



An attorney for Henry Watkins Skinner wrote a letter last week protesting District Attorney John Mann's release of DNA test results to local media and asking him to open the process and establish protocols for the testing.

The Pampa News received a faxed copy of the letter to Mann written by Douglas G. Robinson, a Washington, D.C., attorney. He is representing Skinner with appeals of his conviction for capital murder in the deaths of his girlfriend, Twila Busby, and her two sons, Elwin Caler and untested evidence in the mur-

The Washington attorney now criticizes the local DA's release of DNA test results that indicate Skinner's blood stained hair found in the murdered woman's hand. Robinson also wants to know what results were obtained from testing 14 other pieces of evidence reportedly sent to the lab.



Telephone calls to both Robinson's and Mann's offices were not returned by press time Saturday.

Mann previously told The News that he had received a preliminary report from Gene Screens, a private laboratory in Dallas, that indicated Skinner's blood was on hairs clutched in Busby's hand.

The DA said blood from two people was found on the hair samples - Busby's own and Skinners. At the time Mann spoke to The News, he said he had not received mitochondrial

# Holidays can also be season for more crime

After a relatively quiet October, Pampa police predict the holidays will bring an increase in assaults, traffic accidents, and burglaries. "The holidays are when we see an increase in assaults because of the partying," said Pampa Police Chief Charlie Morris.

Aggravated assaults dropped dramatically in October from eight reported in September to three, according to police records.

July 4 is usually high, and we see more around Thanksgiving and Christmas," Morris said. "The exception is Valentines and Easter. We don't see a lot of assaults then.

He said police are called to more domestic disturbances during the holidays, also.

Domestic disturbance calls decreased almost by half in October with 14 calls compared to 27 in September, police records show.....

These numbers are for calls only, and do not include calls where an offense occurred, explained Lt. John Goes. Domestic calls where offenses such as assault or disorderly conduct occurs are listed by

Morris warned local citizens to be careful of burglars and thieves who take advantage of the confusion and stress that often accompanies Christmas shopping. "As we get closer to the holidays we're going to see an increase in

forgeries, theft by check, credit card abuse and theft in general," the police chief predicted. (See **HOLIDAYS**, Page 2)

**Auditor: County's** financial status good

Tax rate must be kept up, he says

"The financial status of Gray County is very good as long as the tax rate is kept up," said Danny Bishop of Doshier, Pickens & Frances, PC, a firm of certified public accountants in Amarillo. He recommended to the commission they keep a rate which is the effective tax rate plus three percent.

Bishop made some recommendations recently to improve the county system when he presented the audit report of the county's financial statements to the Gray County Commissioners Court.

"The Commissioners' Court should review the fiscal year period in which the county operates," said Bishop. He said a change to a Sept. 30 year end would provide a better match to the operating cycle. "By this, we mean that it would match the collection cycle of the county's property taxes which begins in October of each year," he said.

hair was found in Busby's hand.

You must be aware, however, that the DNA results that you are selectively releasing to the press, and the conclusions you are asking the press to draw from them, are inconsistent with the evidence you presented at trial," Robinson wrote.

He said discovery of Skinner's blood on the hair contradicts Mann's trial summation where the DA said there was no blood evidence on the murder weapon because Skinner must have killed Busby first before injuring his hand trying to stab Randy Busby;

Robinson also said that if mitochondrial testing shows the hair to be Skinner's, it would "directly contradict" the state's crime lab witness who testified that a carpet is "really bad" about retaining hairs that have been dropped by persons living in the house, making such a result "of little eviden-

Mann was providing information "piecemeal" to the media, Robinson wrote, adding, "But the fact that the results released to date tend to undermine the State's case, but are being spun to create the opposite impression only underscores the need to

conduct the DNA testing under rules that assure

confidence in the results.

Testing of the previously untested evidence gathered in the triple murder seven years ago resulted from pressure placed on Mann following an investigation by a group of students from Northwestern University's Medill School of Journalism in

Chicago last spring.

"Here is a case where the physical evidence begs to be tested, to find out whether Hank Skinner deserves to be on death row or a free man," Protess: said in an Associated Press article last June.

Last summer, Mann, saying the students had never spoken with him during their study of the invited the journalism school's head, sor David Protess, to meet with him and go the facts of the case. Protess declined to meet with the local DA face-to-face.

