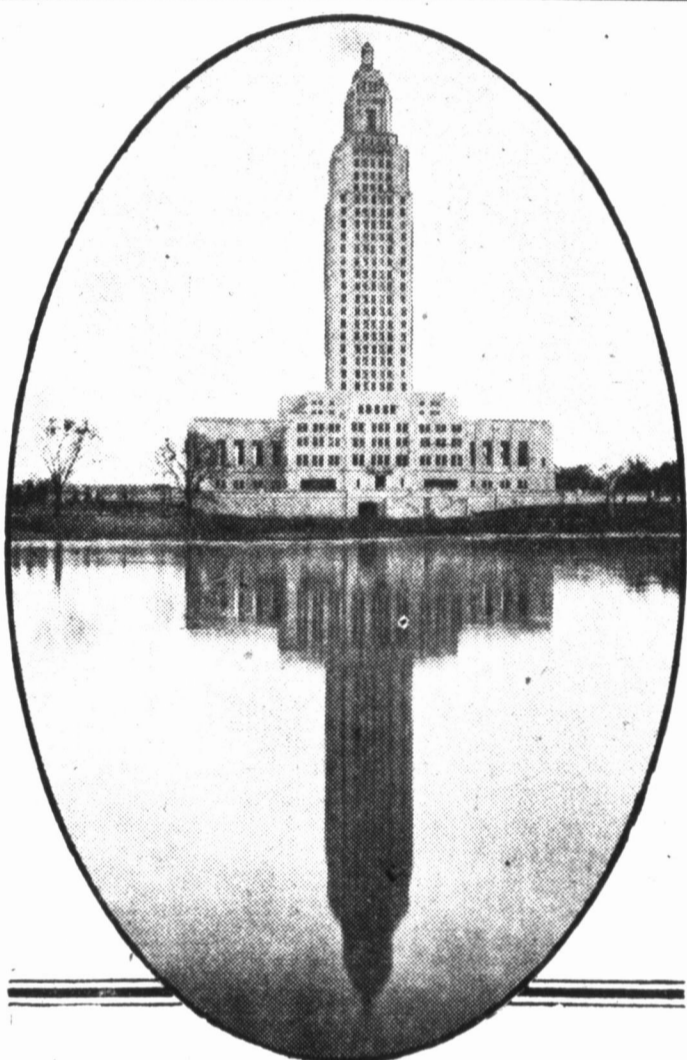

Ill Fated Youth Hoped to Help in Anchoring Akron

ELKHART, Ind., May 12 (AP)—"Boy! I hope we do get to help moor the Akron! That's something to write home about."

Mrs. Lottie Edsall read these words Tuesday in a letter from her son, Robert, 20, from his naval training quarters on the Pacific coast. He had written her the letter on Mother's Day.

Last night, as she and the boy's father, Jay J. Edsall, returned home at 7 o'clock, they received a telegram from the naval authorities telling of his death while attempting to moor the giant airship.

The patents said his body will be brought to Elkhart, accompanied by his "buddy" in the service, David Loose of Chicago, who enlisted in the navy the same day that young Edsall did, July 2, 1930, and had been with him ever since they entered the Great Lakes naval training station together.

Stratified Air Cause of Deaths

SAN DIEGO, Calif., May 12 (AP)—The navy dirigible Akron today swung calmly at anchor at Camp Kearny field where two bluejackets were killed in an attempt to moor her.

A third seaman, Charles Cowart, dangled for two hours to a mooring line yesterday before being hauled aboard the world's largest airship at 2,000 feet.

Beset by storms in southwest Texas, forced to climb over mountains, the airship arrived here safely at 9:07 a. m. (P. S. T.) yesterday to have tragedy climax its transcontinental flight.

"Peculiarly stratified air" was blamed by Lieut. Commander C. E. Rosendahl, master of the Akron, for the airship's sudden ascent after snapping its cable, as efforts were being made to moor it.

Two hundred bluejackets had hold of the lines dropped from the Akron and were swinging it into position when a "peculiar" current of air caused the big ship to swing upward. All but three of the sailors let go of the ropes as they felt themselves leaving the ground.

So sudden was the rise of the Akron that the three men who clung to the ropes had reached a dangerous height before they realized their predicament. At a height of about 700 feet, one of the sailors lost his grip and fell. A few feet farther up, another of the trio gave out and he, too, fell to the ground. Both were killed instantly. They were Robert H. Edsall of South Bend, Ind., and Nigel Henton of Fresno, Calif.

