Humble Company Obtains Patent On a Pecan Tree

UVALDE, Aug. 18 (AP)—What is believed to be the first patent on a pecan obtained in the United States under the Purnell Plant patent law.

This pecan has been named "Humble." From tests conducted by Simpson over a period of almost six years, indications are that it may become one of the most sought varieties for propagation ever used in this section.

The tests were started in the home orchard of Vice President John N. Garner, who saw in the pecan a promise of perhaps the most outstanding development in the last decade in pecan work.

The "Humble" is the most prolific pecan ever tried here and no adverse report has been received from any of the many districts all throughout the southern part of the United States to which it has been sent for testing purposes.

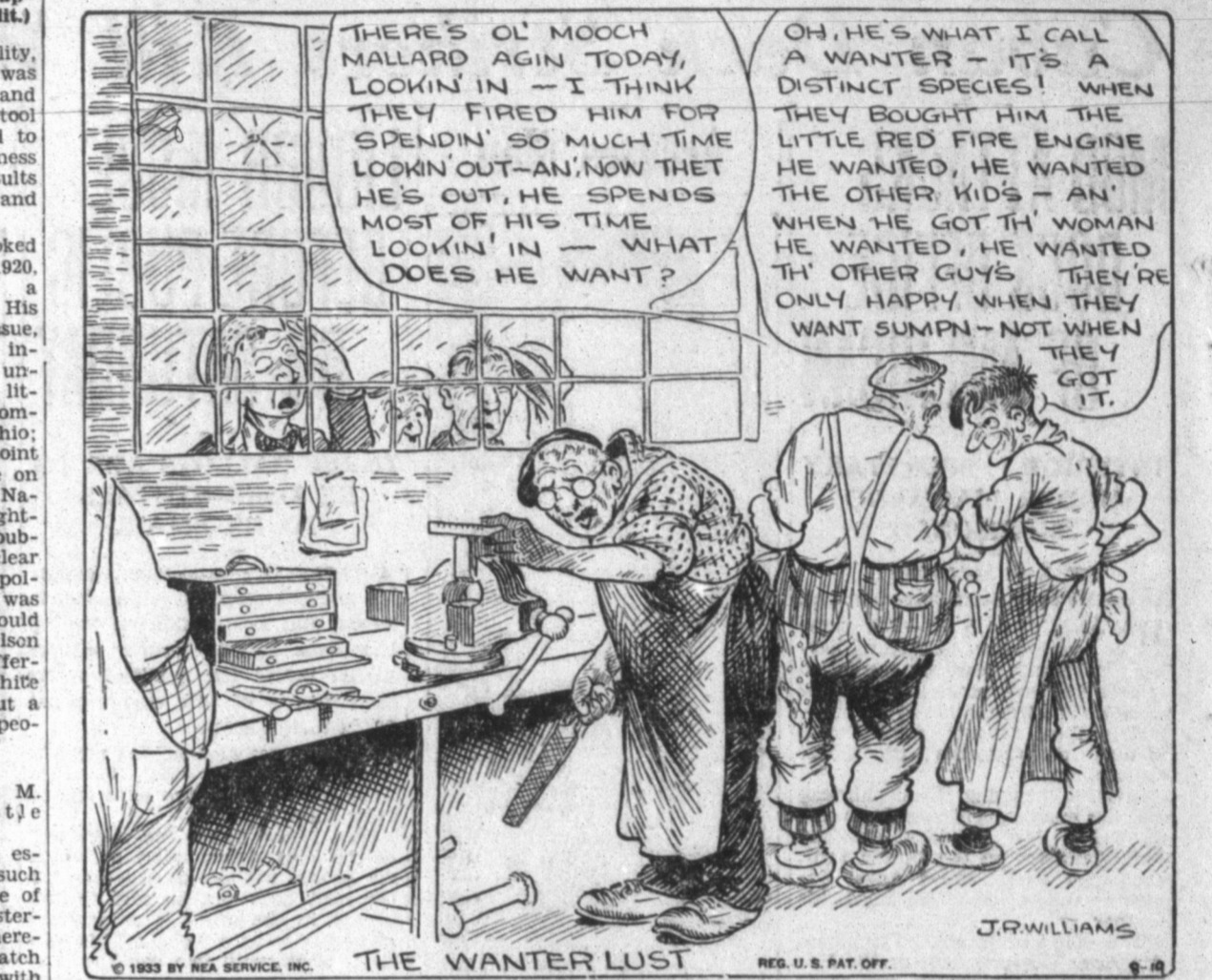

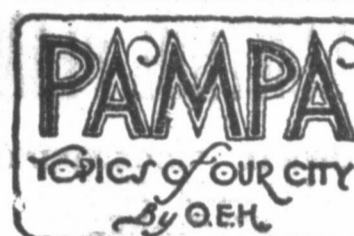

Million in Distress

More than a million Texas residents are on the relief rolls of the Texas rehabilitation and relief commission. This commission for the last five months has been disbursing funds advanced or donated by the federal government at an average rate of \$1,500,000 per month or \$18,000,000 per year.

List Grows Steadily - The number of persons on relief rolls increased steadily in July and early in this month. In July there was a gain of 31 per cent over the total of destitute dependents as tabulated for June.

State Responsibility - It is not fair for the federal government to continue to bear the entire burden. Half a billion was set aside by congress to assist the states, not to do all the work.

No State Money Now - Under existing statutes, the State of Texas is unable to spend a penny for direct relief. If the amendment is defeated at the polls there will be a two-fold result: It will tie the hands of the state in meeting its people's distress.

Details of Amendment - If anyone opposed the "bond issue," tell them that it is not a bond issue. It is an amendment to permit the legislature to make an appropriation to match federal relief funds.