Robinson closed the three-page missive by asking Mann to extend the "same courtesy" he had offered Protess "at least with regard to the DNA

testing that is now occurring.

He asked that Mann open the process by which the tests are being conducted, review with him the results obtained to date, and to establish "appropriate" protocols for completing the testing.

"Don't leave packages in your car where they can be seen. Don't leave anything of value in your vehicle," he said. "There's nothing between the person intent on theft but a window.

He recommended that all gifts and valuables be placed in the trunk.

"There's a lot that can be done to protect yourself," Morris said. "Keep your packages from being seen, even at home. Don't place the tree and packages in front of a window."

Morris suggested that persons shopping over the telephone or Internet to use care when giving credit card information. "Be sure your checks are secure," he added.

"This time of year is when we see an increase in daytime burglaries," the police chief added. An boost in burglaries is already apparent, police safe.

He said by adopting a new budget year period it would eliminate the need to defer the recognition of tax revenues as is currently done by the county. Bishop also said the county commission would have nine or 10 months of the current year's financial information when working on the budget instead of six or seven months.

Bishop also said at one time all taxing entities were on the calendar year system, but that most all had changed their operating year to Oct. 1- Sept. 30.

Precinct 2 County Commissioner Jim Greene expressed his concern about a hypothetical possibility of an outgoing official not submitting an appropriate budget during the budget process if the budget year was changed. He referred to the current method which provides the new budget year begins the same day as new officials are sworn-in, both on the first day of January.

County Judge Richard Peet said since commissioners court is responsible for approving the final budget that it would be the responsible party to guard against such incidents. "That is part of our checks and balance system," said Peet.

Recommendation was also made that the District Attorney's office maintain separate bank accounts for pending seizures and forfeited seizures.

Under the present system it is combined and Bishop said it makes it difficult to separate returned seizures and the actual forfeiture. He said expended forfeited seizures are what would be budgeted by the commissioners court.

"The forfeiture fund should be included in the General Ledger as should the D.A.R.E. Fund so that

they may be presented to the commissioners court and compared to budget," said Bishop. "If the court has no interest in reviewing these funds, then they probably could be unbudgeted funds."

Bishop also said during the audit report the firm became aware of matters involving internal controls and other accounting issues that the firm believes can be improved as well as strengthening the county's systems. He said that currently the county does not main-

tain accounting records for its property and equipment, and it is strong urged the county compile a list of its assets.

"It would best be accomplished by maintaining a detailed record of these assets which discloses a description; cost, date of acquisition and location of each asset," he said. He said this information would not only provide the court with a means of control and safeguards, but also the information necessary for insurance reporting, equipment operation and maintenance programs as well as capital expenditure programs.

Another suggestion was to include an accounting for the long-term liabilities of the county which would include capital lease obligations and accrued compensated absence costs, said Bishop

Other suggestions include changes in procedures of monthly bank reconciliation procedures in the tax assessor/collector's office. Also the accounting firm noted that social security and Medicare are not being withheld from the District Judge's payroll checks. He said that procedure has been corrected.

Bishop told the commissioners court the Gray County officials and employees were very helpful to him during his audit of the county.


# America: Losing the academic race

Here are just a few of the facts: One study asked middle-class black, white and Asian high school students what was the lowest grade their parents would tolerate their bringing home? Asian students replied A-minus. Blacks said their parents would accept grades lower than both white and Asian students.

Nationally, 74 percent of black students fail to graduate five years after entering college. Black students have the lowest grade point averages both entering and leaving college.

John H. McWhorter, a linguistics professor at UC-Berkeley, offers an explanation in his new book, "Losing the Race: Self-Sabotage in Black America." It's a culture of anti-intellectualism among blacks. That's not a very flattering explanation, but to the extent that it has any truth it demands confrontation.

McWhorter argues that black anti-intellectualism is a result of victimology and separatism. Black politicians, civil-rights leaders and white liberals have peddled victimhood to black sive and no amount of individual effort can overcome racist barriers. Peddling victimhood is not new. Booker T. Washington said: "There is a class of colored people who make a business of keeping the troubles, the wrongs and the hardships of the Negro race before the public. Some of these people do not want the Negro to lose his grievances, because they do not want to lose their

McWhorter doesn't argue there is no longer any racial discrimination in the United States, but racial discrimination is not the major problem for blacks today. Instead, it's self-sabotage - and he's right. Let's look at it. A black illegitimacy rate hovering around 70 percent is devastating but it's not caused by whites. Black people have the nation's highest victimization rates for murder, assault, rape and other violent crimes, but it's not whites who are culpable.