Cowart, 19, climbed up the rope until he reached a "troggle"—a cross bar of wood spliced between the rope. The airship maneuvered, sometimes reaching a height of 2,500 feet. Cowart calmly sat on the toggle until members of the crew of the Akron could be spared to pull him through a hatch and into the airship.

Death Rate Is Below Normal

The Pampa death rate is 9.2, and there were 107 deaths in the city during 1931, according to tabulations based upon census figures and made by W. A. Davis, registrar of the bureau of vital statistics.

The deaths occurred as follows: January 10, February 7, March 11, April 12, May 6, June 13, July 9, August 7, September 6, October 12, November 8, December 6.

There are three things that may affect the death rate of any city, according to Dr. Davis. All deaths may not have been registered. The post office address of the deceased may have been given instead of the exact place of death, and the rate is computed on the total population within the city, while the deaths of those dying outside of the city limits who patronize the post office may be included in the total deaths. The residents of the county or other counties may die inside of the city limits.

Death rates of other cities of near Pampa's size follow: Sweetwater, 7.3; San Angelo 10.9; Sherman 16.2; Lubbock 11.8; Big Spring 8.3; Austin 15.5; Amarillo 8.3; Abilene 8.8.

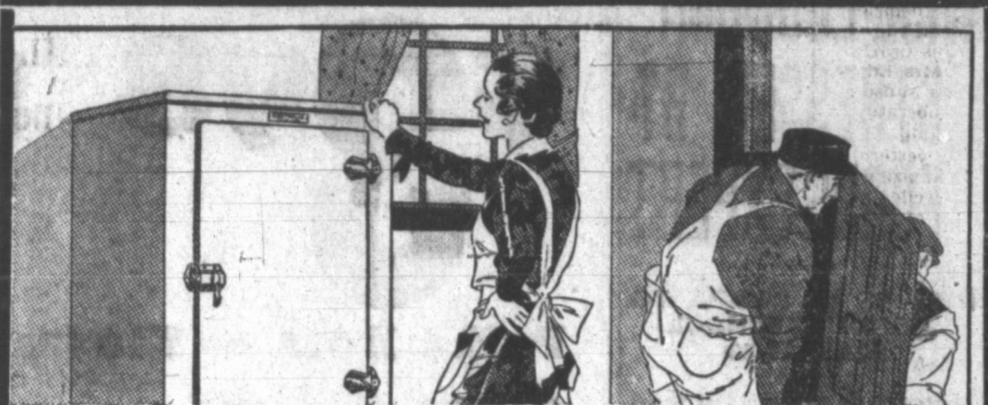

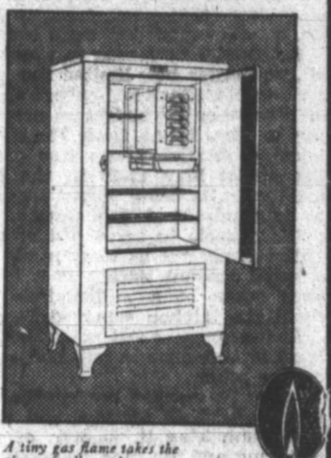

Gasoline Line Is In Operation

PONCA CITY, Okla., May 12 (AP)—Constructed at a cost of \$19,000,000, a gasoline carrying pipeline, 1,400 miles long, is transporting 50,000 barrels of the fluid daily from Oklahoma to midwestern and northern terminal markets.

Extending northward from Ponca City and other Oklahoma refineries, the great snake-like line reaches Kansas City, Des Moines, Chicago and Minneapolis and St. Paul. It has direct connections with refineries at Ponca City, Barnsdall, Tulsa, Okmulgee, Muskogee and other state points.

