



### **ALL GOOD THINGS**

THE following is a dessert which will be wholesome for the children: Fig ice Cream Junket.

Make a custard with a quart of milk, a cupful of cream, a can of condensed milk, one tablespoonful of vatilla, a half cupful of augar, and one crushed junket tablet dissolved in a tablespoonful of cold water. Warm the milk to lukewarm and mix all the ingredients; let stand in a warm place until thick. When cold, freeze, and when partly frozen add a half pound of chopped figs, which have been cooked with one half cupful of sugar and three tablespoonfuls of orange Juice. Finish freezing.

Fig lee Cream.

Scald one quart of milk, add three tenspoonfuls of cornstarch mixed with a little cold milk and cook until thick. Cook slowly lifteen minutes. Beat the yolks of four eggs, add a half teaspoonful of salt and one half cupful Mr maple strup; bent into the hot mixtwo cupfuls of hot cream and let chill; add one tenspoonful of vanilla and begin to freeze. When half Prozen add one-half bound of chopped figs cooked until tender in boiling water, then mix with half a cupful of maple strup, a little grated lemon

Flemish Carrots.

Cut prepared carrots into thin sinces and cook until tender in a little botting water stightly saited. For one pint of carrots, melt a tablespoonful of butter, add a cupful of chopped onton, and one-half tenspoonful of sugar. Cover and cook until yellow, add one cuptul of beef broth. Simmer twenty minutes and aprinkle with paraley.

Graham Cracker Cake. ### Find Ample Proof of Elephants in America

Scientists interested in the prehistoric animals that roamed the North American continent in times too remote to calculate offhand have now | and then resurrected from their beds of rock and debris the skeletons of mastodons, those atrange creatures akin to the elephant. That the elephant species was known to the civilizations of Central America not so many thousands of years ago seems to be proved conclusively by recent excavations made to Panama. A. Hyatt Verrill, writing in World's Work, describes the strange sculptures of an ancient people, dug from the volcanic soil of the little athmian republic showing the degree of artistic advancement achieved by that vanished race,

Perhaps the most interesting and remarkable find of all, writes Mr. Verure thoroughly elephantine in form and detail. Hitherto the so-called " 's chants" found in prehistoric (and hoosern) American ceramics and stone work have been generally accepted as conventionalized anthears of tapirs with exaggerated shouts. But in this case it is scarcely possible to account for the creature on this hypothesis, Not only is the body elephantine, but the large leaf-like ears could belong to no other known creature, whilesthe hind knees bend forward, a character peculiar to the elephant. It is stifficult to believe that any man unfamiliar with the elephant could have conventionalized a tapir or an anthear to the extent of adding broad fan-shaped ears and legs bending forward, white, as a final touch, the eventure in repre

OF THE many mystic qualities which were formerly supposed to pertain to amber its potency as a be about the only one which survives in popular superstition. But a belief in this quality persists with remarkable vitality and is defended by persons whom one would least suspect of such credulity. Henry Ward Beecher always carried about with him a string of amber beads to cure or to ward off his rheumatic attacks; and amber set as jewelry is still sold in London for the cure of this malady. Only a few years ago amber had s much more prominent place in therapeutics. In 1865 Rev. C. W. King, in his "Natural History of Precious Stones" wrote: "That the wearing of an amber necklace will keep off an attack of erysipelas has been proved by experiments beyond the possibility of a doubt." Oil of amber still has a place in the United States dispensa tory and perhaps there still exist some old-time doctors who use it medicinally.

The ancients, who attached mystic qualities to all sorts of precious and semi-precious stones, were not likely to neglect amber; that strange substance born of the sea and of the color of yellow sunlight. The Romans used to place in their mortuary urns pieces down to our own times. The reverance with which the ancients regarded amber was increased by the discovery of its electrical properties. The periwinkle is slow to become established but otherwise valuable. The honeysuckle becomes a troublesome post in rich soils and should not be used near cultivated areas as it soon outruns its bounds.

# WOOD PRODUCTS LOSS DECREASEI