Black students have the nation's lowest academic achievement. That can't be blamed on racism because academic achievement is the lowest in cities where the mayor, superintendent of schools, and most principals and teachers are black, such as Washington, D.C., Philadelphia and Detroit. # My long-term and short-term predictions

This morning I woke up with a sick feeling in my stomach. A feeling that wasn't normal. The realization that in this country, where justice usually ranks high, there exist countless injustices and that I may be suffering the effects of a

I've been active in this, now historical, presidential campaign for almost a year to help elect Gov. George W. Bush. I'm fascinated by the intricacy of our political process and proud to be an American. Not far into adulthood myself, I'm already excited about the possibility of sharing "war stories" about this campaign with my own kids when they are studying American rules. history in school. (That is, if I am blessed to have a wife and family some day.)

As excited as I am about the future, I do worry that disillusionment, especially among young voters, may grow out of the realization that the electoral system can't prevent injustices from being committed.

More people are watching the news of the vote recount in Florida than viewed the Monica Lewinsky scandal, the Gulf War, the Olympics, the World Series or Princess Diana's funeral. I believe this proves wrong those critics who argue Americans don't care about the political process. Even those who want the Florida recount (and court hearings) to be over, most people want the count to accurately reflect the collective will of the people by following the rules and laws that have been established in the past to govern elections.

For those of us who are still on the edge of our seat and still interested in seeing who our next president will be, I would like to share some insight from my experience and make two small predictions — one near and one far.

Let me preface these predictions by saying that it now seems clear, no matter who wins, the news stories will continue to center around the question: Should Bush or Gore really have been elected president? The news media will focus on this just as they did with the current question: Who will the next president be? And, as with the present question, the degree of speculation and the intensity of the coverage will hurt more than they help.

Democrats and Republicans are divided as to what should be done in Florida regarding the "recount," but I think they agree that the major network television coverage was not handled well election night and that the intensity of coverage thereafter has foreclosed any opportunity there may have been for either candidate to

graciously or easily concede to the other, or simply commend the other for playing by the As we all know, Vice President Gore was declared the winner of the state of Florida early on the evening of Nov. 7. So early, in fact, those residents in the Panhandle of Florida were still voting because they are in a different time

zone! Networks should not be allowed to "call"

any state until the polls are closed in that state,

and should not be able to declare an overall

winner until polls are closed in the West. Voters there have been telling us that for years. When the first network, CBS, called Vice President Gore the winner of Florida, only 1 percent of the votes had been reported. Gov. Bush and Vice President Gore each had 49 percent. How in the world could they call the winner of a state with only 1 percent reporting and

the vote a tie? Then, as we all recall (after all the polls were closed in the Florida Panhandle), the networks, one by one, pulled the state of Florida back into the "to close to call" category. Democrats should have been outraged because voters on the west coast who heard Florida, Pennsylvania and Michigan were going for Gore, thinking Gore had won, could have decided not to vote, or to vote for Nader with no regrets because they thought Al Gore was

Republicans should have been even more furious because Republican voters in the Florida Panhandle who had heard the news, but not yet voted, may well have decided not to vote for a man they thought had already lost. Some people were standing in line to vote when they heard the announcement. What was their incentive to wait in line? Republican voters in the west also may not have bothered to vote for the same reasons — they thought there was no hope left. California had a much lower Republican turnout than expected.

This premature "call" by the media must cer-

tainly have had a huge cumulative effect on the popular vote total. With Florida's electoral votes in question, the national vote total has become the trump card for the Gore campaign. The networks have apologized. But make no mistake, a continuing story that affects the entire population increases the number of viewers, and that increases revenues for these networks. The point is that the networks aren't suffering from their mistakes - quite the contrary — but the American people are the ones adversely affected by the controversy. I am not saying the network media orchestrated this confusion intentionally, but they will be hardpressed to make reforms if their mistakes benefit their own bottom line.

