Peanuts Introduced As Food for Slaves Peanuts were introduced into $\begin{array}{ll}\text { virginiats during the early } & \text { introduced } \\ \text { dato }\end{array}$ aition, presumably by the slave
raders as food ar Peanuts were found in the anclent nummy graves in Peru by E. $\mathbf{G}$. squier exploring in 1877 , also by
W. E. Safford in 1887. This would seem to indicate that the peanut
is a native of the New World. a native of the New World.
During the early daya peanuts were grown largely in gardens and in small patches, and a fow were roasted and sold on the atreets
in the towns of Virginia and later in New York and other Eastern
cittes. Necessity for some crop that would yield a cash return caused he farmers of North Carolina and
virginia to plant peanuta as a regular farm crop tmmediately following the Civil War.
The peanut induatry in the United The peanut industry in the United
states is well distributed over the Southern states, but is carried on extensively in eastern Virginia,
North Carolina and Southern Geo rgla. The crop now occuples about
$1,000,000$ acres each year, the annual production amounting to ap-
proximately $750,000,000$ pounds.

reserve supply in her bones fin order to put it into the millk. This drain on the cow's body has a serious effect on her health, and ultimately
reduces her capacty for milk proreduces her capactiy for millk pro-
duetion and the bringing forth of normal, well developed off spring.
The assimilation of calctum from
from such calelum compounds as ground rock phosphate, ground lime
stone, and bone meal has been found stone, and bone meal has been found
to be much lower than that from etther alfalfs or timothy hay. If the diet of the miliking cow
contains sufficient assimable ealclum but not enough phosphorous, ahe will at first take enough phot-
phorous from the put tato the mills. This supgly therer, to soon used up, and then
the cow begins to take phosphorous from her bones. The chemitcal compositton of the bones being not oasily changed, when phosphor-
ous is taken from them calclum comes along with it in the propor-
tion of two parts by weight to one of phosphorous. Calectum coming