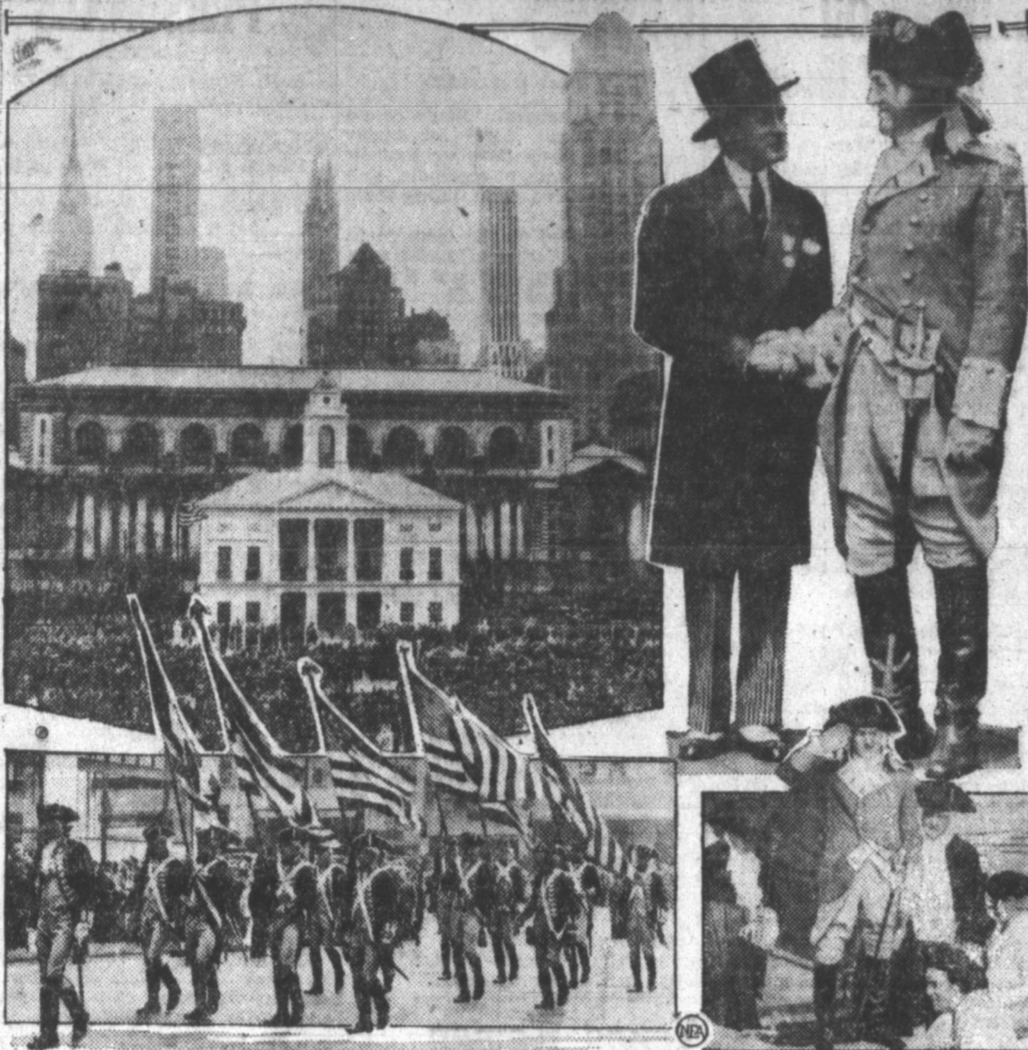
The downpour increased as the Masonic units fell in line. Colors on gorgeous uniforms began to merge but the procession went through Alexandria with bands playing.