If the news media doesn't change its ways with regard to national election coverage, whal can be done to prevent the premature declara? tion of winners that results in the large number of voters who are discouraged from casting their ballots — votes that may have been decil sive in this election? The short-term prediction I promised earlier is one answer to this question. I believe we will

see legislation from the new 107th Congressi proposing changes to the polling times for elections. If all polls were opened and closed nationwide at the same time - making the adjustments from one time zone to another, tha apparent importance of an individual's vota

would not be reduced based solely on his or

her place of residence. If the polls opened on the East Coast at 10 a.m. and closed at 10 p.m., for example, the polls on the West coast would open at 6 a.m. and be closed at 6 p.m. (Hawaii and Alaska may have to remain the exceptions.) People would be voting at the same time relative to

each other. And the projected "winners" in the

east would not affect peoples' votes on the west

My long-term predication is that this election will produce at least 100 trivial pursuit questions. Maybe my knowing a lot of the answers to those future questions will ease my stomach pains. For now, however, I am suffering from a feeling, as bipartisan as the flu, that a big injustice has been done.



# Pesticide applicators need CEUs to renew licenses

Applicators will receive a certificate of completion at the end of each course. They should hold onto these for a year after they have renewed their license. It's extremely dry from southwestern Virginia to eastern Louisiana, forcing producers to feed cattle the hay they would normally use during the coldest winter months and hindering the planting of winter wheat and other cover crops.

"The pastures are in bad shape," said Becky Walton, a spokeswoman for the South Department Agriculture. "They're feeding their hay now, and South Carolina is a hay-deficit state. When we have a shortage when it doesn't rain and we don't get the growing season we need — they have to use what they have stored for winter."

Winter wheat is a relatively minor crop in the South, ompared with tobacco, peanuts and cotton. Eighteen states, mostly in the West and Midwest, produced the bulk of the crop last year. The leading Southern states were Texas, with 6.2 million acres, North Carolina, with 650,000

and Tennessee with 500,000.

The National Agricultural Statistics Service reports that rain has held up planting in Texas and low moisture has stressed the crop in North Carolina.

Carter and other Georgia farmers are expected to plant 250,000 acres of winter wheat, worth between \$30 million and

\$40 million. Carter has a plastic rain gauge

mounted to a fence post near his office in a weathered, 75-yearold farm house with three rocking chairs on the front porch. His 2,000-acre farm is located near a southwestern Georgia community called Anderson City, about 10. miles south of Sylvester. Farmers gather at Carter's Grocery, built by his father in 1947, to sip coffee and chat.

Carter, 58, and his 27-year-old son, Joel, grow winter wheat to protect their land from wind and soil erosion. They reap a small profit from it in the spring, when few other crops are mature.

"There's not much money in it to begin with. If you have to water it, you're backing up," said Jerald Carter, who has irrigation but is reluctant to use it because it increases production http://wheatfoods.org

Joel Carter, who has been farming six years, said low commodity prices and the drought have made him question his choice of occupations.

Dewey Lee, a University of Georgia grain agronomist, said higher fuel prices and low commodity prices probably will mean fewer acres of wheat in Georgia during the current planting season.

Wheat is especially popular with farmers who practice conservation tillage, also known as limited-till farming. They harvest the wheat or kill it with herbicides in the spring and plant cotton or peanuts in the stubble. Instead of plowing the field, they use a tool that makes a small groove in the soil, just large enough for the seed.

It increases organic matter, helps with erosion and increases the water holding capacity (of the soil)," said extension agent Scott Monfort. "It saves time and trips across the field."





"We do find items still for sale from time to time," Branton said. "The retailer may not have received the recall or the items may have been overlooked. Most retailers are happy to have our help get-ting unsafe items off the shelves." Inspectors who find a recalled item still for sale will ask the store manager to remove the item and return

it to the manufacturer. Even with toys manufactured correctly, problems may arise when a child is not the right age for the item. What may be safe and appropriate for children of one age group may be uninteresting or dangerous for youngsters of different ages or skill levels.

Labels help answer many questions about a toy's safety and suitability. "Consumers should take manufacturer recommendations seriously," Branton said. "If the label says the item is not rec-ommended for a child under 3 years of age, then it isn't. It may have parts or strings that can choke or strangle a young child."
A good toy should be:
—Safe for that child's age, well

constructed and durable. -Appealing and interesting to

the child. -Suited to the child's physical capabilities.



