America Will Lose Trade As Result of Pact

PARIS, Aug. 2.—American business interests face the loss of millions of dollars worth of trade with France as a result of a treaty just signed by France and Belgium.

The new Franco-Belgian pact, which was signed yesterday and becomes effective next Monday, waives for Belgium the import tax of 4 per cent on semi-finished goods on certain classes and the 6 per cent tax on finished goods.

Protests were made not only by Americans but by German, British, Japanese, Mexican and Chilean interests, but there seemed to be nothing that could be done, for the treaty is to last eight months.
