









# General 'Ma' And Other Chinese Commanders And Refugees Arrive In Berlin

## JAPS CLAIMED HE WAS SLAIN IN MANCHURIA

### BOMBING OF AMERICAN MISSION IS NOT CONFIRMED

BERLIN, April 20. (AP)—A General Ma Chan-Shan, reputedly the Chinese national hero whom Japanese military leaders claimed was killed in battle last July in Manchuria, arrived today from Tomsk, Siberia.

With him were two other Chinese generals, Su Ping-Wen and Li (apparently Li Ching-Ling, former governor of Chihli province and a Manchurian commander several years ago) and about 60 other Chinese officers and soldiers, women and children.

General Su was leader of the Chinese uprising against the Manchukuo government last fall in north-west Manchuria. He fled across the Siberian border with remnants of his army in early December and the Soviet government refused Japanese requests for his extradition.

The general refused to talk except to indicate an intention to remain in Berlin for some days. They were expected to go to Paris next.

None of the men wore military uniforms, all dressing in European style clothes with heavy overcoats. The women and children were mostly in Chinese garb.

**Reports Not Confirmed.**

PEIPING, April 20. (AP)—Chinese military reports that an American missionary had been killed by Japanese bombs at Miyunhsien found no confirmation today at the United States legation or in missionary circles. Both groups said there were no American missionaries at Miyunhsien, which is 35 miles northeast of Peiping.

The U. S. legation has been informed bombs at Miyunhsien damaged an American Methodist Episcopal outstation which was in charge of a Chinese pastor.

## General's Heirs Own Portion Of Lease At Mason

MASON, April 20. (AP)—General James Longstreet, famous Confederate general, was once a soldier at Old Fort Mason, now abandoned, and his heirs today own part of the 1,300 acres under lease to the fort when Brigadier general Denison made an inspection of the post on Aug. 15, 1853.

Judge C. R. Range on a recent trip to Washington found this report in the files of the war department and brought home a photostatic copy. The inspecting officer reported finding thirty Tonkawa Indians, half starved, ragged, undernourished and begging for food at the commissary. The officer in charge of the post gave them some corn through no provision for this was made by the army.

The officer spoke of old Fort Martin Scott at Fredericksburg, and mentioned the 400 miles of communication established between the forts in this country.

Manning the frontier post then were two companies of 249 soldiers. Though a small post it had its regimental band that played at intervals keeping the soldiers in "proper mental attitude."

The old post was a link in the fort system between San Antonio and Santa Fe, New Mexico.