The problem is an epidemic and will require the concerted efforts of all of society to control. Programs which address the social problems that oftentimes lead to prison are desperately needed. We must strengthen the programs all ready in place which encourage reform. We must address the issues which face those newly released from prison. And, we must educate society as a whole; not least of which are the individuals who repeatedly return to a life of crime.

# **Dalmatian movie puts** breed in spotlight's harsh glare

Starting this Thanksgiving, moviegoers will be bombarded with spots — Dalmatian spots — as "102 Dalmatians" opens in movie theaters across the country. While the on-screen pups will be doing No one expects prisons to compete with institutions of higher all sorts of amazing and adorable things, Pampa's Animal Control is urging Pampa and the surrounding communities to think care-

With the timing of the release so close to the winter gift-giving Many of those which do exist are merely store-fronts propped in season, a Dalmatian puppy is sure to top the list of children everywhere. But parents beware — the dogs you see in the movie aren't Others are poorly administered. More emphasis is put into filling typical Dalmatians. The breed is prone to skin allergies and deafness, and they aren't the best dog to have if there are children in the household. They are an extremely active breed and require a large amount of exercise and attention. Training is essential and not always easily accomplished.

According to the Humane Society of the United States, within a year of the 1996 movie release of "101 Dalmatians," animal shelters and humane organizations nationwide were bombarded with men and women released from prison daily back into the folds of Dalmatians purchased on a whim then later turned over when people found out what a Dalmatian is really like. Animal control cess resides with the individual and greatly depends upon his or received a large number of Dalmatians that year, and nationwide, HSUS estimates that Dalmatian relinquishments increased on average of 25 percent after "101 Dalmatians."

"People buy these dogs without knowing anything about the dards, there are tens of thousands of incarcerated individuals who breed other than what they look like," said Sandy Burns, local Animal Control supervisor. "Most people aren't prepared for a dog that sheds all year round and can be destructive when left alone for

long periods. These dogs don't just sleep all day."

Humane organizations have tried to work with Disney executives to educate moviegoers about the true nature of Dalmatians, and Disney officials have told HSUS that a statement will appear after the closing credits, but by then most people will have left the theater, perhaps with the thought of buying a Dalmatian.

"We are disappointed that Disney is not making more of an effort to protect these dogs who have created a huge profit for the company," Burns concluded.

# Plan would better serve **Gray County taxpayers**

I'm an inmate in Gray County Jail. I would like to talk about inmates and tax money. I've been here for 27 days and I had a

I had a talk with some of my fellow inmates about just sitting here in jail, about going out to work and doing work in the communities. I'm an inmate here at this jail. It's Nov. 7, 2000, and I'm cleaning. I had a thought in the summer — what about if every inmate who wanted to be put on a work program be able to?

What I mean when I say every inmate is those who have been to court and even those who have not. Now, you may be thinking what does this have to do with your tax dollars?

Well, this: If your tax dollars are going to be spent on this jail and feeding, clothing, cable TV, heat, air conditioning, doctors, trips to the hospital, medicines and so many other things, would you as taxpayers like to see inmates work? Because we sure want to do something besides sit here and get fat at your cost.

I asked a few inmates this question. How would you feel about getting up at 5:30 a.m. or 6 a.m. every morning for six days a week and going out on the highways, cutting grass, six- to eight-hours a day? A lot of them said 'I think you have a good idea. It would make our judgment go a lot quicker and take our minds off a lot of other things.

So with this kind of response, I think something should be done. asked another question now that it is snowing and we have the elderly and disabled, what about shoveling snow out of their driveways, trash, cutting grass in summer and getting snow off walkways in winter to make the communities cleaner. Again the inmates had no problem.

There are a lot of old houses all over this town that need to come down, so to save more of our taxpayers' money let's put the Gray Co. inmates to work on this. Instead of spending all this big money let's save and put that money to work elsewhere. That's how I feel. Walter L. Johnson Jr.,



PORT ARTHUR, Texas (AP) — Texas Coaches Hall of Fame member Richard Marler from Port Arthur has died in a Houston hospital. He was 57

A Floydada native and Texas Tech graduate, Marler had been in a coma the past three months since being hospitalized for an Aug. 20 heart attack. He died Wednesday.

