State appopals rulling that struck down abortion licensing law
AUSTIN (AP) - The Texas attorney general's office will ask a federal appeals court to allow the
state to require doctors who perform more than 300 abortions a year to license their offices as abortion
The Legislature in 1999 passed a bill to require such licensing. The bill also would have increased
the criminal liability of doctors who operate abortion clinics without a license.
Medical clinics in Houston, Denton and Austin
and five doctors successfully challenged the law
and five doctors successfully challenged the law
later that year.
U.S. District Judge John Rainey in Houston ruled
it violated the equal protection under the U.S. Constitution and was unconstitutionally vague. Rainey's ruling said the law set apart physicians
who perform abortions from those who perform other outpatient surgeries, violating their right to equal protection under the law.

found that Midland ranked first in pesticide use per acre and percentage of toxic pesticide applications, while Odessa and Brownsville ranked next in The stu
The study, conducted by the Texas Pesticide
nformation Network, indicated that Houston ranks eighth-worst among the state's largest cities in the amount of pesticides used per acre in public parks and other areas. 75,000 pounds of pesticides in more than 2,900 public parks in 1998, according to results released Nearly one-third of those materials are classified as moderately or highly toxic under Environmental Protection Agency standards, the report stated.
