
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

PAMPA — The City of Pampa's landfill will be closed Thursday and Friday for the Christmas holiday. Residential and commercial routes will resume normal operations on Monday, Dec. 28. The landfill will resume normal operations on Saturday, Dec. 26 and will be open from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. The recycling center in Hobart Street Park will be closed on Friday but will reopen on Saturday, Dec. 26 from 9 a.m. until 6 p.m.

# Water level survey underway

Now through February, the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District is conducting its annual water level measurement program throughout the dis-

Winter water level measurements help not only the district, with vital data information for its records, but it also helps the general public, farmers, and ranchers.

Winter water level measurements are gathered by using an E-line or a steel tape down the casing of the well. An E-line consists of a long measuring tape with a battery-powered circuit running through it. When this short is submerged into water, a buzzer will sound on the reel telling the operator that it has found the water level.

The steel tape is used to much the same

way. The tape is covered with a blue or yellow chalk for four to five feet. This end is then inserted into the casing. The operator must know what the previous depth was, in order to pull the right amount of tape into the well. The tape is then pulled back out of the well. The operator then finds the area where the chalk has been washed off the steel tape. From this reading, the operator can then calculate the water level.

Now that you are more familiar with the procedure, here are some benefits that

come from the gathering of this data. The PGWCD will be able to make saturated thickness maps that are useful in locating the amount of water under the ground in a particular place.

Many farmers and ranchers use these maps to locate the best places to drill irrigation wells or windmills. Other maps prepared from this data are water level and depletion maps. The water level maps tell us where the present water level is located. The depletion maps tell us how many feet the water table has risen or fall-

en, in the last year. The depletion maps we use to determine the amount of depletion are the same maps used for those landowners who are eligible for depletion allowance on their income tax returns.

This is not a new program as the PGWCD has been measuring water levels on many different wells throughout the District. On some wells, as much as 40 years worth of data has been collected. The main goal is to be able to provide useful and accurate information to farmers, ranchers, or anyone who may have a

## **Jordan Unit** under lockdown

## Texas prisons searched for weapons, contraband

Inmates at dozens of Texas prison units including the Jordan Unit in Pampa, remained confined to their cells today, as guards searched for weapons and other smuggled items.

The lockdown began Monday at 106 state prison, jail and substance-abuse units and could last all week at some larger institutions, said Larry Todd, a spokesman for the Texas Department of Criminal

"Lockdowns are simply a management tool for maintaining control of items inside the units. It is also a matter of security," Todd said. "After the lockdown, we'll try to get an inventory of what was found, and there will be some cases where no contraband is located." In Pampa, Senior Warden Fernando DeLaRosa said the entire premises is being searched while inmates are confined to their cells. (See PRISONS, Page 5)

Because computer usage in Pampa 15th has grown to about 600 networked computers—with more expected in the future — officials say the time has come for the district to hire a networking technolo-



## More bad news for Clinton

his defenders got more bad news today as a moderate New York Republican who previously opposed removing Clinton from office abruptly reversed course.

"The issue is about principle, not politics," Rep. Jack Quinn said in announcing he will now vote for impeachment. "My decision is based on the clear evidence of perjury and obstruction of justice as presented by the House Judiciary Committee in the last week."

Joining Quinn was fellow New York Rep. John McHugh, who impeachable offense. announced today he will vote to articles of impeachment sent to Committee last week.

The White House has been counting on some 20 moderate Republicans, mostly in the Northeast, to buck their party and provide enough votes to block impeachment. But as Clinton returned home from a Middle East peace mission, the number of potential GOP defectors was quickly dwindling.

More than a half dozen on the target list came out for impeachment on Monday alone, including Republican Reps. Frank LoBiondo of New Jersey, Jim Walsh of New York, and Fred Upton of Michigan.

Clinton could take some small comfort in the advice of the man he defeated for re-election in 1996. Former Sen. Bob Dole proposed in an op-ed article in The New York Times today that Congress end the impeachment battle this year by passing a joint resolution of Congress to censure Clinton. ## Chicago firing faulty weapon

■ A city's lawsuit against gun manufacturers takes dead aim on constitutional processes.