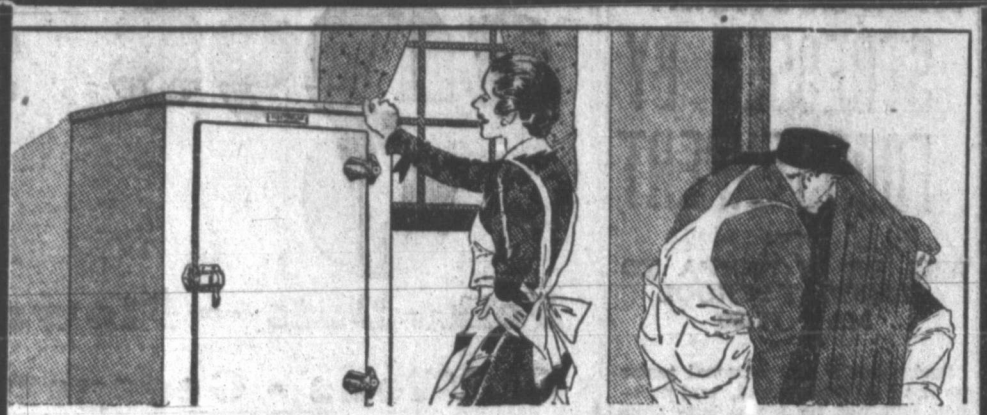

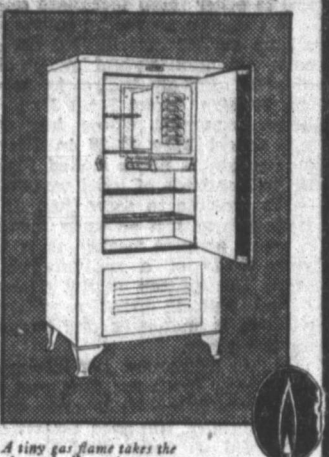

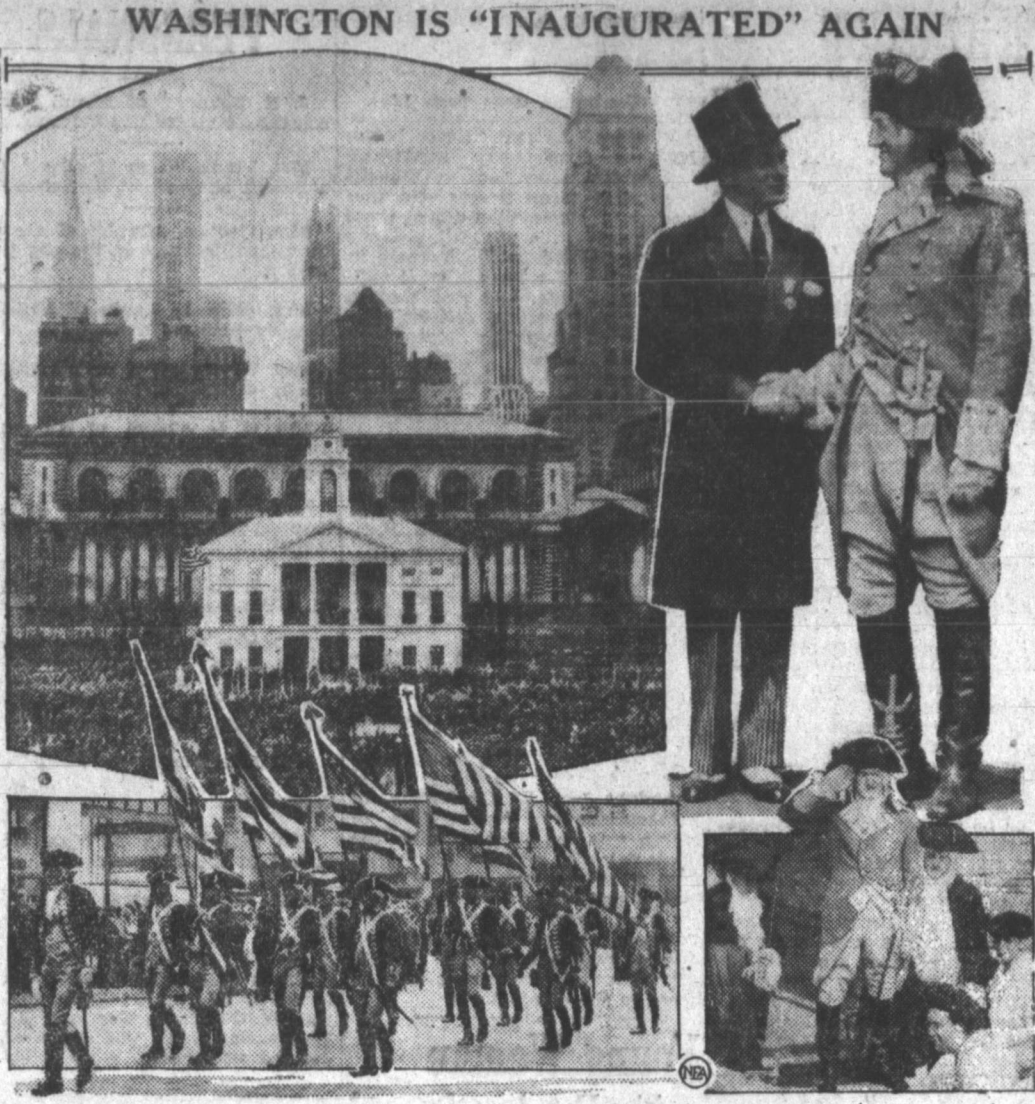
