$A$I'm going to offer you some patented advice that may not make
any sense or seem responsive ta roblem you've described. But stay with me. The most important thing you can do for your daughter is to "just get her through it." The concept is a bit obscure, so let me make an effort to explain it.
Imagine your daughter riding in a small canoe alled "Puberty" on the Adolescent River. She soo comes to a turbulent stretch of white water that rock her little boat violently. There is a very real danger hat she will capsize and drown. Even if she survives today's rapids, she will certainly be caugh in swirling currents downstream and plunge over the falls. That is the apprehension harbored by millions of parents with kids bouncing along on the wild river. It;s the falls that worry them most.