We knew it wouldn't be long before politicians, smelling victory in state and federal lawsuits against tobacco manufacturers, would target other legal products. The lawsuit filed recently by Chicago officials against 38 gun manufacturers, dealers and distributors clearly shows which industry will be the nation's next villain du jour.

Amid much hype about the greed of gun makers, Chicago Mayor Richard Daley announced the suit, which seeks \$433 million in expenses the city and Cook County supposedly incurred since 1994 as the result of gun violence. Officials contend the gun industry — banned from selling handguns within the city limits — saturates outlying suburbs knowing that Chicago's gang members and criminals will go there to buy

The 74-page lawsuit "is written as a novel for the purpose of anti-handgun propaganda," said Bruce Jennings, distributor of Bryco Arms, a California gun manufacturer named in the Chicago lawsuit. As Jennings sees it, the Chicago action and a lawsuit filed against gun makers by New Orleans several weeks ago are intended to bankrupt legitimate companies by imposing on them massive legal costs. Bryco's litigation costs in battling such suits, he said, already are enormous.

Calling the lawsuit "tremendously malicious," New York University professor David Kopel said that Illinois already requires gun buyers to have an identification number with their address on it. It is unlikely, then, for the gun companies to have targeted Chicago criminals because the city's residents could not gain the necessary paperwork to buy firearms from

According to the lawsuit, police officers posing as inner-city gang-hangers were able to purchase weapons even though they made comments to dealers about using the guns for gang-related activities.

If that's so, then the authorities could have charged the stores under existing laws, on a case-by-case basis, Kopel said. But that's not what this legal action is about. Because the Illinois Legislature refused to pass the kind of restrictive gun control laws that Daley supports, the city is trying an "end run around the democratic process," he explained.

Northwestern University Law School professor Daniel Polsby calls the lawsuits a "racket with legal niceties beside the point." He said Daley is in cahoots with other cities, many of which are planning similar lawsuits, and gun-control groups to drive many gun manufacturers and distributors out of business

As troubling as government lawsuits against tobacco companies may be, these legal attacks on the firearms industry are even worse. That's because tobacco has few positive attributes, whereas firearms have many important benefits, John Lott Jr., a fellow at the University of Chicago Law School and author of "More Guns, Less Crime," said.

Various national surveys have shown that individuals use guns to protect themselves more than 2 million times each year compared to the half-million times they are used annually in the commission of a crime, he said. By focusing only on the costs of guns and not their benefits, Chicago and other cities pursuing anti-gun lawsuits are dooming many of their citizens to become future crime victims.

# stranger in a strange land

For three years, journalist Patricia Hersch immersed herself in the lives of eight Virginia teenagers. The result is "A Tribe Apart," a rare peek into the scary, unsupervised and threatening world we have created for adolescents in America.

Hersch, a writer for The Washington Post who lives in Reston, the town she writes about, begins by noticing that this comfortable, planned community is essentially empty of families from morning to evening. "By 8:30 a.m., neighborhoods stand still and silent, hollow monuments to family life." At 3 p.m., the school busses pull up and discharge their cargo of teenagers (the younger children are in after-school day care). "Keys in hand, they open doors all over the community. Then, the doors shut. It's their world now. With the exception of a few lone outposts where adults await their return, nobody's home but the kids."

Parents imagine that teenagers prefer to be left alone. The "generation gap" immortalized during the late 1960s has achieved conventional wisdom status, and most adults simply expect that adolescence will be a time when their children shudder to be seen with them.

Hersch doesn't buy it. The eight kids she followed for three years are not a scientific sample, but they seem to be a cross section of families in Reston, Va. There are children of divorce and remarriage, wholesome kids who are lucky enough to have involved, affectionate moms and dads, and fringe kids, who look normal on the outside but are engaged in highly destructive behaviors.

The absence of parents from the lives of many of

come from solid, intact homes. Jessica, a happy 13year-old, befriends Rachel and rapidly discovers that Rachel's parents are really cool. They allow their daughter to smoke pot or at least seem amused when they discover that she is high. And they buy her birth control pills. Jessica's mother, who thinks a nice outing for the girls would be ice skating followed by hot chocolate, lacks the selfconfidence to judge Rachel's parents harshly.

