHINGTON (AP)—Texas ranchers are complaining to the Agriculture Department that the killing of Mexican livestock which strays across the Rio Grande is hurting relations between residents of the American and Mexican borders.

B. T. Simms, chief of the Bureau of Animal Husbandry, told Senator Tom Connally of Texas that his bureau is investigating the complaints.

J. A. Guerra of Sierra Blanca and other Hudspeth County (Texas) ranchers have complained, Simms said.

Government range riders destroy the cattle as part of the campaign to prevent the spread of the foot and mouth disease into the United States.

According to the ranchers, 95 percent of the cattle are slain on a narrow strip of land on the American side of the river and lying between the channel and a fence erected by the U. S. government.

Simms said the cattlemen contend there is no need to kill cattle since they can't go farther into Texas unless they find a hole in the fence or force their way through it.

The Texans argue that the government slaughter practices cause hardship on many poor Mexican people. The range riders come from other sections of the country, the Texans say, and as "outsiders" do not care how many Mexican animals are killed.

The ranchers add that continuation of the killings are "very likely" to alter the friendly relations they have always had with their Mexican neighbors.

"We are aware of the fact that cattle crossing the American fence do come in contact with American cattle and perhaps should be killed," Simms quoted the ranchers as saying. "However, when they merely cross into this strip of unfenced land, they definitely should not be killed."

Simms told Connally that there has been a decline in Mexican cooperation with this country's ban against entry of livestock from Mexico.

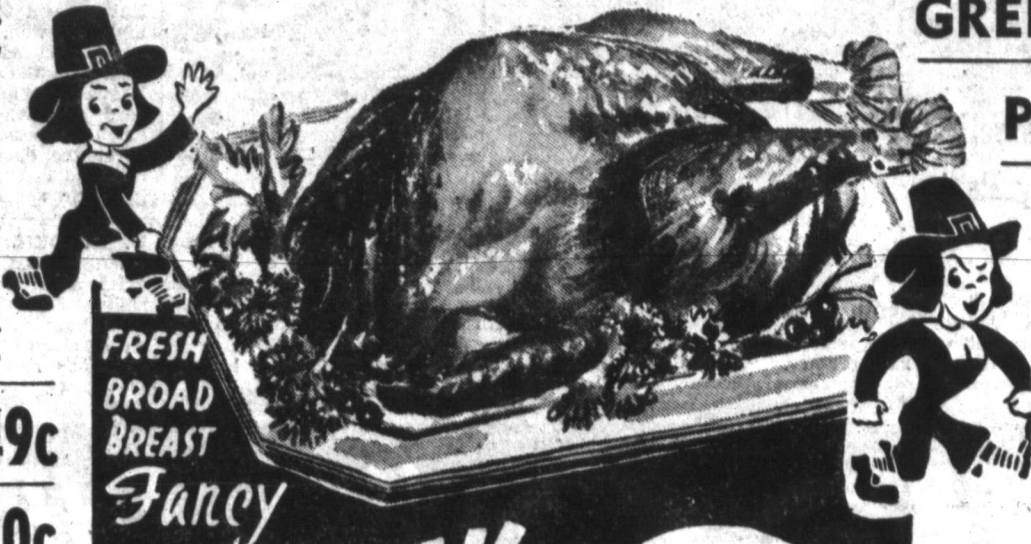

Winter Fuel Costs Can Be Cut Today

Mounting costs of fuel for home heating, and uncertainty of fuel supply, are making economy the watchword more than ever before in the operation of the home heating system in the coming winter months. Now is the time, before the bitter cold of winter sets in, to provide ever safe-guard possible against expensive waste of heat and inadequate comfort.

In older homes, adequate insulation usually will pay for itself in a few years in fuel savings. Careful examination by an expert should be made to check heat loss through walls, roof, windows and doors. Check the attic, for a full one-third of the heat loss in an unheated house usually occurs there. Then check the windows and doors for leaks throughout the home. Weather-stripping and storm windows will help stop heat loss at these points.

Tremendous waste, of course, occurs within the heating system itself if the system is old and run-down. If the budget permits, and if it is a real economy will pay for itself in actual savings effected—replace the old heating system with a completely new and modern one. In selecting a new system, don't choose one just because it is the cheapest for it may prove the most expensive to operate.

Above all, don't overlook the room heating outlets of the distribution system. If you heat with steam or hot water, much heat loss can be prevented by replacing old units with modern ones, which are not only more efficient in operation but more attractive decoratively. New convectors radiators are a popular modern replacement for antiquated cast-iron radiators. Convectors respond almost instantly to automatic controls and, in addition, can be equipped with manually-operated dampers to insure exact control of room temperatures. This aids in saving expensive fuel and provides greater comfort.

Automatic heating, by providing sensitive control of the heating system, is, of course, a valuable contribution to fuel economy. Give attention to the proper location of the thermostat within the home, so that it can permit the most sensitive response to temperature needs. As an additional economy, reduce temperatures 5 to 10 degrees during sleeping hours in mid weather. Such precaution can save 5 to 8 percent of the fuel. With convectors, the damper can be closed completely in bedrooms to cut off the flow of heated air without affecting temperatures in the other rooms of the home.