The executive director and founder of the six-year-old Southeast Texas High School Coaches Association, Marler received statewide recognition for pushing legislation to reduce the original no-pass, no-play penalty in half — to three weeks from its original six-week disqualification of students from any extracurricular activities.

Marler led Port Arthur Austin and Jefferson high schools to 11 playoff berths in 26 head coaching seasons, leading two teams to the 3A state semifinals and compiling a .589 winning percent-

He had been head football coach at Jefferson since 1998, and coached at Port Arthur Austin from 1975 to 1997.

#### HOCKEY

DALLAS (AP) — Ed Belfour's recent shutout streak has him on pace to shatter one of the NHL's longest-standing modern goalie records.

Belfour made 23 saves in the Dallas Stars' 3-0 victory over the Columbus Blue Jackets on Friday night giving him third straight shutout, and a leaguebest six in 21 games.

Chicago's Tony Esposito holds the modern single-season record of 15, set in 1969-70.

"He's a tremendous goalie, probably a Hall of Fame goalie," Columbus coach Dave King. "And he's on a team that plays a great team concept and great team defense. So he's got a chance.'

Belfour extended his scoreless streak to a career-high and franchise-record 190 minutes and 44 seconds as the Stars remained unbeaten in five straight.

"Eddie's making big saves with the game on the line and we're able to protect leads," coach Ken Hitchcock said, "When he smells it, he really hunkers down.'

The shutout was the 54th of Belfour's career, and moved him into sole possession of 14th place on the NHL's career

"I'm getting a few breaks right now and I'm seeing the puck really well," Belfour said. 'Sometimes you get on a roll in the nets and you get some shutouts. Right now our team is playing really well in front of me, very consistent."

The record for shutouts in a season is 22 by George Hainesworth of the Montreal Canadiens in 1928-29.

Belfour's toughest test came with 5:05 to play when he stopped Robert Kron on a breakaway.

With three straight shutouts, Belfour matched the franchise record set by Cesare Maniago with the Minnesota North Stars in December 1967. Belfour also broke Maniago's shutout franchise-record streak of 188:38.

Jamie Langenbrunner and Joe Nieuwendyk scored firstperiod goals for the Stars, who are 4-0-1 in their last five.

"We're playing with a lot of confidence, and it seems like Eddie's got that playoff mentality," Langenbrunner said.

Mike Modano added his seventh goal of the season with 8:50 remaining.





# TCU rips Mustangs

DALLAS (AP) — Defensive tackle Chase Schavrda was disappointed in 1997 when Southern Methodist, needing a victory to be bowl eligible, lost to winless Texas Christian.

So how did he feel Friday night after the Mustangs closed their first season in their new \$54 million stadium with a 62-7 loss to the Horned Frogs? "I'm embarrassed," said

Schavrda, a senior. "I hope this sticks with the younger guys so they won't let it happen The three-year turnaround

by No. 13 TCU was underscored by this blowout, the biggest in the 82-game historyof the local rivals.

The Horned Frogs (10-1, 7-1 WAC) scored on nine straight drives. The first six were touchdowns. After a field goal, so were the last two.

Casey Printers threw four touchdown passes and ran for another and LaDainian Tomlinson capped his brilliant career with 174 yards, including a 74-yard touchdown, and several major milestones.

LaTarence Dunbar had the final score: a 108-yard kickoff return for a touchdown early in the fourth quarter after the Mustangs (3-9, 2-6) scored their only points. College statistics only credit Dunbar with a 100vard return.

"The turnaround that we have made in the past three years has been unbelievable," said Tomlinson. "I am glad that we were able to pull it together for my senior year. I still can't believe all that we have accom-

Mobile Bowl on Dec. 20. SMU had one of its most humiliating performances since coming off the death penalty — although it wasn't their largest margin of defeat since then. Texas A&M beat the Mustangs 65-6 in '91 and

Houston won 95-21 in '89. What made this one so bad was that SMU did not get a first down for the first 22 minutes, 10 seconds. It took another nine minutes for the next one. The Mustangs had just 10 in the game, or two fewer than TCU had touchdowns.