Though a good student and happy participant in church activities, Jessica, like all teenagers, is eager to be older. The illicit world of adolescence exerts a powerful attraction. She finds that among her school friends, there are parents of 15-year-olds who make "beer runs" for their kids - presumably on the assumption that they are preventing drunk and underage driving. She finds that those who graduate from eighth grade are pretty much expected to indulge in heavy drinking and drug

taking as a normal form of "fun." The parties these kids attend sound like some-

Thirteen and 14-year-olds get so drunk that they vomit everywhere. Alcohol so loosens inhibitions that pairs grope one another in full view. Meanwhile, other drunk young girls are raped in spare bedrooms.

Where are the parents?

There are some tales of livid adults returning the next morning to find their homes trashed. But the party circuit simply continues somewhere else.

Violence and senseless destruction are themes that run through adolescent life like a red thread in a white garment. Every now and then, all of the kids, not just those from "dysfunctional" homes, will rampage through a school, breaking windows, smashing computers and upending tables. Even the honor students destroy.

A few of the parents got a glimpse of the amoral world they've bequeathed their kids when they showed up at Ethical Decision Making Day at the high school. For the first time, many of the adults learned, to their horror, that most of the high school kids have no use for honor, honesty or even the sanctity of human life (though they are quite tender toward animals). They cloak as realism what is otherwise known as selfishness and immorality. A survey in the school paper found that 90 percent of students admitted cheating on tests. This is consistent, Hersch notes, with national surveys.

Reston is a lovely, quiet suburban town - on the outside. What Hersch has revealed, and not just about Reston but about America, is that the job of civilizing our youngsters has not been contracted these children has an effect even on those who thing out of the debaucheries of ancient Rome. out - it has been abandoned.

# Pakistan faced with hard reality

ISLAMABAD - Pakistan's capital was planned and built from scratch in the 1960s, and its leafy residential neighborhoods, unclogged boulevards and sleek modern architecture make it a slightly artificial refuge from the teeming streets and noisy bazaars that define other South Asian cities. But no one should worry that the country's leaders suffer from a shortage of reality. They find it pressing relentlessly against them wherever they turn.

Pakistan's lot wouldn't inspire envy anywhere. It has a host of internal troubles that are common in the developing world — widespread poverty, sectarian violence, a literacy rate of only 38 percent, crushing foreign debt and a history of political instability. Added to those are the challenges from outside its borders, to which Pakistan's new nuclear arsenal is not really an answer.

Geography is destiny, and Pakistan's location on the Indian subcontinent was a bad omen from the start. On one side lies its old enemy, India, with a population seven times larger and ambitions to be the next superpower. On the other is Afghanistan, whose 1979 invasion by the Soviet Union and subsequent civil war assured Pakistan a continuing stream of refugees and an abundance. of AK-47s. In addition, the Taliban regime in Kabul inspires fundamentalists here who regard the "Islamic republic" that governs Pakistan as entirely too tolerant.

Few people miss the Cold War, but most of the ones who do can probably be found here. In the superpower competition, India gravitated toward the Soviet Union, which meant the United States took pains to cultivate close ties with Pakistan. The Nixon administration also needed the

prochement with China, India's rival and thereore Pakistan's friend.

After the Soviets invaded Afghanistan, Pakistan was seen as a vital outpost of anti-communism. Washington sent mountains of military and economic aid despite the government's distressing efforts to acquire nuclear weapons. Relations between the two governments were especially warm during the Reagan administration, which was willing to overlook a lot in order to thwart Soviet expansion.

But the evil empire collapsed, and Washington decided its marriage of convenience was no longer convenient. In 1990, sanctions were imposed on Islamabad for its nuclear program, and additional ones followed this year when the government responded in kind to Índia's nuclear

Pakistan's problem is the reverse of Mexico's plight, which has been summarized as "so far from God, so close to the United States. Whatever its connection with Allah, Pakistan's remoteness has made it a dispensable ally.