If the problem is acute, don't trust your own judgment completely. Call in a competent heating engineer. Oftentimes they can point out simple steps that you can take, at little expense, to increase comfort and conserve fuel.

Cheap Heating System Costs Much More in the Long Run

No matter how limited the budget for the new home, don't try to save by buying the cheapest heating system offered for your selection. This is the advice of today's leading heating engineers who say that, in too many cases, the "cheapest" heating system may prove to be the most expensive to operate.

In selecting heating equipment, both the original cost and the cost of operation should be kept in mind. Furthermore, decision should be made on the basis of the overall plans for the home. For example, the large distribution ducts of warm air systems may prohibit effective construction of a basement recreation room, home workshop or laundry because they occupy a headroom and other space which, with other type systems, can be utilized for other purposes. Also, from the standpoint of future house-keeping chores, selection must be on the basis of which system most closely approaches the ideal of "clean" heat.

Steam or hot water systems possess the advantage of by-passing direct heating contact with the basement heating source. In contrast to warm air systems which heat and circulate air directly from the furnace, steam and hot water systems circulate steam or hot water, free of the furnace's dust or dirt, to heating units in individual rooms. In older homes, these units were the familiar old cast-iron radiator, but in new homes today, and in many homes which are being modernized, new convectors are being used.

In convectors, the compact fin-type copper or aluminum heating unit is concealed completely within a streamlined cabinet. Air from the room to be heated enters the convector cabinet at the floor-line, is heated as it flows by natural convection through the

heating unit, and is discharged out the room through a grille opening at the top. Room air is circulated through convectors about three times an hour. Mild radiant heat from the convector cabinet provides a valuable plus benefit to the generous and easily controlled flow of convected heat. Careful selection of the heating system usually calls for expert guidance. Consult a competent heating engineer, and then weigh all the factors involved. Cut corners on your budget if necessary, but don't cut them at the expense of a truly reliable source of comfort-giving heat.

If you are planning to build, be sure to consider carefully the layout and the flooring of your bedrooms. That's the advice of home management experts, who say that often bedrooms are designed with too little attention to proper ventilation, or to other features which add comfort and convenience.

The experts suggest that a bedroom have at least one window on each of its walls. This arrangement permits adequate ventilation even when the door is closed. On the other hand, too many windows are undesirable since they usually make it impossible to place the bed against a solid wall space.

For ease in making the bed, a minimum of 18 inches of free space should be allowed on either side and at least two feet between the foot of the bed and the wall. More space is required between the bed and a dresser, dressing table or the like.

The floor should be of a durable type that will contribute to the attractiveness of the room, be easy to keep clean and be comfortable to walk on, even in cold weather. A material which most experts and home owners consider ideal is hardwood, such as oak. Completely exposed, or partially covered, a floor of gleaming oak blends well with any decorative plan, adding charm to the room. Oak flooring can be obtained in grades and styles to suit almost any preference.

Window Curtains Enhance Interior
Tasteful curtain treatment adds much to the interior beauty of the home. Interior designers say it is essential that the windows harmonize with the furnishings and that one should never overdress them. Any look of skiminess should be avoided.

Builders Turn To Small Home Of High Quality

In view of a marked slowdown in sales of homes costing above \$10,000, builders throughout the country are concentrating on small houses of four rooms to sell for \$9,000 or less.

This is revealed in a spot check by the Construction Research Bureau of New York, clearing house for building information, showing that basementless houses with expansion attics are being produced in almost one-third greater volume than a year ago. These homes contain two bedrooms and an average of 750 square feet of living space.

Although most homes now under construction are small, they are of high quality, containing brass and copper plumbing, mineral wool insulation to reduce heating costs, large picture windows, efficient heating plants, and built-in cabinet space. Most of these houses considerably exceed minimum quality requirements demanded by the FHA when insuring loans.

Builders point out that these small homes provide adequate space for young families, comprising the bulk of the buying market today, and that the expansion attics are large enough to be finished later into two good-sized rooms. Anticipating this, most builders are constructing permanent stairways to the attic. Some are roughing-in plumbing pipes

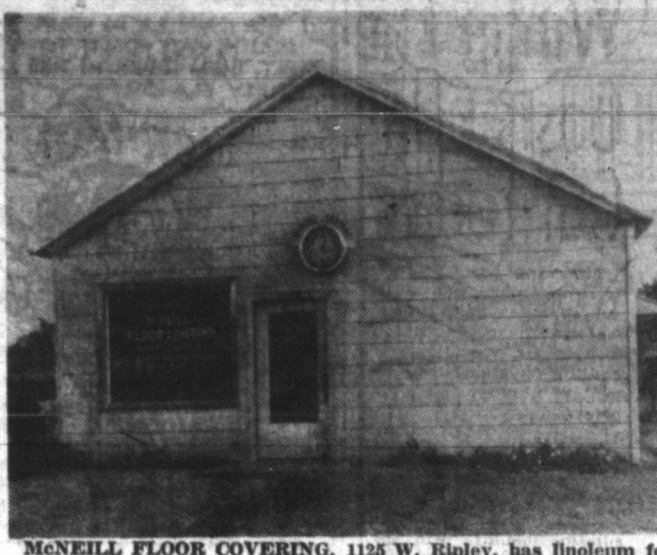