"They just chewed us up," said SMU coach Mike Cavan, who earlier this week was told he would be returning next season. "They can throw the ball down the field. That's where they really hurt us."

SMU's only highlight was seeing Eric Dickerson get his No. 19 jersey retired at half-

"This was the most embarrassing thing in my life," said running back Kris Briggs. "I am crushed.

While many of the Mustangs' woes' were self-induced, the Horned Frogs' defense still put an exclamation point on their claim as the country's stingiest defense. TCU lowered its already national-best numbers to 9.6 points and 245 yards per game.

The Horned Frogs outscored opponents 235-30 over the second and third quarters, including 91-3 in the third.

This was the last time the teams met as conference rivals because TCU is joining Conference USA next season. The schools have agreed to continue playing through at least 2004.

The Horned Frogs' band even got in on the fun, dropping fer-tilizer in the shape of the letters TCU on SMU's new \$54 million stadium during its halftime

Nationally, 91,827 federal tax refunds totaling \$67.9 million were returned to the IRS this year. California had the largest number of unclaimed refunds (14,648) in the nation, followed by New York (8,519), Florida (8,208) and Texas (8,046).

The IRS urges Texans who are still waiting for their tax refund to call 1-800-829-1040 to learn how they can claim the money.

# Royal image makeover? Prince Charles takes up late princess' causes

LONDON (AP) — Princess Diana once captured hearts and headlines by befriending the homeless, hugging the sick, comforting the dying. These days, it's Prince Charles who can be found chatting with a young mother at a shelter or cuddling a baby at an AIDS cen-

Royal watchers call this embrace of causes associated with the late princess - together with an unusual public tribute by the prince Thursday — a bid to soften the standoffish image that has long

plagued Charles, Britain's 52-year-old king in waiting. Charity work is the royal family's stock in trade, and Charles has always done his part. He is patron to more than 500 charitable organizations and makes hundreds of appearances a year on their behalf.

But more and more, the heir to the British throne seems to be taking style cues from the late princess, who shattered the mold of rigid formality on royal visits to the poor, sick and disadvantaged.

"Until recently, Prince Charles has not much strayed into ... the touchy-feely areas ... that for so long were dominated by Diana," the Times of London wrote Thursday in a story headlined "Prince of Hearts: How Charles is Adopting Diana's Role.'

When he felt people's pain, he tended to do so privately," said the story, written by royal watcher Andrew Roberts. "Now, with that slot in British public life permanently vacated by the princess, he is

increasingly to be found attending the sort of occasions that used to be her special province."

Thursday was a case in point. Visiting a homeless charity, Charles cradled a crying infant and soothed her to sleep. The baby's mother called him a "natural" — and then proceeded to confide in the prince about the hardships she had suffered when she was homeless and pregnant.

Later, at a day-care center for the children of AIDS patients, he chatted with a 29-year-old HIV-infected woman and cuddled her 3month-old son. He then settled himself in a low child's chair and drew pictures with two toddlers.

Lately, the prince also has broken a tacit royal taboo on speaking in public about Diana, who died with her lover three years ago in a Paris car crash only months after her messy, drawn-out divorce from Charles.

At an AIDS center linked to a hospice that often was visited by the princess, he told the crowd Thursday: "Coming here today has reminded me of all the work that Diana did before she died ... I'm

sure she would be very pleased that I was here today."

How Charles is perceived by the public, of course, has a strong bearing on the question that has hung over the royal family for years now: when he will be king. His mother, Queen Elizabeth II, has sat for nearly half a century on the British throne.

Diana's death marked a dangerous moment in the prince's public life. Amid an enormous nationwide outpouring of grief, the prince's longtime mistress, Camilla Parker Bowles, was cast as the villainess in the royal saga.

Gradually, Camilla's image has improved. For many here, the crushing sense of bereavement has eased; the third anniversary of Diana's fatal crash was marked this year by low-key tributes and gatherings of relatively small crowds of admirers.

After freezing out the prince's mistress for years, the queen met Camilla earlier this year, and Camilla and Charles often appear together in public now.

It helps that Charles is universally regarded as a devoted father to his sons, Prince William and Prince Harry.

No one missed the symbolism of Thursday's royal appearances. "Since the princess' death, no one has taken on her mantle," said an AIDS patient identified only as Mr. Edwards. "His visit is very welcome."