The consequence of its beleaguered position is that elected officials and opinion-makers tend to Islamabad government to facilitate its historic rap- alternate between exaggerated fears and implau-

sible hopes. The exaggerated fears are of India, which is frequently described here as a voracious expansionist power and even likened to Nazi Germany. Whatever India's sins, and they are not scarce, they fall well short of the caricatures that warp political discussion in Pakistan. The paranoia blinds political leaders to the fact that when you live next to a giant, it is in your interest to actively pursue peace with him.

The implausible hopes center on Washington, which many Pakistani leaders seem to regard still as a potential savior. Recently, Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif, who visited Washington recently, said he hoped to "remove all kinds of misunderstandings with the Clinton administration and have good relations similar to those that existed in the 1960s." The News International, a national English-language daily, immediately advised him that "interstate relations cannot be built on nostal-

One perennial dream is that the United States will intervene in the dispute over Kashmir, where Indian and Pakistani troops regularly trade artillery barrages and India is suppressing an insurgency aided, it claims, by its Muslim neighbor. Pakistan wants President Clinton to mobilize the world to force India to let Kashmiris vote on which country to be part of. But that scenario is about as likely as the United States letting Texas secede, and the Pakistani obsession with it serves no purpose but to sidetrack more modest options.

Modest options may seem inadequate for Pakistan, whose oversized problems feed a desire for solutions to match. But a country so shortchanged by history and circumstance shouldn't neglect opportunities for making progress, even in baby steps.

The best offensive player in Class 1A is Tenaha's Chavis McCollister — again.



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## White House running out of options to sway House vote

WASHINGTON (AP) - Running out of time and Minority Leader Dick Gephardt's team told the options, White House advisers said Monday they are increasingly pessimistic about President Clinton's prospects of avoiding impeachment in the

"It's like a tidal wave moving against him," said Democratic consultant Harold Ickes, though he held out hope the tide could be reversed.

Several other advisers inside and outside the White House complained that the president has made matters worse for himself with ill-advised statements. They said Clinton, who has survived many career-threatening scrapes, is surprisingly tone deaf to his GOP critics and unusually reluctant to turn advice into action.

Still, top White House officials and leading Democrats put Clinton's chances in the House at 50-50. White House chief of staff John Podesta remindprevailed in tough fights before. And House thought impeachment was impossible.

White House there were enough moderate Republicans still undecided to give the president

"Nobody here expects this to be easy, but people feel very strongly ... that we're going to continue looking for a compromise in this to avoid getting the country bogged down in a Senate trial next year," said White House spokesman Barry Toiv.

Privately, some of Toiv's colleagues said they were resigned to seeing Clinton impeached by the House. The mood soured through the day, as moderate Republican Christopher Shays of Connecticut signaled a possible shift in his anti-impeachment position and rumors circulated that more Democrats might bolt.

Some thought the gloomy tone might simply be an overreaction to what one aide called a delayed sense ed worried aides at one meeting that their boss has of reality: Until recently, most Clinton supporters

There also was the possibility of a White House unless they asked to meet with him. It was a small strategy to sound alarms across the country by lowering expectations. In October, Clinton partisans warned that 75 or more Democrats were poised to approve impeachment proceedings, knowing the actual vote would be less than half that.

But more than ever, aides were questioning the president's political judgment.

He apologized to the country again Friday and said he would accept "censure and rebuke." Some advisers said they felt the address was contrived and

He said Sunday he would never admit to perjury, a concession some Republicans say he must make for them to vote against impeachment. Many supporters agree that admitting to perjury could backfire politically and legally, but they said Clinton had been advised to at least concede that reasonable peo-

ple could conclude that he didn't tell the truth. He ruled out personally lobbying lawmakers

but telling point. To the president's longtime supporters, those who have watched him secure narrow egislative victories in Washington and Arkansas, it was a shock to hear Clinton give away one of his most potent political weapon — his one-on-one lobbying skills.

Clinton could still address the public or Congress in a last-ditch speech.

And an intensive campaign by labor, minority and other Democratic constituencies in the districts of key moderate Republicans may yet pay off.

Some advisers, against the advice of Democrats in Congress, want him to go on the attack and accuse Republicans of defying the public's desire for censure. Press secretary Joe Lockhart signaled a tougher White House line during the president's Middle East trip Monday, saying the impeachment drive was engineered by GOP leaders "who made it their mission in life to remove the president."
